


Figure 1: indicating the EIA (BA) process to be followed during the application process for the proposed Construction of eight (8) Chicken Houses.

Need and desirability of the project

The applicant would like to propose farming activities by establishing up to 8 chicken broiler houses in addition to the current 8.7 ha under vacant land. Current domestic demand for chicken in South Africa is not being met. The location and climatic conditions of the farm is more suited to broiler chicken houses than the current land situation.
