I agree with Gerts comments below and have the following to add this is how we try and cover the impacts in our ToRs'

A detailed description of potential impacts of the proposed activity on the environment, which must include, but is not limited to, the following:

- a) Identification of the main environmental impacts associated with the activity in the proposed area;
- b) Categorization of environmental impacts;
- c) Identification of management actions and plans aimed at reducing adverse impacts on the environment, as well as promoting benefits thereto.
- d) An environmental management and monitoring plan for both the construction and operational phases that may comprise of various programmes for monitoring e.g. Water Quality Monitoring Programme; Waste Management Protocols, etc.

I feel that a legal review is important as we need to identify the legal status of both rights holders the mine as well as the abalone farm.

Proposed access plans will need to be reviewed and possibly give suggestions of two or three with associated pros and cons for the mine and the farmer.

I'm not so sure that the last point 4. Is applicable to this process. Ranching areas were identified and gazetted by the DAFF this is not a process that can be dictated by this EIA process. The identification of zones is based on a lot of information and is not the job of this EIA. This may be an area for us as DAFF to revisit if there is no amicable solution to the access issue.

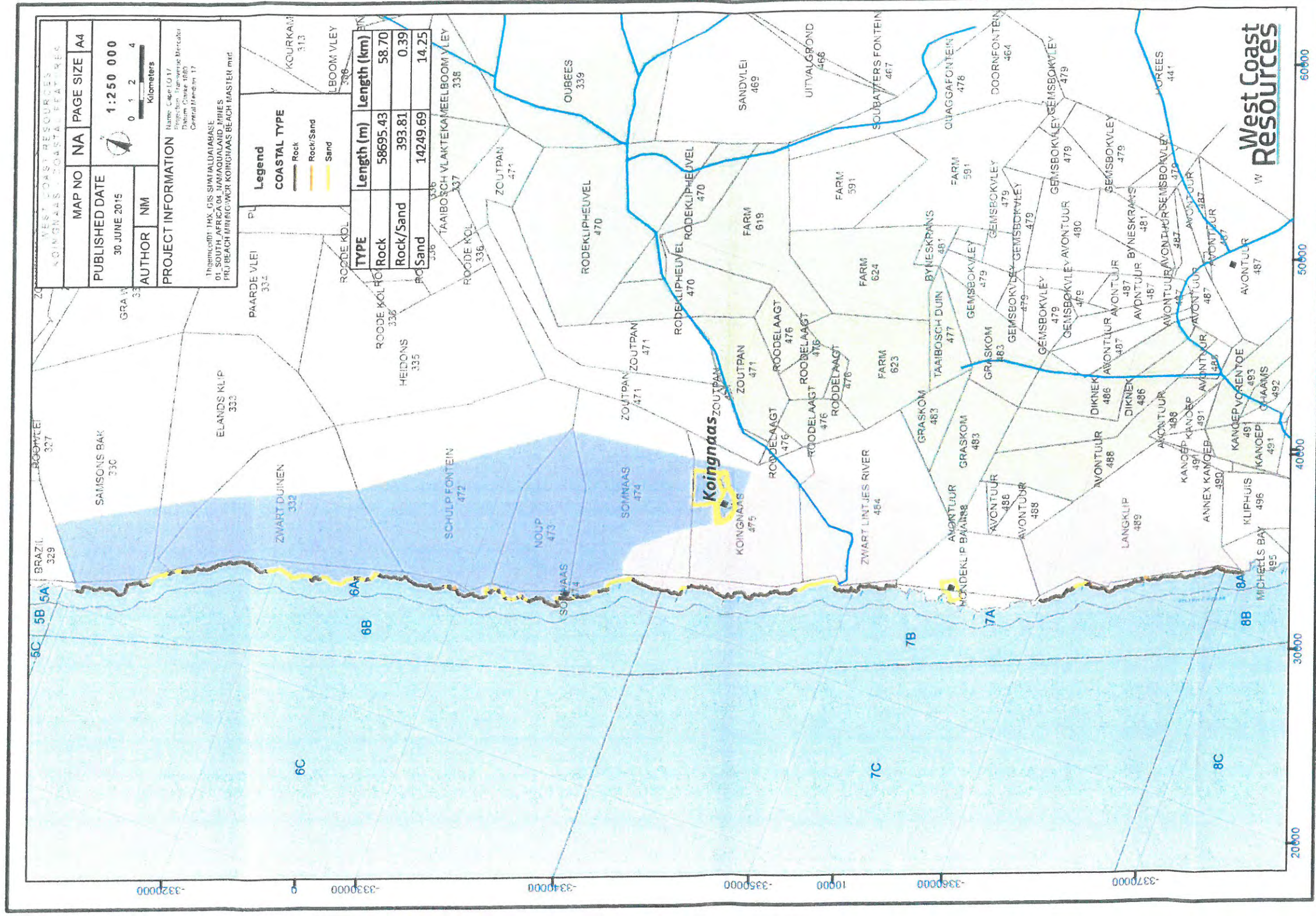


Figure 1; Map showing study area including the Koingnaas Right and Samson's bak Right



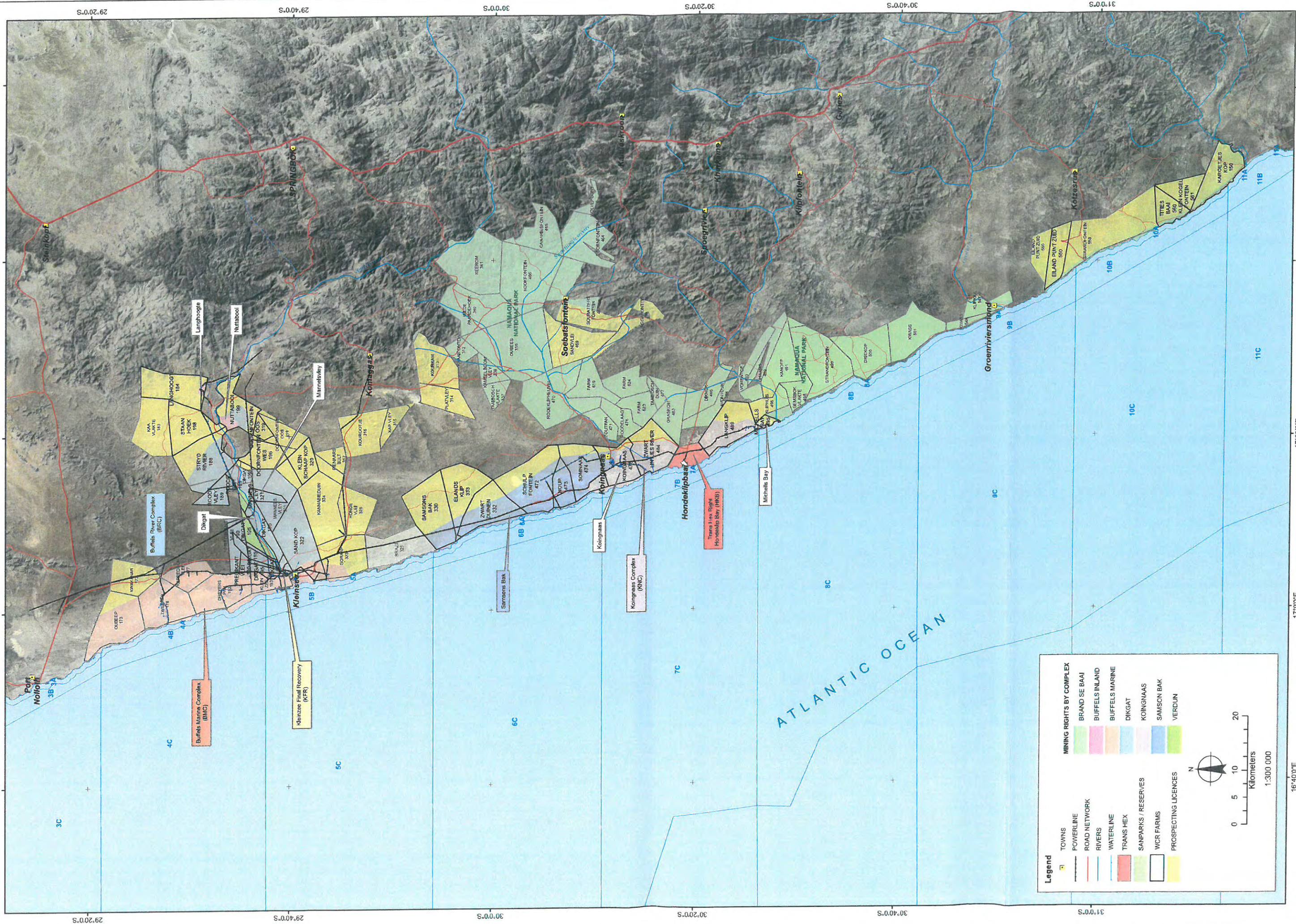


