



NOTICE FOR ENVIRONMENTAL AUTHORIZATION & WATER USE LICENSE APPLICATION

PROPOSED CREIGHTON BULK WATER SUPPLY SCHEME WITHIN HARRY GWALA DISTRICT MUNICIPALITY.

Notice is hereby given in terms of the National Water Act (NWA) (Act 36 No of 1998) and Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations (2014 as amended in 2017) published in Government Notice Regulation (GNR) 324 - GNR 327, in terms of Section 24 (5) and 44 of the National Environmental Management Act (NEMA) (Act No 107 of 1998) (as amended) of the initiative by Harry Gwala District Municipality to construct the Creighton Bulk Water Supply Scheme. This project aims to provide long-term bulk water supply scheme for Creighton area. Moreover, this project will provide reliable, adequate water source that will supply future water demands, including proposed developments within the area.

In respect of the above, the applicant, Harry Gwala District Municipality intends to undertake a Basic Assessment process as contemplated in the EIA Regulations for the process of applying for authorisation for the above proposed development to the Competent Authority, the KwaZulu-Natal Department of Economic Development, Tourism and Environmental Affairs (KZN EDTEA), as well as applying for Water Use Licence (WUL) to the Competent Authority, the National Department of Water and Sanitation as contemplated in Chapter 4 of the NWA.

- (a)Abstraction of water from a watercourse; and
- (c) Impeding or diverting the flow of water in a watercourse; and
- (i) Altering the bed, banks, course or characteristics of a watercourse
