J Paul van Wyk Urban Economists and Planners cc. proposes to construct a township in Derdepoort Park X 15 initial authorisation was granted in 2012, and the development has not happened, thus this a second application. It will be located on Portion 652 of the farm Derdepoort 326 JR, City of Tshwane Metropolitan Municipality, Gauteng Province.

In terms of the National Heritage Resources Act (NHRA), no 25 of 1999, heritage resources, including archaeological or palaeontological sites over 100 years old, graves older than 60 years, structures older than 60 years are protected. They may not be disturbed without a permit from the relevant heritage resources authority. This means that before such sites are disturbed by development it is incumbent on the developer (or mine) to ensure that a Heritage Impact Assessment is done. This must include the archaeological component (Phase 1) and any other applicable heritage components. Appropriate (Phase 2) mitigation, which involves recording, sampling and dating sites that are to be destroyed, must be done as required.

No Heritage Impact Assessment was uploaded to this case. Nor a Palaeontological Impact Assessment was uploaded to the case on SAHRIS.

SAHRA Notification of Development comment

SAHRA APM Unit requires a Heritage Impact Assessment study or Scoping Report conducted by a suitably qualified professional archaeologist for the proposed development. The assessment should look at the built environment, graves, and archaeology of the proposed development

The proposed development lies in an insignificant palaeontological sensitive zone (http://www.sahra.org.za/sahris/map/palaeo), thus SAHRA APM unit will exempt you from conducting a palaeontological assessment.

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
