Hi Carmen

Yes I gathered from the initial email that there were inaccuracies and mistruths and it was largely a lot of general ranting and raving on the part of the writer. It seems the Bugle may not have done their homework and the article, coupled together with some emails which are doing the rounds, is probably resulting in a lot of misinformed residences or distorted truths. However some of the points which have been made are still of concern and do carry some weight.

For all the inaccuracies in the Bugles article and the email I received, such a development is still a big concern for Gonubie residents.

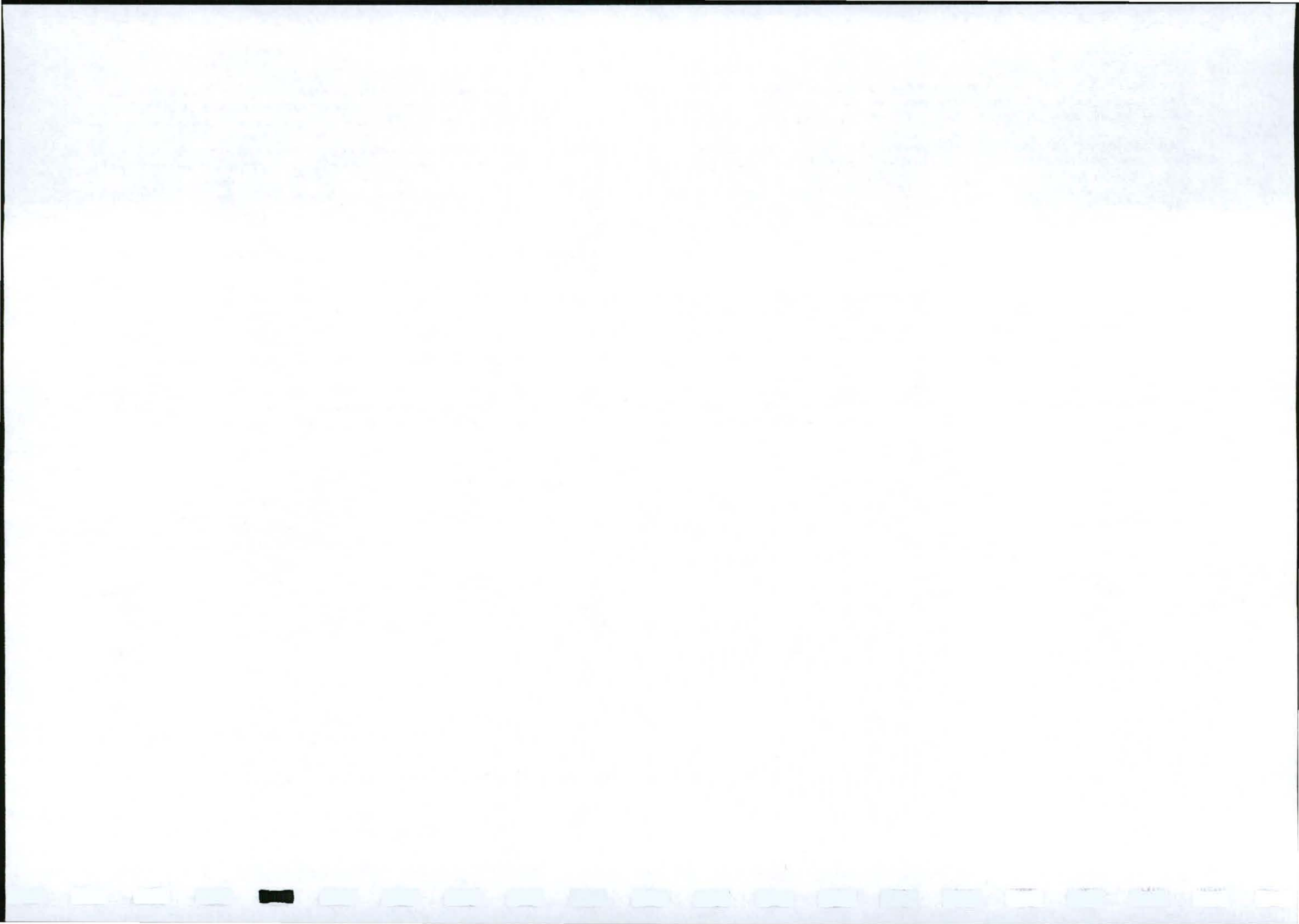
Your press release mentions: Mining operations will take place 300 metres inwards from the perimeter of the farm. Surrounding properties and their value **should** therefore not be impacted. That's a rather big "**should**" don't you think? I would have to seriously disagree with this statement. How could such an operation not have any impact on the surrounding areas? Further considering East London and the surrounding areas are plagued with extremely windy days throughout the year and further considering it will be a Sabunga & Sand mining operation there is a significant likelihood of dust/sandstorms. So how can such a statement be made at this point in time with any conviction at all?

Are Vaduba now not also bending the truth of the matter so as to suit them and put them in a better light?

It stands to reason the Mining Industry must have developed some ways to prevent or minimize things like dust/sandstorms and erosion so there may be a plan of action in the pipelines to try curb this but it is worth noting that the Permit Application (or pre permit application) attachment, while briefly touching on this (which in my opinion is going to be 1 of the underlying factors for opposition to this mining proposal), it does not actually specify how they propose to tackle this potential issue of contention. Based on the site characteristics, dust and erosion will require special attention.

With respect, weather portion 3 of farm 860 falls within Gonubies boundaries or not is not of much significance to the Gonubie Community – Gonubie has gotten bigger – if a development is proposed for a area nearby Gonubie it doesn't matter if it falls within Gonubies' boundaries, Queneras' boundaries or East Londons' boundaries – it will still be very close to us – not? And if it is close to us it is of a concern to us.

Considering the proposed mining term of 2 years compared to the outlined "Impacts to be Considered" – is this really going to benefit the greater Gonubie Community as a whole? Or rather just Vaduba and a select few. Im inclined to believe the larger Gonubie Community is not going to benefit much at all. And once those 2 years have come and gone whats to stop Vaduba from doing something like this again for an adjacent or nearby site? And 1 of their motivating factors again will be "well we have actually been mining nearby all along so really it is not that big a ask". As far as I am concerned mining should never have



been allowed to take place in or nearby Gonubie at all. It just opens the door for further undesirable developments.

In my opinion the potential damage and scaring of the land compared to the limited employment opportunities (which I feel is pretty much the only benefit for the Gonubie Community) is just not worth it. Gonubie will also have needs to expand in the future and this development will be right smack bang square in the middle of pretty much the only way Gonubie can expand. And who really wants a mining operation in the middle of Gonubie? Not to mention how feasible will future growth opportunities for Gonubie be if most of the land on which is can expand was dug up in the past and then filled with rubble and waste?

Gonubie has traditionally always been a local seaside village/town which attracts a fair amount of tourists each year. We have such a beautiful and pristine surrounding landscape. Gonubie has its own unique style and feel to it. It has its own "Vibe", its own "Spirit". Such a mining operation I feel will erode this "Spirit" of Gonubie. It will destroy its surrounding natural beauty and ultimately make way for similar undesirable projects/developments in future. And for these reasons I am apposed to it. I have completed the "Response Sheet" and it is attached – I trust this is sufficient means to lodge my objections?

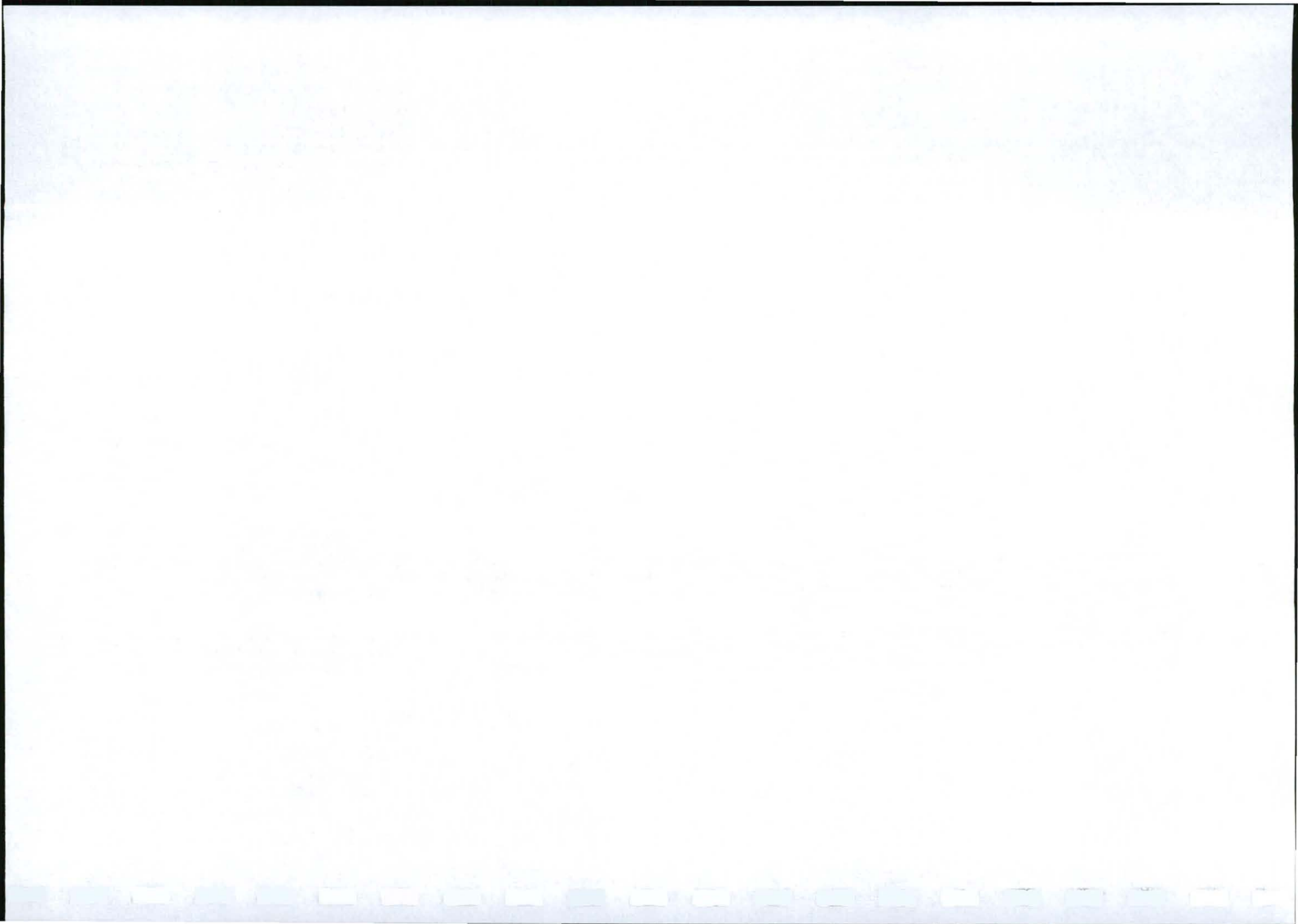

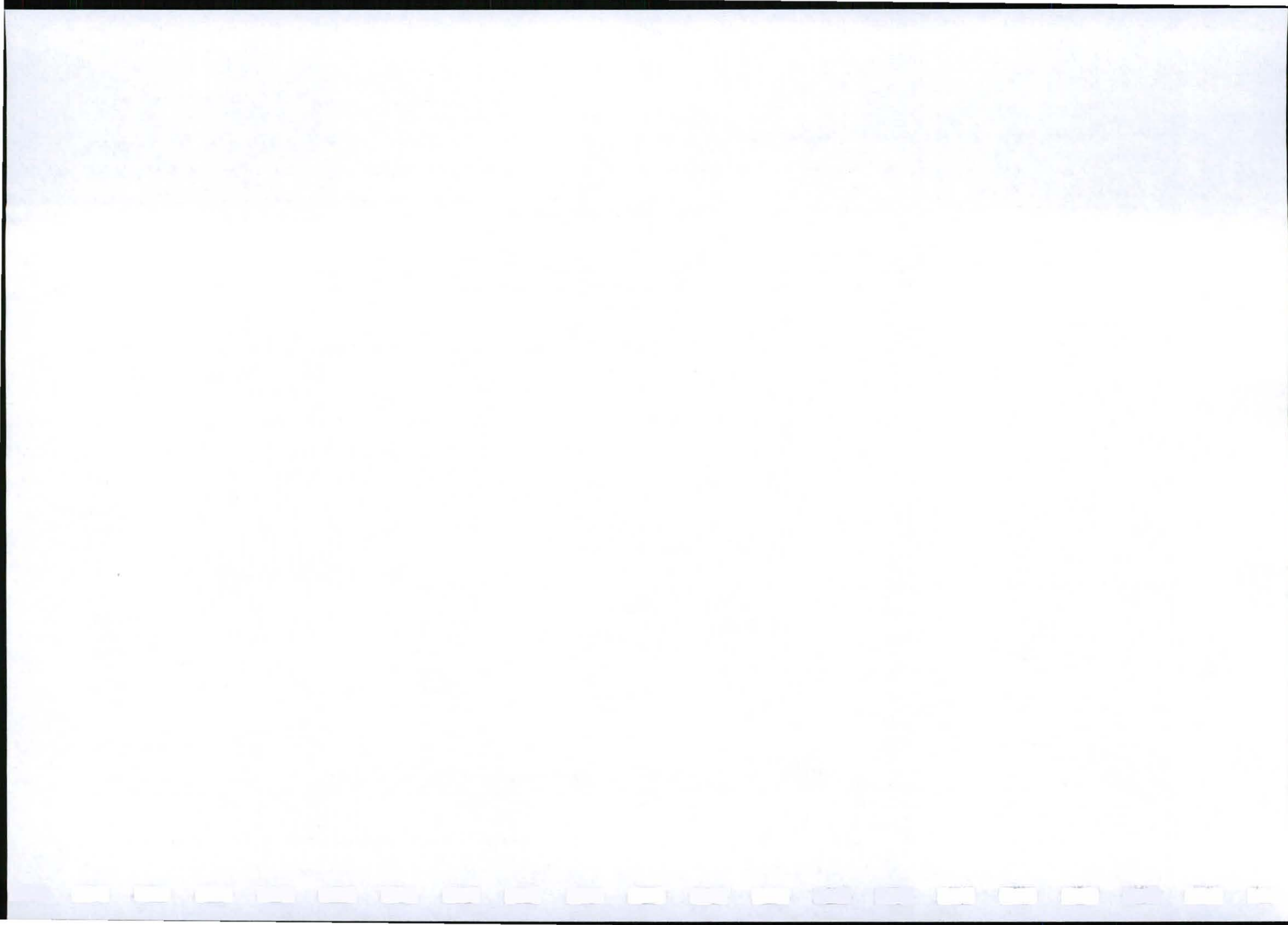

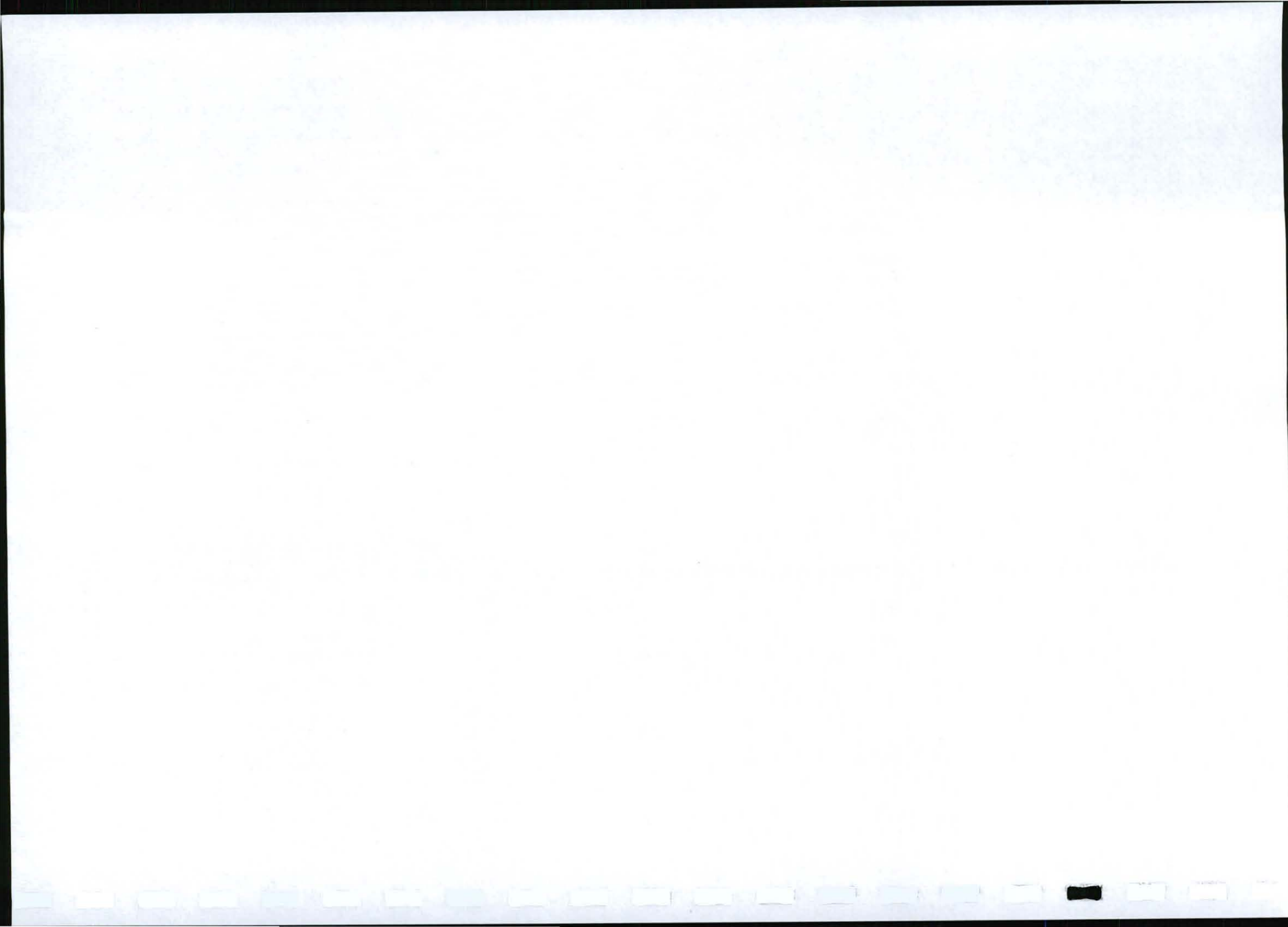
I don't know if you have seen the Bugle of Friday 21 August 09, but Vaduba Investments CC or otherwise known as Riegers have logged an application to mine a section of farmland opposite the new school and next to Mzamomhle. They intent to use Gullsway and Ocean drive as access and distribution roads according to the article.

This raises a serious concern to me as resident and homeowner in Gonubie as

- Our property value will decrease due to the location – in future we will be close to an industrial or mining site – we will be about 1 km from the mine – anything within 20km is deemed as bordering an industrial site.
- Our rates will increase once again due to the increase in road surface damage caused by the increased heavy vehicle traffic. Ocean Drive, Gullsway and then Main Rd is already a patchwork and the municipality is not keeping up with the maintenance at the moment and we constantly have to swerve to avoid potholes – I have had two blowouts already and had to have one Mag fixed at my own cost
- The wind blows at least 1 out of five days in Gonubie, the amount of increased dust and sand in the area will be unbearable and will make our lives utter hell.
- Service delivery will suffer seriously as there will be so much more for the municipality to do and that will impact on the rates again.

AGRICULTURAL ASSESSMENT REPORT OF FARM MENTIONED ABOVE

1. INTRODUCTION

The Department of Agriculture has received an application for a mining permit on portion 1 of farm 800. The application, as per perusal affects the change of the use of the agricultural land and henceforth would be considered in terms of the norms and standards of Act 70 of 1970 [Sub-division and change of land use of Agricultural land]. This application is for the development of a mining industry as per proposal of the farmer who hereunder is referred to as the property owner and the legal occupier. Subsequent to the application, a team of agricultural officials have been sent to the fore-mentioned farm to undertake agricultural potential assessment of the fore-mentioned farm.

LOCALITY

Farm 800/1: Located at Combie in the East London urban edge area

CLIMATIC CONDITIONS

• General

The area is a relatively humid subtropical with relatively mild winters and warm summers.

• Rainfall

The mean annual range rainfall of the area is 800 to 1000mm with a distribution of around 54% in summer and 46 % in winter.

• Temperature

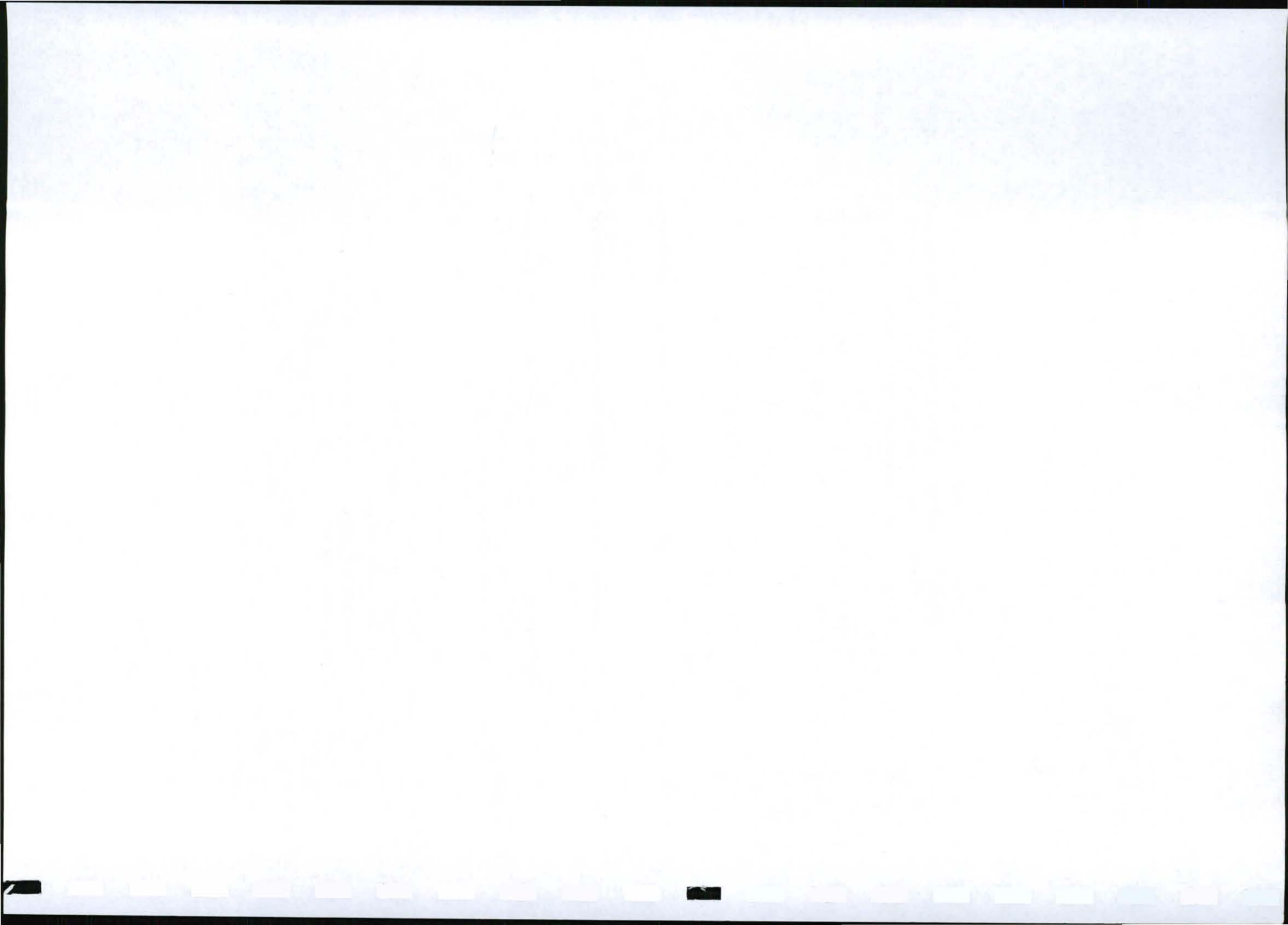
The area has temperatures with mean summer range of 14.1 – 25.2 °C with maximum average annual temperature 23°C. The mean winter temperature range is 9.9 – 23.9° C with minimum average annual temperature of 13°C.

Frost:

No frost and snow occurrence.

Wind

Strong south easterly sea breezes generally occur during the summer month. During the winter and early spring, hot and berg winds occur, proceeding to cold fronts. Winds are generally strong and can be a problem with crop production if no windbreakers are planted.



2. NATURAL RESOURCES

a. Vegetation

The veldt type of this area as described by Acocks as the Coastal Forest and Thornveld.

b. Topography and Soils

The topography of the area is flat with the terrain morphological unit of 3L to 4 and a slope range of 0 to about 3%. The soil types found dominating on the property are shallow and eroded soils of the Westleigh form and the Namib soil forms. These soil forms are not suitable for crop production and henceforth it is advisable to leave such soils as natural veld.

3. CONCLUSION

The portion of the farm to be considered for the change of land use does not form any economically viable unit. The soils are marginal and can not be recommended for any agricultural crop production. It can thus be recommended that the property be considered for the intended use as proposed by the farmer as the Department Of Agriculture does not have any objections in the change of land use on the basis of this assessment. Furthermore, it is therefore recommended that as the proposed project on the property is likely to create job opportunities for the Gombie community be considered for the future intended use.
