Once in the area these newcomers are not likely to move away – the lack of housing and resources cannot possibly support them - this will create further demands on an already overcrowded informal settlement and withering economy.</p> <p>A further concern is that of crime. Gonubie recently has lost one of its senior citizens to crime, and other incidences of muggings and assaults of the elderly have been reported. An increase in an unemployed population will lead to further and more frequent occurrences. This is not emotional rhetoric but a fact; poverty and unemployment equals crime.</p> <p><u>Pollution – air, noise</u></p> <p>As mentioned above, air pollution is a serious concern, and smoke and dust are inevitable. No matter what assurances are given regarding that this pollution will be kept to a</p>	
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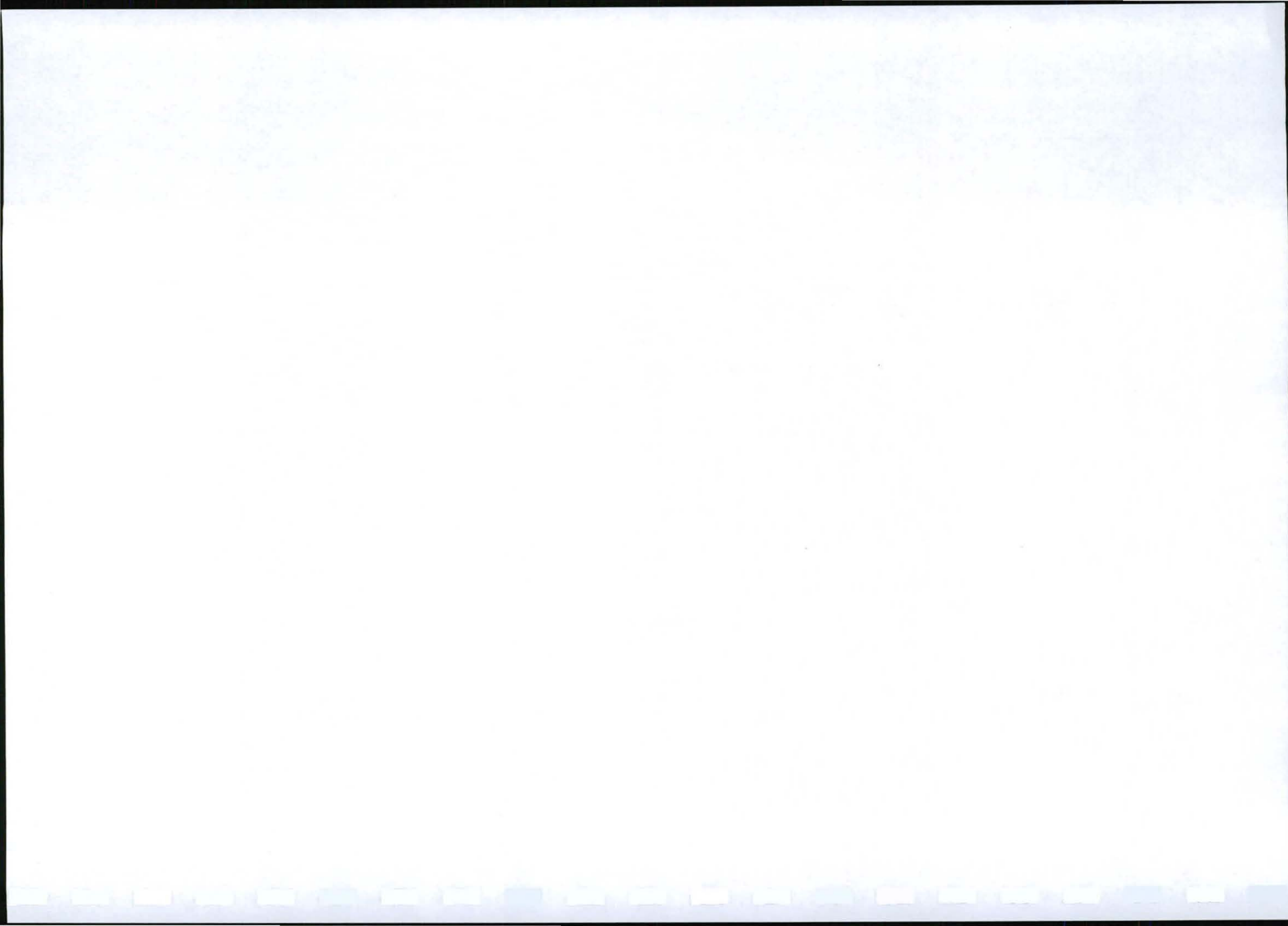
				<p>minimum, it will be impossible to state that it will not have an adverse affect on the environment. Heavy winds are the order of the day along the eastern cape coast line, and combined with the pollution of a mine or quarry in the middle of town – this is a recipe for a polluted air disaster.</p> <p>The noise levels in Gonubie at present are acceptable for that of a residential area, but combined with that of heavy industry it is unlikely to remain so.</p> <p><u>Infrastructure - Sewerage Works and Electricity</u></p> <p>Basic services such as electricity and the sewerage works are already working to capacity, and especially in Eastwood Ho, power shortages are prevalent, and being at the end of the line, the sewerage pipes often overflow into my back yard. Whilst I am aware that the sewerage works are being upgraded, the municipality has confirmed that the underground pipes are old and too small. This is an ongoing problem, and my concern is whether heavy industry has been accommodated for in the new sewerage works, and for that matter in the same vein if the electricity supply will be sufficient.</p> <p><u>Traffic congestion and road flow and road usage</u></p> <p>Gonubie residents already experience traffic congestion on roads that have recently been widened to accommodate the extra influx of people, but despite this the upgrade has not been that successful in moving the traffic along in peak periods. The main road is the only safe access in and out of the town, and in times of accidents, police road blocks etc the</p>	
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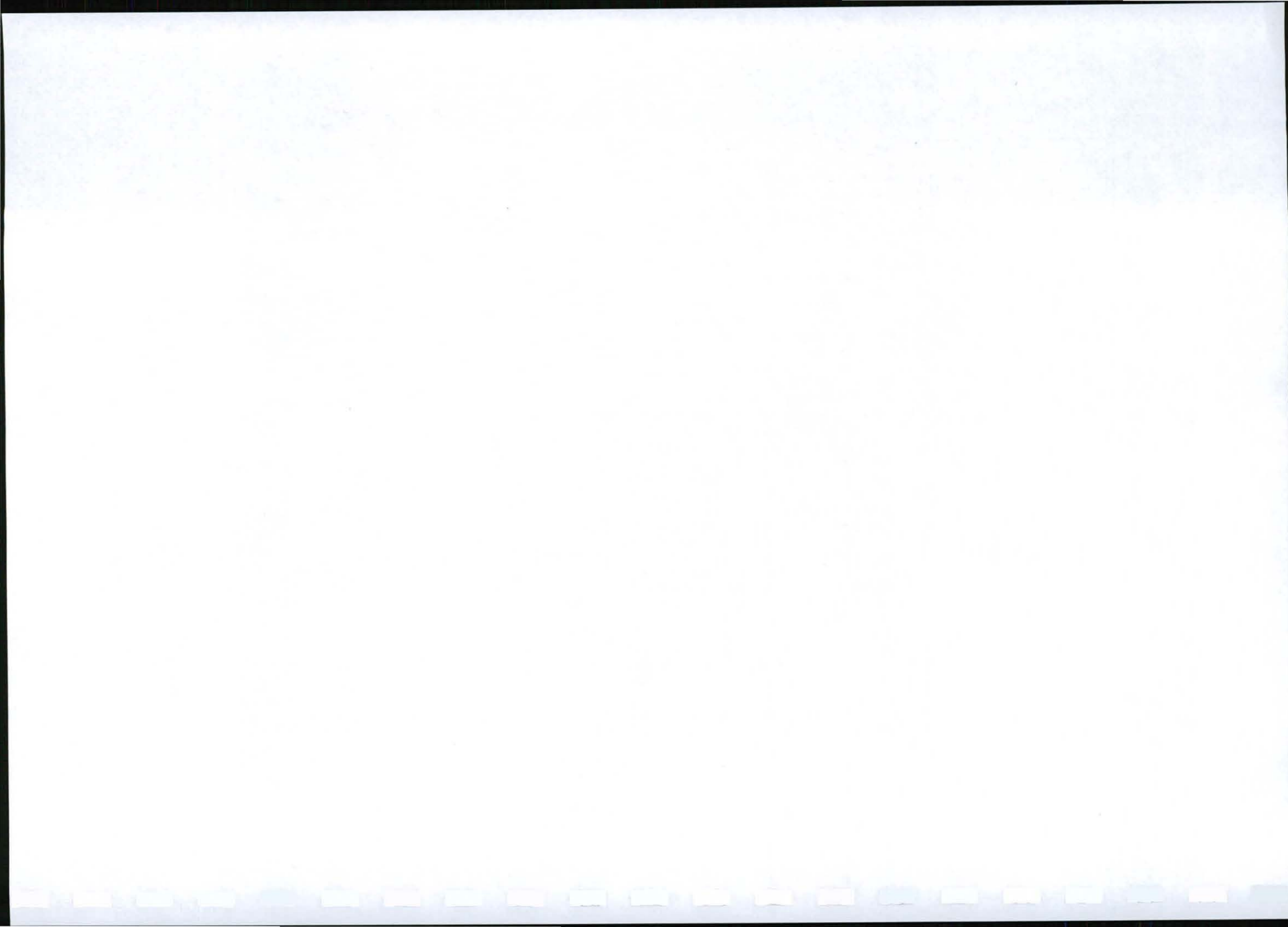
				<p>traffic backs up, and one will sit in the traffic for up to 2 hours (this I have personally experienced). Additional heavy duty vehicles will only exacerbate the existing problem. Gullsway and Ocean View roads have not been designed either in width or surface to accommodate heavy vehicles. The roads are inadequate to service the current traffic, added heavy duty vehicles will erode the roads and aggravate the situation.</p> <p><u>Road Safety and Damage to Private Vehicles</u></p> <p>Daily I travel behind Reiger's trucks, and daily my car is pitted with flying sand and other debris from the back of these trucks – more heavy duty trucks travelling the same route will cause more damage to personal vehicles. Another concern is that of mining/quarry vehicles using the road so close to the school and Mzamomhle. Terms of reference

The original proposal was to conduct a Phase 1 Archaeological Heritage Impact Assessment for the proposed mining of weathered dolerite (sabunga) on portion 3 of Farm No. 860, Mount Coke, East London, Amathole District Municipality, Eastern Cape Province; to describe and evaluate the importance of possible archaeological heritage sites, the potential impact of the development and to make recommendations to minimize possible damage to these sites.



DESCRIPTION OF THE PROPERTY

Location data

The proposed mining of granite on portion 3 of Farm No. 860, Mount Coke, East London, Amathole District Municipality, is located on the corner of the old R346 King William's Town to East London road and the Gulu turn-off, approximately 19km west from East London (Maps 1 and 2).

ARCHAEOLOGICAL INVESTIGATION

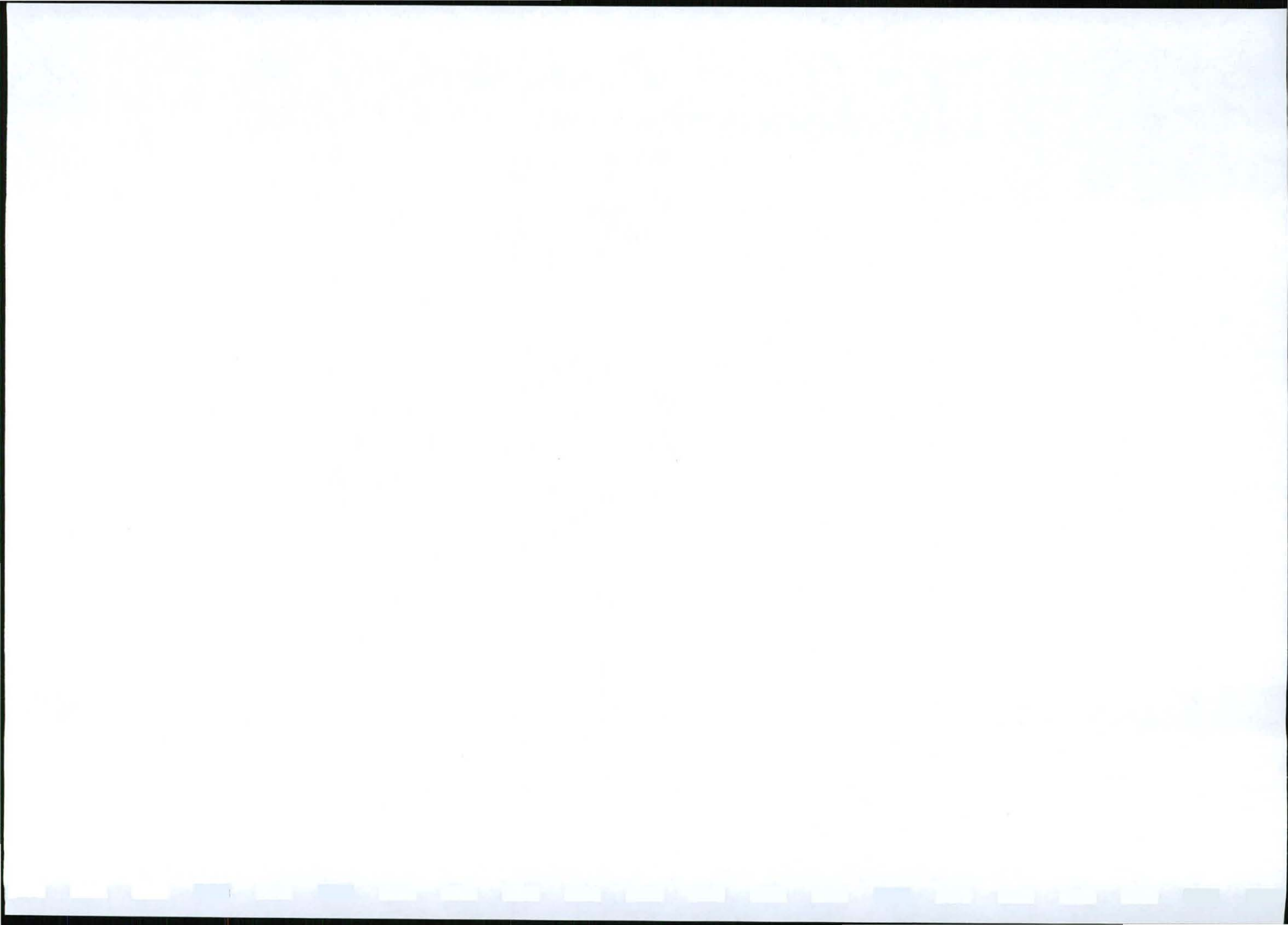
Methodology

The investigation was conducted on foot by two people. The proposed areas for the weathered granite mining are situated on a relatively flat hilltop with a slight gradient towards the western part of the farm beyond the area proposed for mining. The proposed areas are covered by thick dense vegetation comprised of tall grass, trees and shrubs (Figs. 1-2). The density of the vegetation made the area impenetrable.

Six test pits had previously been dug to determine the quality of the weathered dolerite, these test pits were investigated for possible evidence of archaeological sites and materials, as the vegetation around these areas had already been cleared, making visibility easier. Granite boulders also protrude above the ground within the area proposed for mining and in the greater part of the landscape, making it highly unlikely that archaeological remains and material will be found (Figs. 3-4).

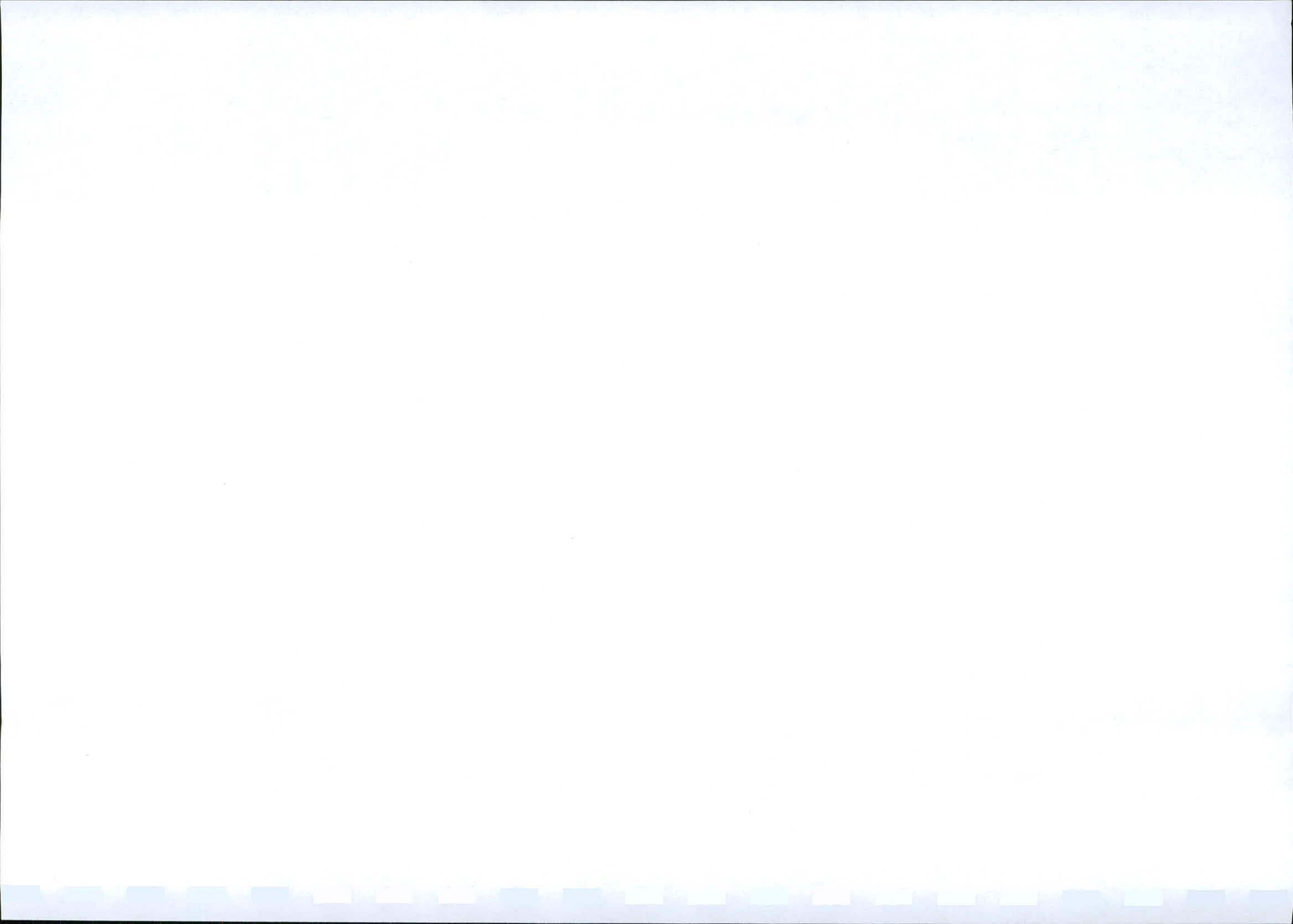
Test pit 6 (33° 00.34.68S; 27° 43.17.89E)

Test pits 1-5 are situated on the western side of the farm on which the proposed area will be mined. Pits with depths ranging between 1-2.5m had been dug to establish the quality of the weathered dolerite. The topsoil is shallow ranging between 30-40cm (Figs. 5-6).

Test pit 6 is situated on the eastern side of the farm. This test pit is large and large granite boulders are evident at about 30-50cm below the surface (Figs. 7-8). In both areas the top soil overlying the weathered granite deposit is shallow and does not allow for archaeological features, such as grain pits, hut floors and cattle kraals. No archaeological sites/materials were found during the survey. In general it would appear that it is unlikely that any archaeological heritage remains of any value will be found *in situ* or of any contextual value will be exposed during the development.

Conditions

Although it is unlikely that any archaeological heritage remains of any value will be found *in situ* or of any contextual value, there is always a possibility that human remains and/or other archaeological and historical material may be uncovered during the development. Such material must be reported to the nearest museum, archaeologist or to the South African Heritage Resources Agency (SAHRA) if exposed, so that a systematic and professional investigation can be undertaken. Sufficient time should be allowed to remove/collect such material (See Appendix A for a list of possible archaeological sites that maybe found in the area).

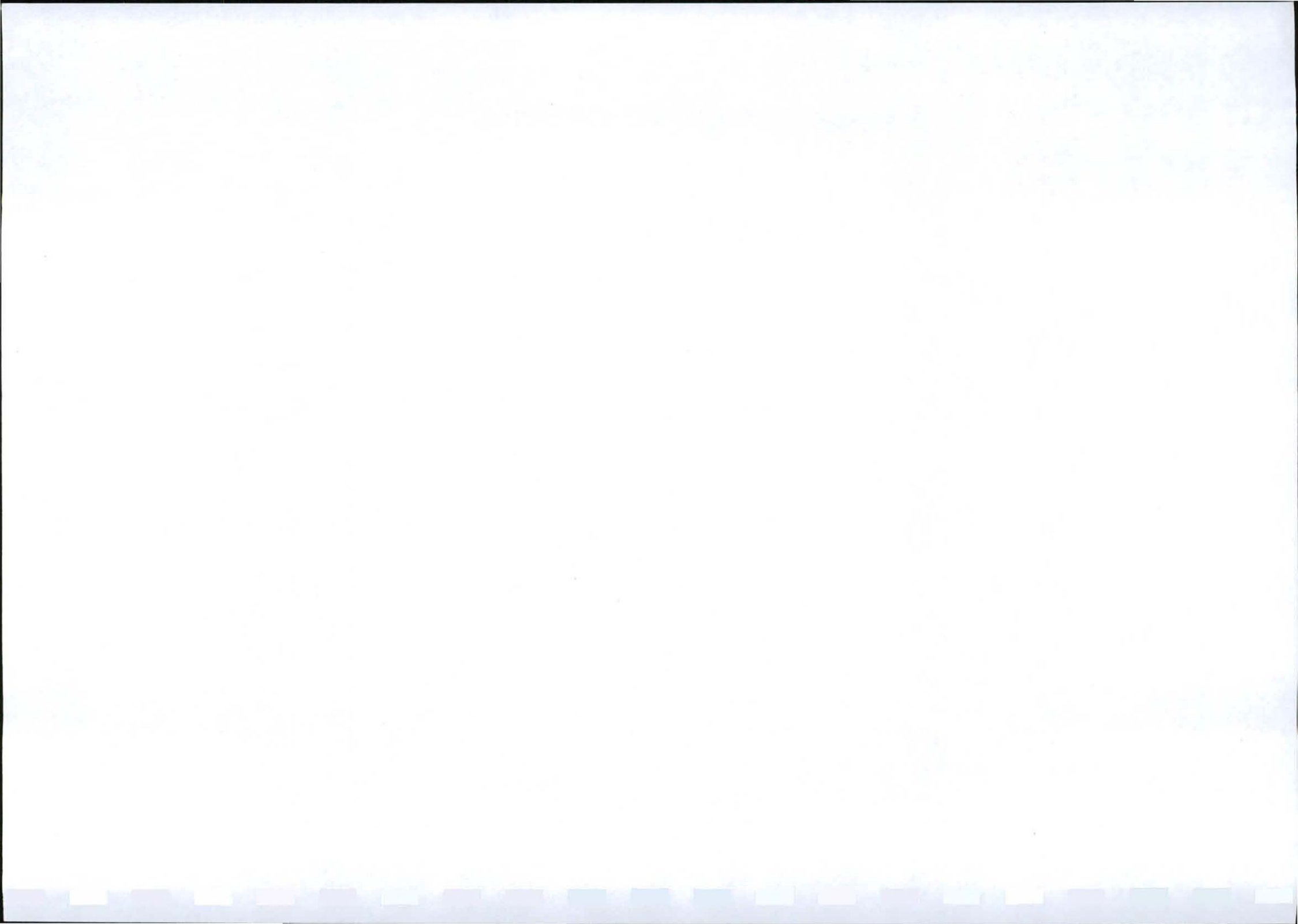
Letter of recommendation

It is recommended that the proposed mining of weathered dolerite on portion 3 of Farm No. 860, Mount Coke, East London, Amathole District Municipality, is exempted from a full Phase 1 Archaeological Heritage Impact Assessment. The proposed area for development is of low cultural sensitivity and it is believed that it is unlikely that any archaeological heritage remains will be found on the property. The proposed development may proceed as planned.

Note: This letter of recommendation **only** exempts the proposed development from a full Phase 1 Archaeological Heritage Impact Assessment, but **not** for other heritage impact assessments.

It must also be clear that this letter of recommendation for exemption of a full Phase 1 archaeological heritage impact assessment will be assessed by the relevant heritage resources authority. The final decision rests with the heritage resources authority, which should give a permit or a formal letter of permission for the destruction of any cultural sites.

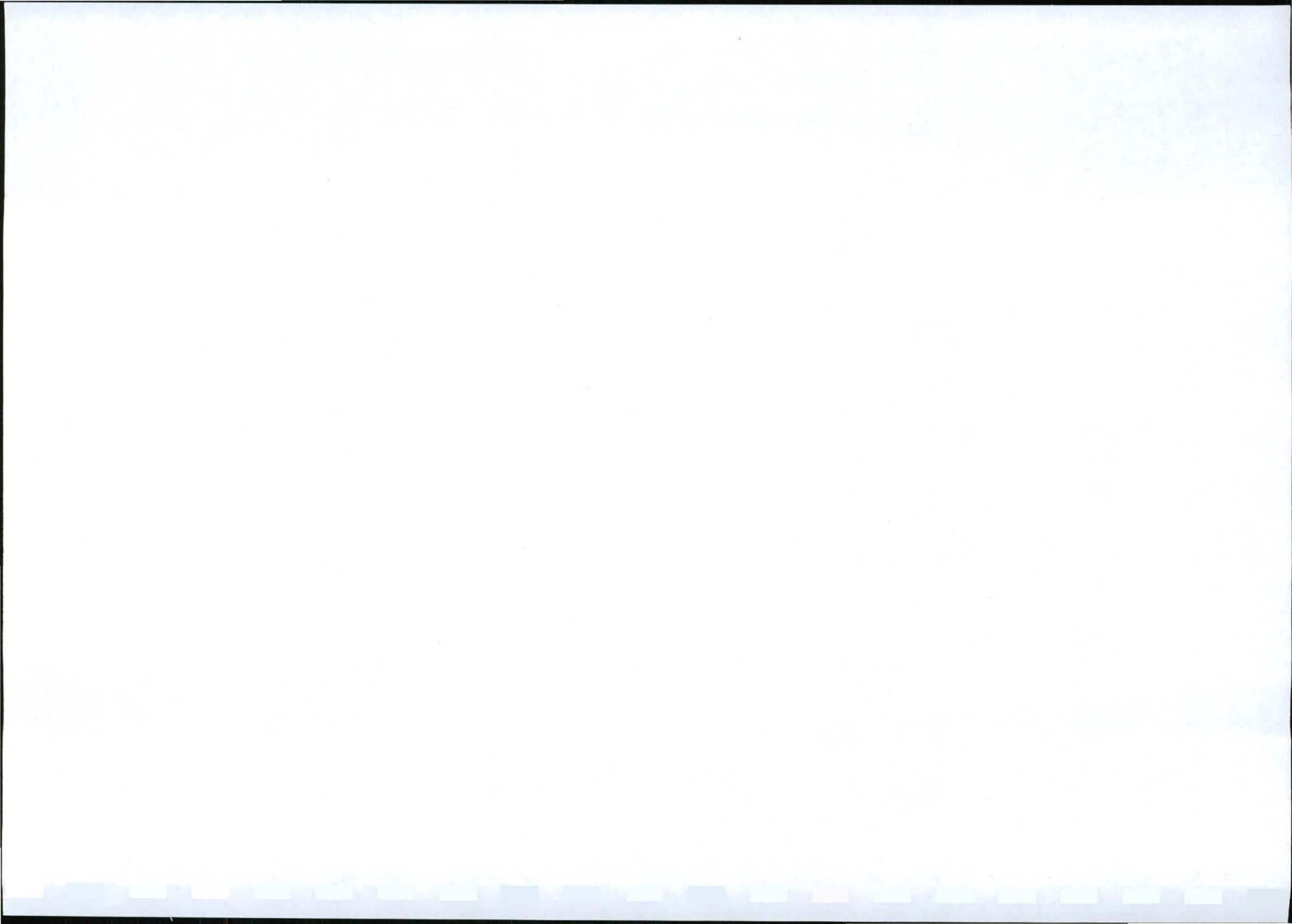
The National Heritage Resources Act (Act No. 25 of 1999, section 35) requires a full Heritage Impact Assessment (HIA) in order that all heritage resources, that is, all places or objects of aesthetics, architectural, historic, scientific, social, spiritual linguistic or technological value or significance are protected. Thus any assessment should make provision for the protection of all these heritage components, including archaeology, shipwrecks, battlefields, graves, and



structures older than 60 years, living heritage, historical settlements, landscapes, geological sites, palaeontological sites and objects.

GENERAL REMARKS AND CONDITIONS

It must be emphasised that this letter of recommendation for exemption of a full Phase 1 archaeological heritage impact assessment is based on the visibility of archaeological sites/material and may not therefore, reflect the true state of affairs. Sites and material may be covered by soil and vegetation and will only be located once this has been removed. In the unlikely event of such finds being uncovered, (during any phase of construction work), archaeologists must be informed immediately so that they can investigate the importance of the sites and excavate or collect material before it is destroyed (see attached list of possible archaeological sites and material). The *onus* is on the developer to ensure that this agreement is honoured in accordance with the National Heritage Act No. 25 of 1999.



APPENDIX A: IDENTIFICATION OF ARCHAEOLOGICAL FEATURES AND MATERIAL FROM INLAND AREAS: guidelines and procedures for developers

1. Identification of Iron Age archaeological features and material

- Upper and lower grindstones, broken or complete. Later Iron Age upper and lower grindstones/rubbers will be pitted.
- Circular hollows - sunken soil, would indicate storage pits and often associated with grindstones.
- Ash heaps, called middens with cultural remains and food waste such as bone.
- Khaki green soils would indicate kraal areas.
- Baked clay/soil blocks with or without pole, stick and grass impression marks indicate hut structures.
- Ceramic potsherds.
- Iron slag and/or blowpipes indicate iron working.
- Human remains may also be associated with khaki green soils.
- Metal objects and ornaments

2. Human Skeletal material

Human remains, whether the complete remains of an individual buried during the past, or scattered human remains resulting from disturbance of the grave, should be reported. In general the remains are buried in a flexed position on their sides, but are also found buried in a sitting position with a flat stone capping or in ceramic pots. Developers are requested to be on the alert for these features and remains.

3. Fossil bone

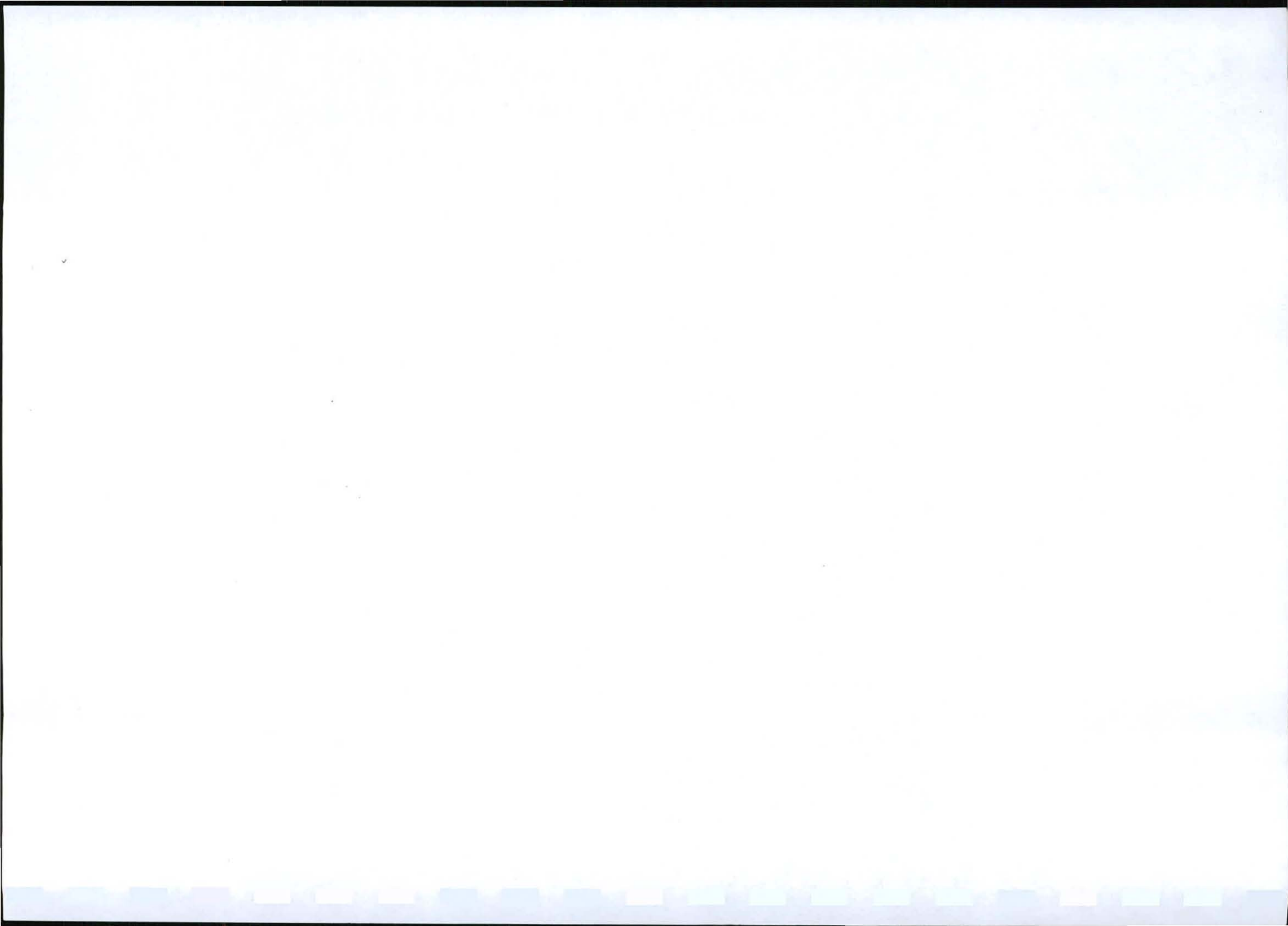
Fossil bones may be found embedded in deposit at the sites. Any concentrations of bones, whether fossilized or not, should be reported.

4. Stone artefacts

These are difficult for the layman to identify. However, large accumulations of flaked stones which do not appear to have been distributed naturally, should be reported. If the stone tools are associated with bone remains, development should be halted immediately and archaeologists notified.

5. Historical artefacts or features

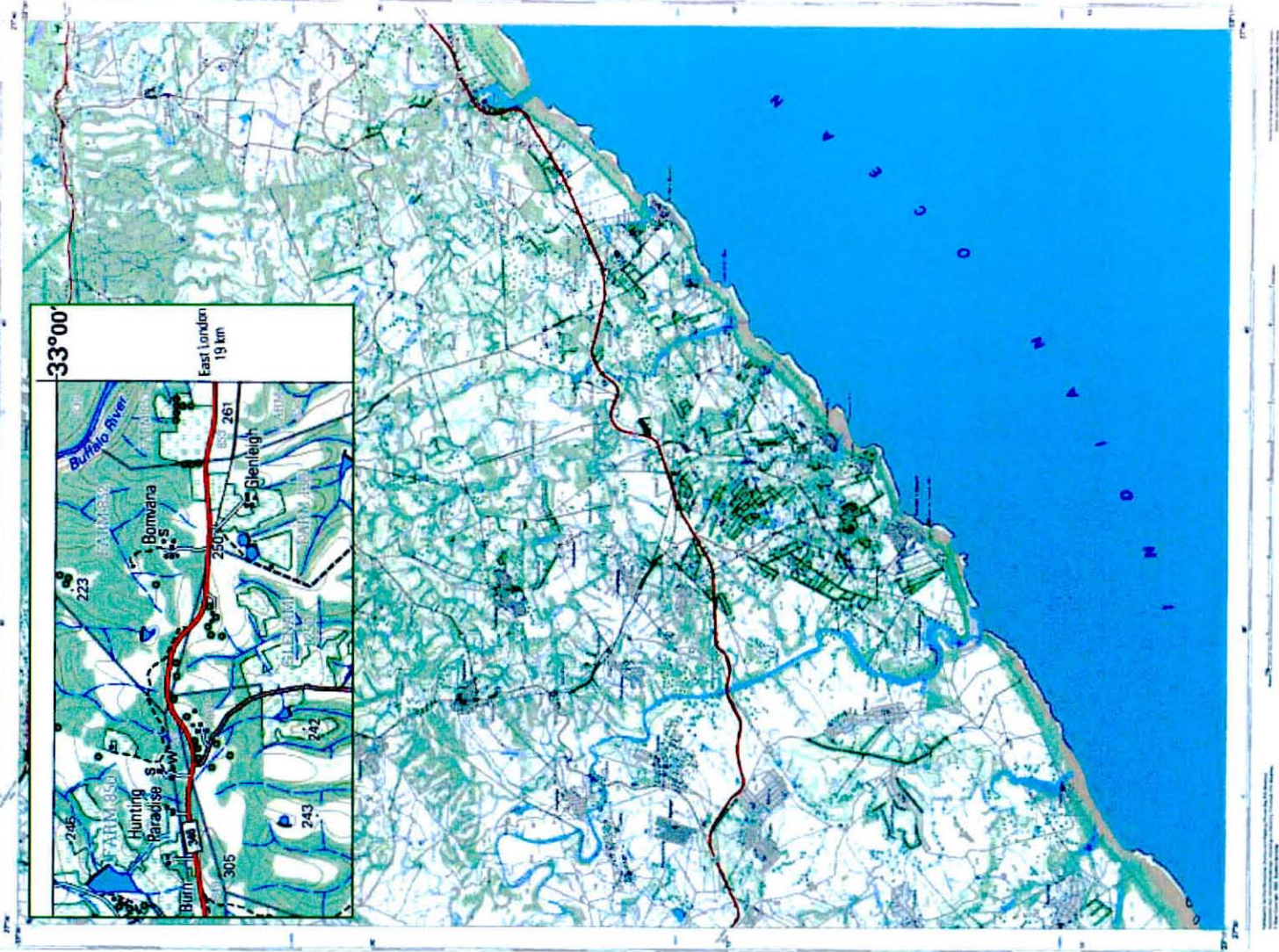
These are easy to identified and include foundations of buildings or other construction features and items from domestic and military activities.



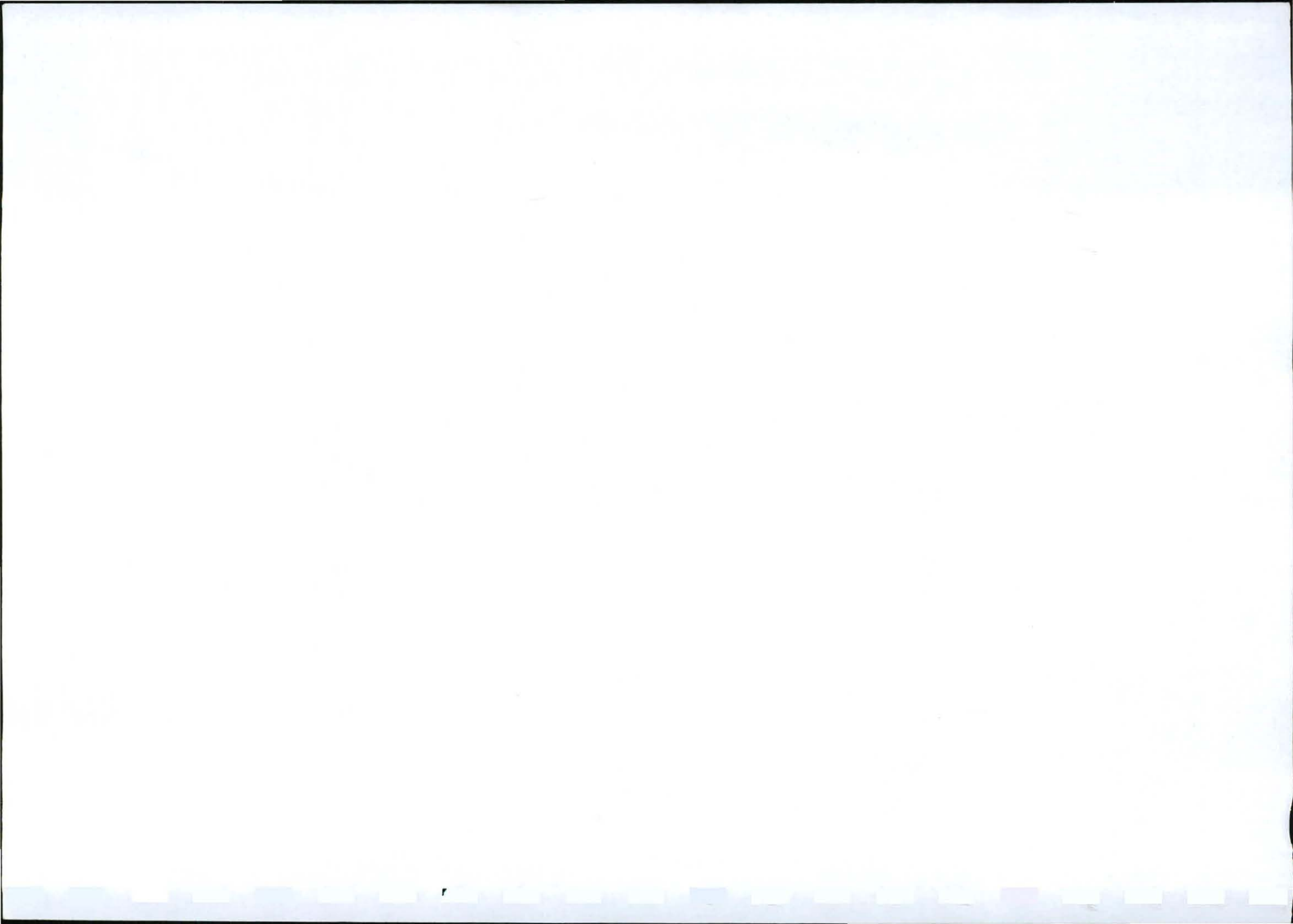
