9 ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT PROGRAMME

9.1 BACKGROUND AND OBJECTIVES

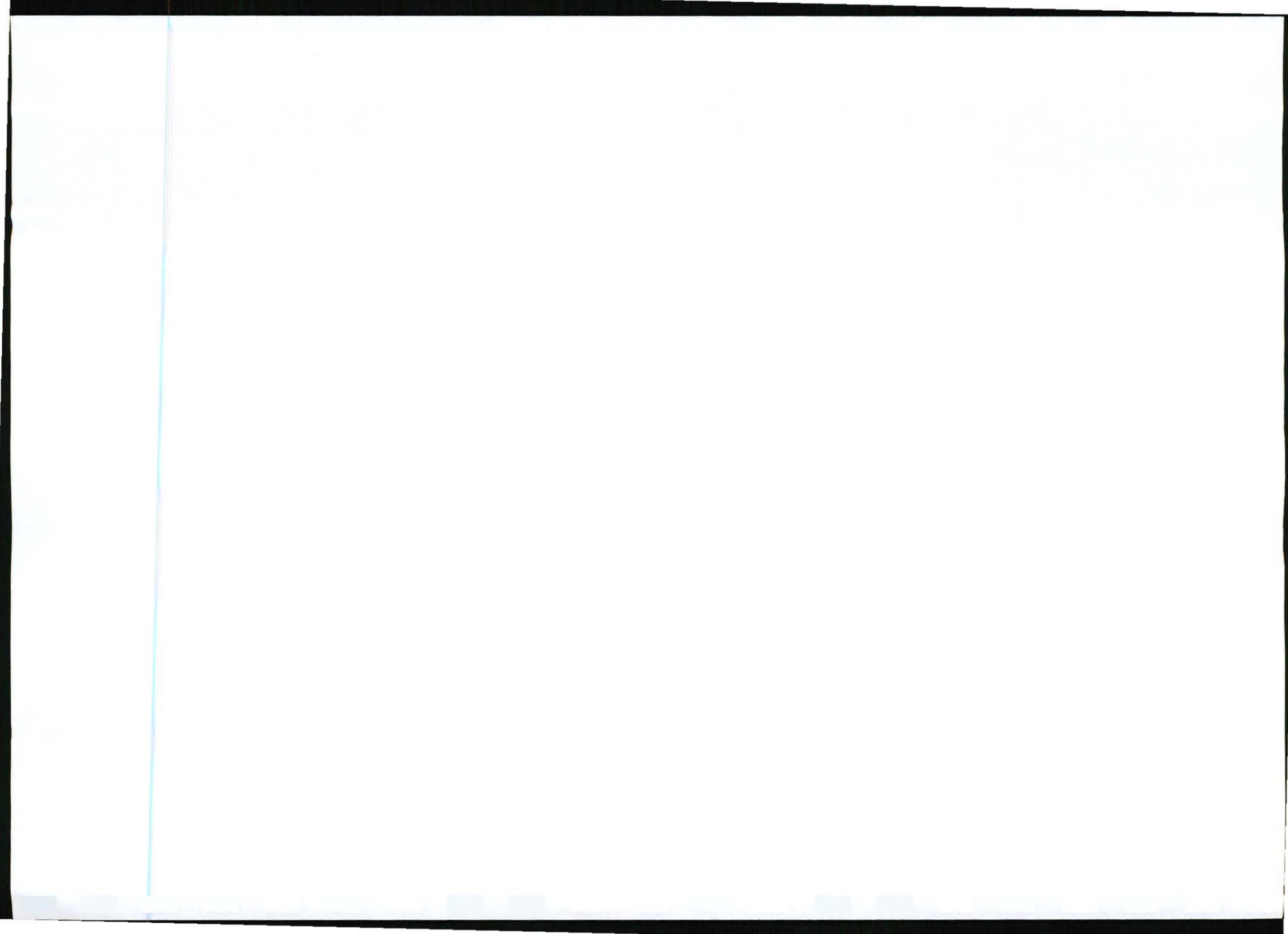
This Environmental Management Plan (EMP) sets out the methods by which proper environmental controls are to be implemented by the contractor and or the Applicant. It has been compiled as a guideline for the mitigation and management measures to be implemented during the establishment, operational and rehabilitation phase of the exploration activity. The EMP provides specifications and regulations that must in all instances be adhered to. It is however the responsibility of all people involved to commit to the implementation of the EMP in all phases of the project, or in those instances where specific instructions are provided.

Failure to comply with the EMP will result in the suspension of part or all of the works if the contractor and or the Applicant causes damage to the environment by not adhering to the specifications set within the EMP.

- The suspension will be enforced until such time as the offending parties' actions, procedure and/or equipment are corrected.
- No extension of time will be granted for such delays and all costs will be borne by the contractor.

It should be noted that the EMP as provided in Table 10 is generic (based on the broad environmental assessment provided in this EMPR) and should be amended after the exact location of the exploration site has been established to make the EMP more site specific. Specific issues are discussed under the different phases of the exploration activity as indicated below:

- Pre-establishment phase
 - Pre-survey planning
 - Environmental Awareness training
 - Financial provision
- Establishment phase
 - Notify Interested and Affected Parties
 - Compliance with the requirements of the EMP
 - Establishment of infrastructure
 - Isolation and protection of sensitive areas
- Operational phase
 - Complying with the requirements of the EMP
 - Environmental emergency prevention
 - Emergency response procedures
 - Pollution prevention and waste management
- Decommissioning and Rehabilitation
 - Decommission of infrastructure
 - Rehabilitation of affected areas



- Notification of completion
- Monitoring and Compliance Audit
 - Performance assessment and monitoring activities
 - Final close-out audit

9.1.1 *Environmental Impact*

Where possible, the EMP will aim to reduce the significance of each negative impact and enhance positive impacts which have been identified. The EMP will aim to:

- Minimize disturbance to the physical and biological environment;
- Minimize or prevent disturbance to any sites of cultural or heritage values; and to
- Minimize or enhance any socio-economic impacts that might result from the proposed activity.

9.1.2 *Rehabilitation*

The objectives of the rehabilitation phase will be to restore the affected site to a condition prior to disturbance so as to minimize the impact on land use and land capability. The objectives will therefore be to:

- Remove all infrastructure and material that was introduced onto the site;
- Remove all contaminated soils and dispose of it in an appropriate manner;
- Fill all excavated areas (sump areas) with overburden to the level of the existing ground surface;
- Replace topsoil in the areas where it has been stripped; and
- Re-establish vegetation by means of re-seeding with a seed mixture similar to the floral species within the surrounding area and/or planting of partially mature plants.

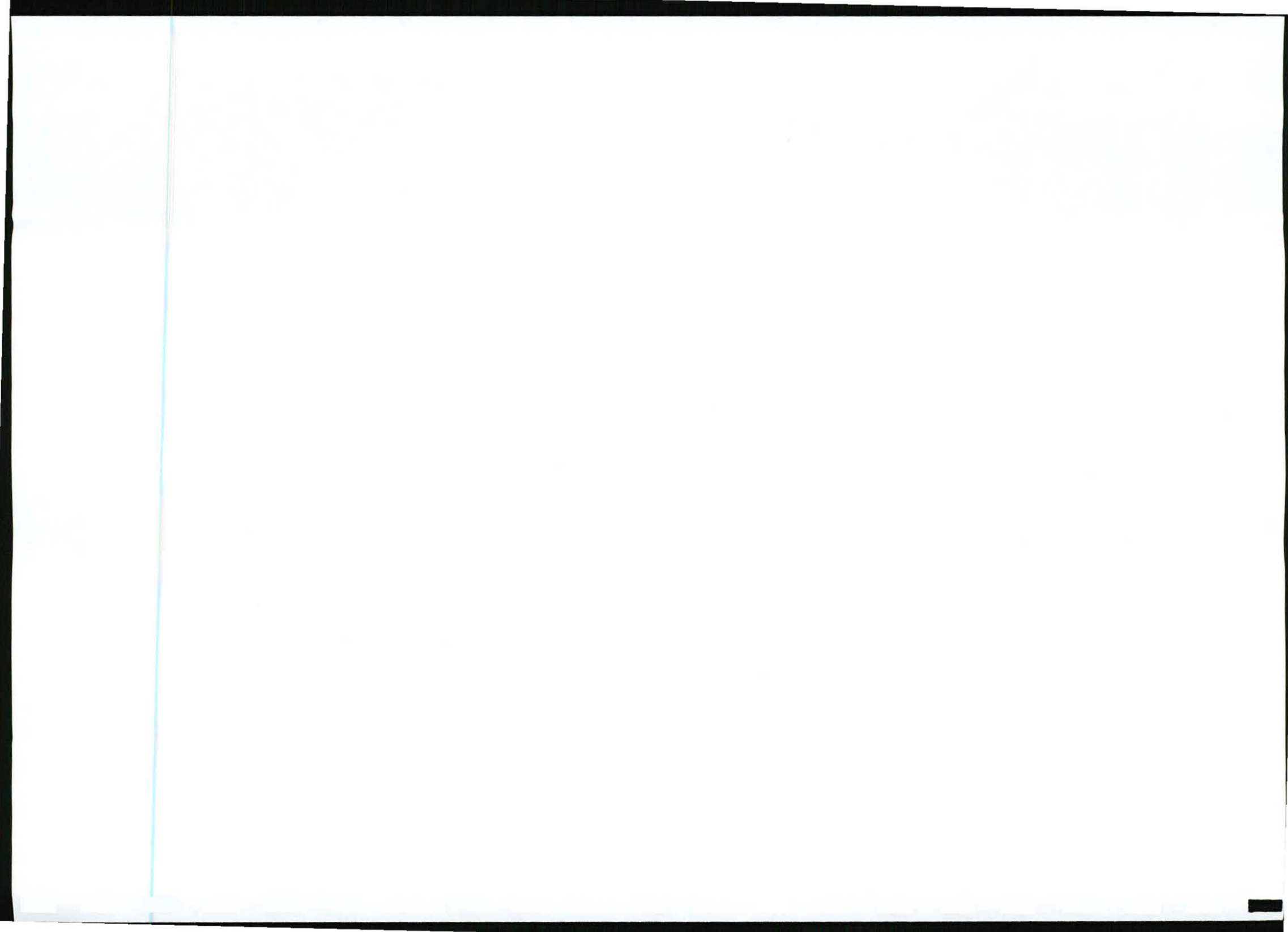
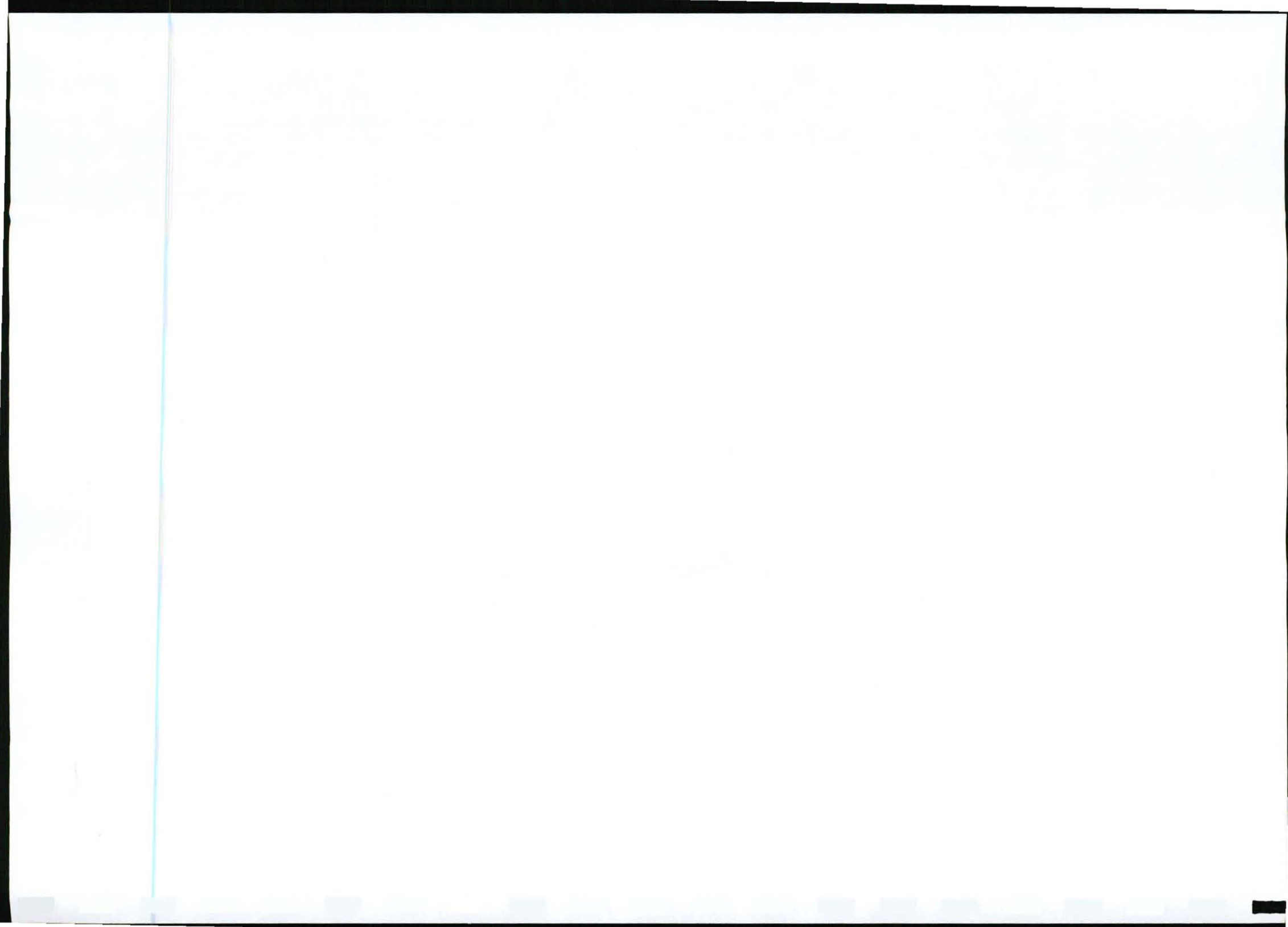

9.1.3 Action Plan

An action plan for the implementation of the various mitigation measures of the EMP is given in Table 10. All potential significant environmental impacts which originate from all the activity associated with the exploration activity will be managed and mitigated by implementing the necessary actions within the said timeframes.

9.1.4 Time Schedule

The proposed exploration activities will be carried out in three phases, each with its own time schedule. This EMP will be implemented during Phase III which consists of the actual core drilling activity. Phase III is anticipated to take place over a 6 to 12 month period of which the actual core drilling activity will form one component, which will last for approximately 6 months to one year.

Monitoring of the time schedule will form part of the performance assessment to be carried out on a three monthly bases or as determined based on the actual timeframe of the drilling activity.

9.2 EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

9.2.1 Spills

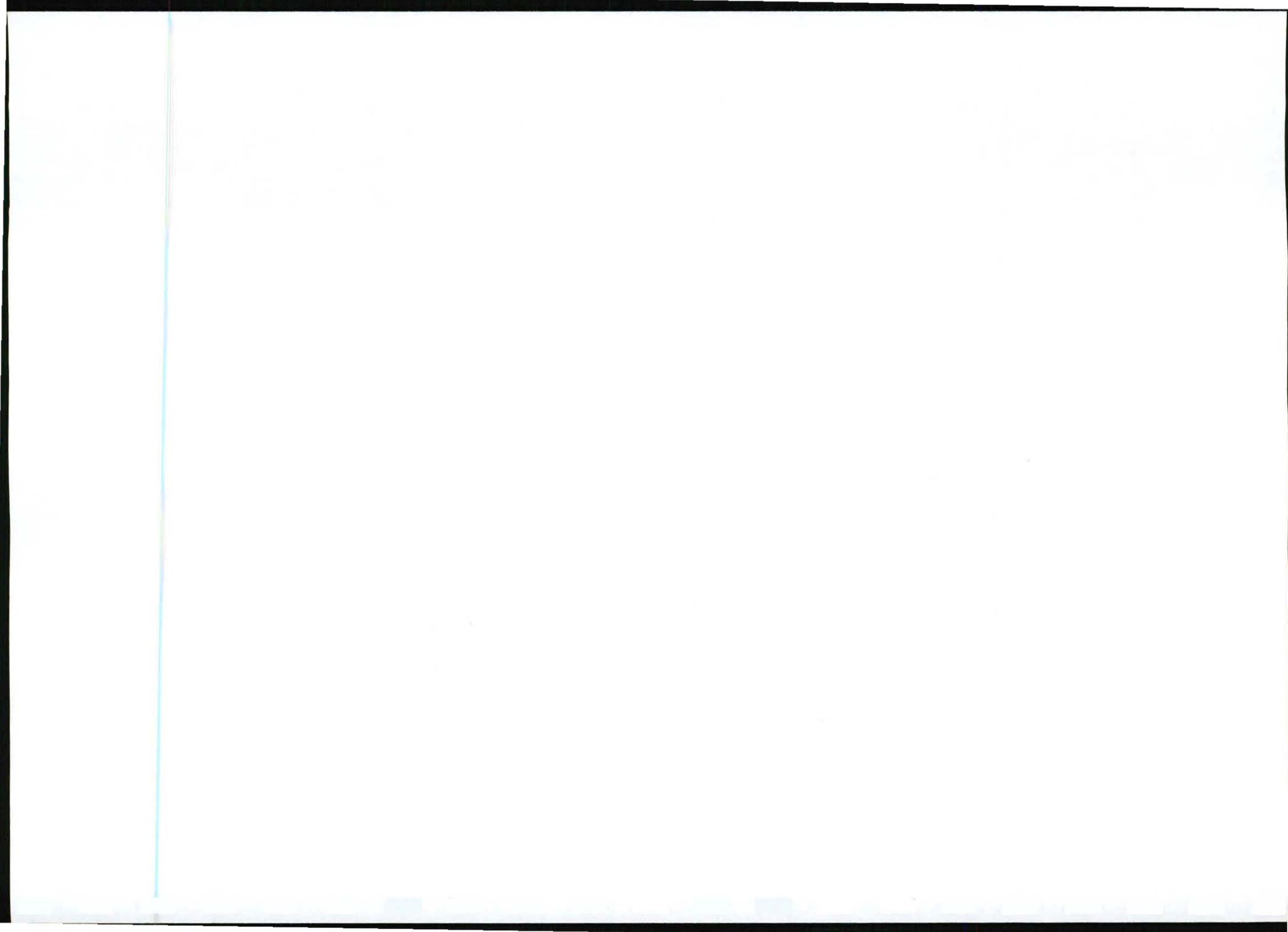
All necessary measures should be taken to prevent spills of occur on site. However, should a spill occur, the following procedure should be followed:

- Immediate action must be taken to contain the spill. In the event of a significant spill (>35 litres) of any hazardous substance, the Applicant, DWAF and the local/provincial authority should be notified if necessary.
- Depending on the nature of the spill, the contaminated soil should either be excavated or treated on-site.
- Excavation of contaminated soils should be undertaken with appropriate equipment. The soil should be stored in an appropriate container until such time as it can be treated or disposed of at an appropriated disposal facility.
- The site manager should determine the exact method of treatment in consultation with a suitably qualified specialist. Treatment could include the use of absorbent materials or hydrocarbon-digesting substances. It is therefore recommended that a spill kit and hydrocarbon digesting substance should be kept on site at all times.
- Material use for the remediation of the spills must be according to the product specifications and guidelines for use.
- A record must be kept of all spills and corrective measures taken.

9.2.2 Fire

The contractor must take all reasonable measures to ensure that fires are not started as a result of operational activities on site, and shall also ensure that their operations comply with the Occupational Health and Safety Act (Act No. 85 of 1993). The following measures will be taken to reduce the risk of fires:

- No open fires are permitted on site.



- Every possible precaution shall therefore be taken when working with potential flammable equipment or liquids near potential sources of combustion. Such precautions include having an approved fire extinguisher immediately available at the site of any such activities.
- The contractor shall ensure that there is basic fire fighting equipment available on site at all times. The contractor shall appoint a member of his staff to be responsible for the installation and inspection of this equipment.
- The contractor is to ensure that he/she has the contact details of the nearest fire station in case of an emergency.

9.3 MONITORING AND PERFORMANCE ASSESSMENT

In accordance with Regulation 55 of the MPRDA (Act 28 of 2002) monitoring of the EMP should be conducted on a continuous basis. It is proposed that due to the short duration of the exploration activity that monitoring be undertaken by the contractor on a daily basis in the form of a checklist and the compiling a weekly report based on the findings of the daily checklist. Records should be kept of all monitoring that was undertaken and any non-compliance should be reported to the Applicant. The contractor should undertake a three month performance assessment of the EMP, of which the findings should be reported to Petroleum Agency South Africa (PASA).

9.4 ENVIRONMENTAL AWARENESS PROGRAMME

The aim of an environmental awareness programme is to create awareness between the employees of the implications which certain actions might have on the environment. The awareness programme should be implemented before any activity is commenced, and all staff should be made aware of the requirement of the EMPR and EMP.

The environmental awareness programme can be carried out by:

- Incorporating it as part of the induction process;
- Educating the staff on relevant aspects of the EMPR relating to the correct management and undertaking of their specific jobs;
- Weekly toolbox talks during which certain environmental topics are discussed;
- On the job training of the potential impacts that certain of the activities might have; and
- Training in executing emergency procedures in the event of spills or fires.

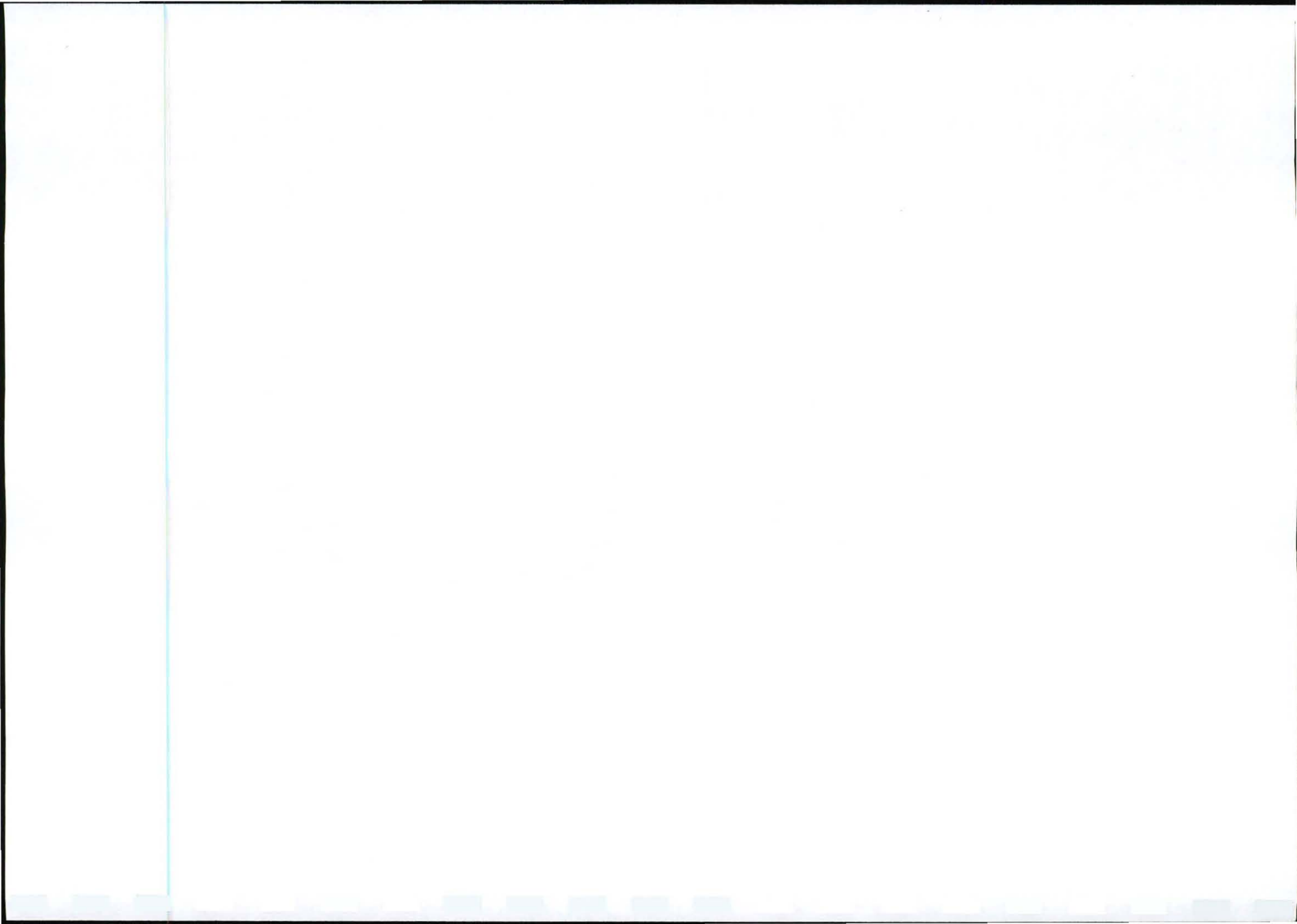
A copy of the EMP should be kept on site and records should be kept of the environmental awareness undertaken.

10 FINANCIAL PROVISION

According to Section 89 of the MPRDA (Act 28 of 2002), *“no exploration or production operation may commence unless the holder of the right concerned has provided financial provision acceptable to the designated agency guaranteeing the availability of sufficient funds for the due fulfilment of all exploration and production work programme by the holder.”*

10.1 METHOD AND QUANTUM OF FINANCIAL PROVISION

Financial provision for premature closure or final closure shall be made by means of a bank guarantee from an approved financial institution. The quantum of financial provision has been



calculated by the Applicant and must ensure the availability of sufficient funds to be able to carry out the exploration activities (including rehabilitation) in accordance with the requirements of this EMPR.

The estimated amount proposed by the Applicant for pre-mature or final closure has been estimated to a total amount of R29 000.00 per drilling site. It is understood that the PASA will review and adjust this amount, if necessary, following review of this EMPR.

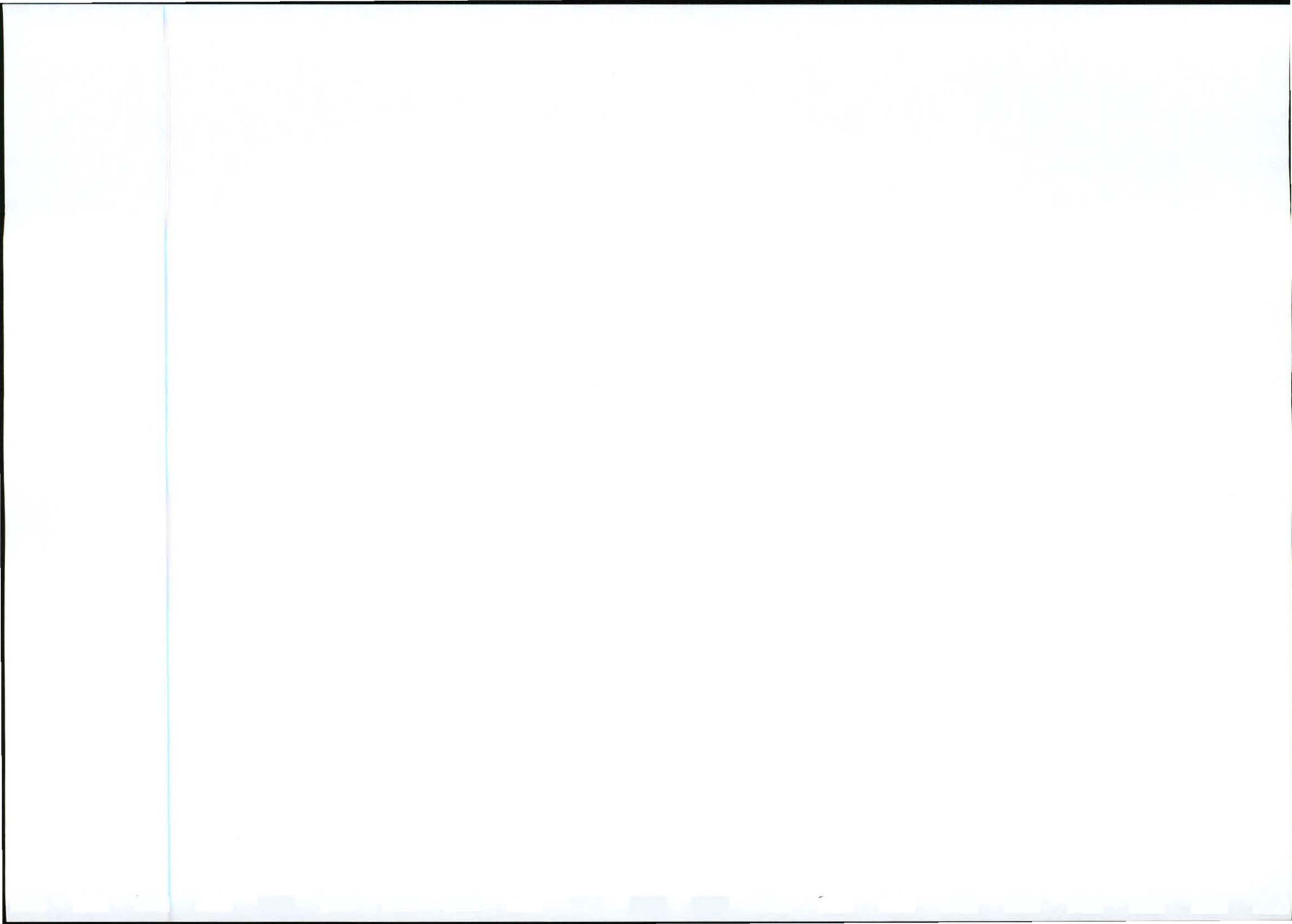

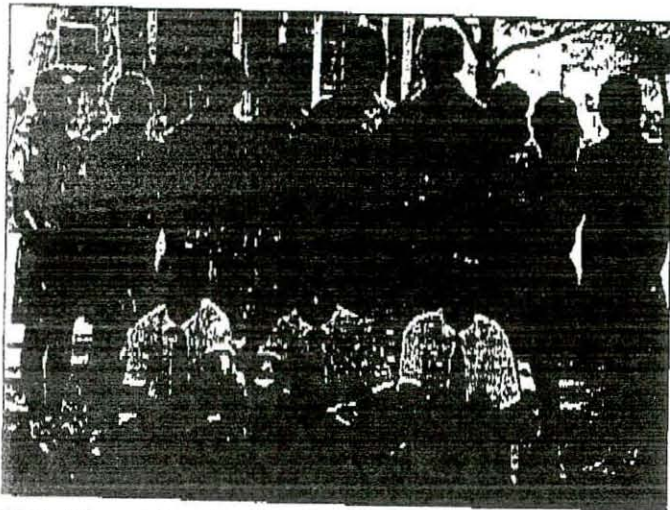

GRAAFF-REINET — The entrance to Tjokville in Umanzake, Graaff-Reinet, is often a vehicular nightmare. When driving along the beginning of Embekweni Street (near a concern that bears the name 'Tutu's Bakery'), this tarred road is often riddled with obstacles and potholes. The actual situation and cause of this predicament is as follows:
 ■ water is flooding this street on a regular basis, which is an open invitation to the kids in the surrounds to through stones, etc in the water and to play there, irrespective of traffic on this road.
 ■ the stagnant water and vehicles driving over the stones, etc, weaken the tarred street and potholes occur.
 Whenever it rains and when the reservoir in Umanzake overflows, this section of Embekweni Street, is under water. The water from the reservoir is a regular occurrence, as a deep gully already exists in the area, carrying this water across the

street. Once the potholes become large enough to attract someone's attention, the street receives attention and then it's a waiting game until the cycle repeats itself. The Advertiser made mention of this issue to two senior officials of the Camdeboo Municipality and suggested that a drainage pipe should be placed in such a manner that the water can be channeled under the street - it was said that a firm must first be fitted in to request this action. It is obvious from this situation and numerous other issues, that inspections in the various suburbs of the community are not being done and that the repairs taking place seem to be of a 'stopgap' nature. Over and above the costs involved, the possible damage to vehicles, the danger to kids and the needless wasting of time, water - a scarce commodity in Graaff-Reinet is also being flushed down the (non-existent) drain.
