I have no objections to the propeller being removed. Will it then be sold for scrap or will it go to a museum? What are the plans for stabilizing it if it is to be displayed?

We could issue the non-intrusive survey permit and say that it is not the current policy of SAHRA to issue permits for the removal of shipwreck items for commercial sale. SAHRA will have to either join the divers regularly to check on their operations and/or have someone there to report to SAHRA. However, a permit for removal could be considered if (a) the survey can show convincingly that the conservation status of the items is being compromised by remaining under water; (b) a professional maritime archaeologist is part of the team; (c) funds will be sourced by the permit holder for the stabilization of all items; (d) the items will not be sold for commercial purposes; and (e) a museum with the requisite storage and/or display facilities is willing to curate the material in perpetuity.

I had the privilege to read about the agrounding of the SS Haleric steamship that occurred in 1932/3 near Paternoster Point on the West Coast, Western Cape. It is alleged that the wreckage of the steamship resulted in the construction of the Cape Columbine lighthouse which is still standing today as one of the first lighthouses along the South African coastline to receive three navigational safety devices, namely a foghorn, a radio beacon and a lens designed for use with incandescent light-bulbs. The lighthouse and the information relating to the SS Haleric is part of the Turtle SA Tours.
