1. Introduction

Ulibo Resources (Pty) Ltd has lodged the application for the mining permit for **Limestone, Iron Ore, Diamnds, Calcite and Dolomite** in respect of the farm **Derby No.195**, Magisterial district of Danielskuil Northern Cape Province

Aim of the consultation

The primary aim of the consultation process is to:

- Inform the land owner and I&AP about the Company's application for the prospecting right to the DMR;
- Inform the land owner and I&AP about the Company's proposed prospecting operations;
- Gather issues and concerns regarding the proposed prospecting operations.

A. Definitions

'community'- means a group of historically disadvantaged person with interest or rights in a particular area of land on which the members have or exercise communal rights in terms of an agreement, customs or law: Provided that, where as a consequence of the provision of the Act negotiations or consultations with the community are required, the community shall include the members or part of the community, directly affected by prospecting or mining, on land occupied by such members or part of the community.

- (iii) Traditional Authority,
- (iv) Land Claimants,
- (v) Lawful land occupier,

- (vii) Any other Person (including on adjacent and non-adjacent properties) whose socio-economic conditions may be directly affected by the proposed prospecting or mining operation,
- (viii) The local Municipality,
- (ix) The relevant Government Department, agencies and institutions responsible for the various aspects of the environment and for infrastructure which may be affected by the proposed project.

1 INTRODUCTION

This Consultation Report has been compiled for an application for a Prospecting Right that has been submitted in terms of Section 16 of the Mineral and Petroleum Resources Development Act (Act No.28 of 2004) (MRPDA).

Mayor meets with communities of Battlemount and Lothakane

The Joe Morolong local municipality mayor, Councillor Dineo Leutwese-Tshabalala, the speaker Councillor Violet Jordan, the executive committee members, senior officials, traditional and religious leaders of Battlemount and Lothakane villages respectively and as part of the municipality, reviewed the IDP and Budget consultation meetings for 2022/23.

It was on this platform that the community equally raised concerns related to service delivery challenges - mainly, water, internal roads, electricity, livestock camps, animal theft, clinics, learner transport, housing and unemployment, amongst related matters.

Following the engagements with the community, the mayor addressed the gathering and committed to work with all relevant stakeholders to address the community's concerns, including organising a door-to-door campaign for all sector departments to identify community members who seek assistance and necessary intervention.

While the communities appreciated the visit, the challenges raised by them overshadowed the intended visit by the stakeholders. The Joe Morolong local municipality

constituency is vast and needs the co-operation of different private-public partnerships to ensure that its socio-economic challenges remain within the fringes of satisfactory service delivery. The municipality alone will only keep chasing its own shadow and that keeps it on the blame side of the community.

The communications officer of the municipality, Ms Lerato Kunou, said that the mayor was bold enough to say that the municipality alone cannot meet the challenges as a single entity, because resources are a limiting factor. She also emphasised the fact that the mayor keeps knocking on doors everywhere to harness and overcome the many challenges faced by the communities.

The reviewed IDP and Budget consultation meetings are held in terms of the Local Government Municipal Systems Act 32 of 2000. It is also an exercise that seeks to highlight the level of transparency between local authorities and their communities. It further cements community ownership of the programmes that the municipality is likely to implement, driven by community interests and participation.

Significant increase in National Minimum Wage

The new National Minimum Wage for South Africa was published in the Government Gazette on 21 February 2023 as promulgated by the Minister of the Department of Employment and Labour, Mr Thulas Nxesi.

The minimum wage will be hiked by 9.62% for the year, taking the current rate from R23.19 up to R25.42 (up by R2.23). Farm workers will earn a minimum in line with the rate, as will domestic workers. However, workers employed in expanded public works programmes are entitled to a lower rate at R13.97 per hour.

The new minimum wage means that domestic workers in South Africa should see a 9.6% pay hike. Calculated at 8 hours a day, the monthly wage for domestic workers (160 hours a month) should increase from around R3700 to R4100 - an increase of R400. According to the department, however, most jobs earning the minimum wage will see their wages increase to R1144 a week (45 hours), or R4957 a month (195 hours).

The minimum wage increase came in higher than initially expected. When the department started consultations on the increase, it was planning for a hike of around 8%, slightly ahead of the Consumer Price Index (CPI), which has been sitting above 7% for the past few months, only dropping to 6.9% in January. The CPI is expected to average between 5% and 6% in 2023.

ving toward the South African Reserve Bank's 3% to 6% range, food prices in the country are going in the opposite direction, remaining stubbornly high. According to the latest inflation data from Stats SA, the annual food inflation rate climbed to 13.4% in January, the highest reading since April 2009 when the rate was 13.6%.

Of all the product groups in the CPI basket, bread and cereals recorded the highest rate in January (21.8%). This was up from 20.6% in December and is the highest reading for this category since February 2009 (23.8%). Bread and cereal products that recorded notable monthly increases in January include pastry products (pizzas and pies), which increased by 3.6%, maize up 3.1% and brown bread up 1.3%.

Meat inflation increased to 11.2% in January from December's 9.7%. Individually quick frozen (IQF) chicken portions, the highest-weighted meat product, witnessed a monthly price increase of 2.7% between December and January. All these staples are far higher than the minimum wage hike.

Electricity prices are another major sticking point, with energy regulator Nersa having approved an 18.65% hike in electricity tariffs for Eskom direct customers from 01 April 2023 and even higher hikes expected from municipalities from 01 July 2023. *BusinessTech*

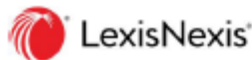
