Mayor meets with communities of **Battlemount and Lotlhakane**

he Joe Morolong local municipality mayor, Councillor Dineo Leutlwetse-Tshabalala, the speaker Councillor Violet Jordan, the executive committee members, senior officials, traditional and religious leaders of Battlemount and Lothakane villages respectively and as part of the municipality, reviewed the IDP and Budget consultation meetings for 2022/23.
