REQUEST FOR AN ADDITIONAL INFORMATION IN TERMS OF SECTION 39 (5) OF THE MINERAL AND PETROLEUM RESOURCES DEVELOPMENT ACT, 2002 (ACT 28 OF 2002) REGARDING THE ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT PLAN (EMP) FOR MINING PERMIT IN RESPECT OF SAND AND GRAVEL ON CERTAIN PIECE OF PORTION 1 OF THE FARM VOLGELSTRUIS BUIT 104, SITUATED IN THE MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT OF UPINGTON BY PRIESKA

1. Your EMP submitted to this office regarding the above application refers.
2. This letter serves to inform you that your EMP has been reviewed and your proposed financial provision quantum to the amount of **R20 000** for rehabilitation and/or management of negative environmental impacts is not accepted. The amount that this office has arrived at is **R 24 322** according to the current master rate as approved in the guideline for financial provision quantum determination

- 3.1. Make available financial provision to the amount of **R 24 322** either in the form of **cash deposit into DME Rehabilitation Trust account, account no.4067034181 (ABSA) or bank guarantees from any registered South African bank.**

- 3.3. You are required to submit the results of public participation process in terms of Regulation 52 (2) (g) of Act 28 of 2002 (MPRDA). Notwithstanding the geographical location (i.e. in relation to town and communities/farmlands) and ownership of the area applied for, please note that as part of the results of public participation the following details must be indicated:
 - Date of public meetings
 - Minutes of the meetings
 - Views and concerns of the interested and affected parties, etc.



Also note that you may employ different methods to inform interested and affected parties about the public participation such as newspaper advert, notification letter, public notice, etc. However these methods shall not be viewed as results of public participation rather as means of notifying different parties.

- 3.4. Indicate the types and number of equipment to be used and rehabilitation thereof.

- 3.5. Conduct Phase 1 of Heritage Impact Assessment to determine if there are any archaeological and/or Palaeontological sites that may be impacted upon by the proposed mining activities as required by National Heritage Resource Act (NHRA No.25 of 1999) and submit the report.

4. Kindly note that failure to abide by the above may jeopardize your application.
