Operation

1.27 Fourteen (14) days prior written notice must be given to the Department that the activity will commence with the operation.

Specific conditions

- 1.28 An integrated waste management approach that is based on waste minimisation must be implemented and must incorporate reduction, recycling, re-use and disposal where appropriate. Any solid waste shall be disposed of at a landfill licensed in terms of section 20 (b) of the National Environment Management Waste Act, 2008 (Act No. 59 of 2008) as amended.
- 1.29 If the fossil remain or trace fossils are discovered during construction, either on the surface or exposed by excavations the independent ECO in charge must be informed and must report to SAHRA so that mitigations can be carried out by a palaeontologist.
- 1.30 General waste as well as excess building rubble must be taken to town and be disposed of at the registered Brandfort Municipal waste site.
- 1.31 Manure must be used in the farming operations by fertilizing the soils for crop production and not for anything else.
- 1.32 Manure must temporarily stored in a designated area close to the chicken houses.
- 1.33 The chicken mortalities must be taken to the owner and breeder of predators at Voorspoed farm only.
- 1.34 The facility must be inspected on a regular basis and should any diseased chickens be noticed, the local health and safety inspector must be contacted immediately and the chickens must be managed in accordance to the Health inspectors advice.
- 1.35 Feet, head, hearts, livers and stomach contents must be cleaned, packed and also be sold and bones must be dried and crushed as feed.

- 1.36 Effluent must be treated in a septic tank system on site and be utilized for irrigation and a disposal permit must be obtained from the Department of Water and Sanitation (DWS).
- 1.37 Feathers must be buried and left for decomposition.
- 1.38 The proposed development must connect to the existing electricity infrastructure on the farm.

General

- 1.39 A copy of this particular EA must be kept at the property where the activity will be undertaken. The Authorisation must be produced to any authorised official of the Department who requests to see it and must be made available for inspection by any employee or agent of the holder of the Authorisation who works or undertakes work at the property.
- 1.40 Where any of the applicant's contact details change, including the name of the responsible person, the physical or postal address and/or telephonic details, the applicant must notify the Department as soon as the new details become known to the applicant.
- 1.41 The holder of the Authorisation must notify the Department, in writing within 48 (forty eight) hours, if any condition of this Authorisation cannot be or is not adhered to. Any notification in terms of this condition must be accompanied by reasons for the non-compliance.
- 1.42 Non-compliance with a condition of this Authorisation may result in criminal prosecution or other actions provided for in the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 and the regulations.
- 1.43 National government, provincial government, local authorities or committees appointed in terms of the conditions of this Authorisation or any other public authority shall not be held responsible for any damages or losses suffered by the applicant or his successor in title in any instance where operation be temporarily or permanently stopped for reasons of non-compliance by the applicant with the

4. Findings
