# PUBLIC PARTICIPATION PROCESS: WORKING FOR WETLANDS PROGRAMME

**Programme Title:** The Working for Wetland's Programme

**Proposal:** The South African National Biodiversity Institute's (SANBI) Working for Wetlands Programme intends to rehabilitate a number of degraded wetlands within the nine Provinces of South Africa. Wetland rehabilitation involves the construction of a variety of interventions that could include gabion, and concrete structures; as well as soft options such as re-vegetation and/ or alien removal. The number, type, scale and location of each of these interventions within the wetlands would vary according to the nature and magnitude of the problem and the state of the receiving environment.

**Legal Framework:** Authorisations are required under both laws described below:

**A. National Environment Management Act, No. 107 of 1998 (NEMA):** Rehabilitation proposals trigger the requirement for Basic Assessment (BA) in terms of the 2010 Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations pursuant to NEMA. Aurecon South Africa (Pty) Ltd (Aurecon) has been appointed to undertake the BA processes; and separate applications for each of the nine Provinces have been submitted to the Department of Environmental Affairs (DEA) as the competent authority. The Listed Activities that are relevant to each application in terms of the 2010 EIA Regulations are Government Notice Regulations (GN.R) 544: 11 & 18 (Listing Notice 1) and GN.R 546: 12, 13 & 16 (Listing Notice 3).

**NEMA Exemptions:** Furthermore, the intention is to apply for exemption from the following provisions of NEMA:

- GN No. R. 543 10(2)d 'Publish a notice of the Department's decision'. Aurecon applied for exemption from the placement of adverts to notify the public of the DEA's decision and to rather informing only registered Interested & Affected Party's (I&APs) directly.
- GN No. R. 543 16(1) 'Appointment of an Environmental Assessment Practitioner (EAP) to manage applications'. Aurecon applied for exemption from independence as their engineers are undertaking the design work for the interventions.

**B. National Water Act, No. 36 of 1998(NWA):** In terms of Section 39 of the NWA, a General authorisation (GA) has been granted for certain activities that are listed under the Act that usually require a Water Use Licence; as long as these activities are undertaken for wetland rehabilitation and the primary purpose of the rehabilitation is for conservation purposes.

### Top price for war bunker

BRITAIN's defence ministry has sold a disused underground railway station that housed London's anti-aircraft command bunker during the World War 2 Blitz for £53-million (about R947-million).

The Brompton Road station, which fetched more than twice the expected price, will be converted into multimillion-pound apartments.

Developers Spink Property, backed by unnamed investors, bought the station, at which tube trains have not stopped for 80 years. It closed in 1934 for lack of passengers, but gained a new life during the war as headquarters for gunners fighting waves of Hitler's bombers.

It later became headquarters for cadet groups.

The 8534m<sup>2</sup> property, near Harrods, was put on the market in July as part of defence cost-cutting. Little remains of its role in the Blitz except for a single map of anti-aircraft defences. The map cannot be removed, but will be photographed for the National Archives.

Defence Minister Andrew Murrison said: "The ministry is committed to selling off surplus defence land and property to provide the best possible value for money to the taxpayer."

### Lots of big plans but where are the skills?

As that economic wizard, Jacob Zuma, guided by his presidential infrastructure coordination commission, gabbles on about spending trillions of our tax rands on vast projects in the years ahead, he begs the question: Where are the skills needed to bring these projects to fruition efficiently, timeously and within budget?

We simply do not have them. This is nowhere better demonstrated than in the Eskom shambles. As Jasson Urbach of the Free Market Foundation pointed out last year: "In August, Eskom announced that Medupi would cost a maximum of R105-billion, excluding interest during construction. [This interest] is conservatively estimated at R30-billion... [increasing] the price of Medupi to R135-billion."

Urbach added that this "excludes the cost of the required flue gas desulphurisation plant... yet another R10-billion to R15-billion". So Medupi is likely to cost between R145-billion and R150-billion, about three times more than Eskom's 2007 estimate of R52-billion.

At best, Medupi's first unit will come on line only in the second half of this year. That is a mere 54 months behind schedule, at three times the price. Meanwhile, Kusile struggles on, burning through tax billions, as, unbelievably, Eskom plans a third coal-powered station. Talk about pollution.

Nowhere in successful economies, as Urbach said, is the state power producer both player and referee in the market, protected from competition — that wonderful cold shower for the incompetent. Here, of course, we are talking about amounts in the R52-billion range (R150-billion after the ANC's tender ministrations and its 25% stake in Hitachi), rather than the trillions our dancing giggler promises. Just what makes him believe the government is capable of ever achieving targets or meeting deadlines is a mystery. Consider the disasters of South African Airways and the SABC. The man defies the evidence before his eyes.

Our most fundamental problem is education, in which we lag the world in practically every sphere.

Finance Minister Pravin Gordhan advised us in his budget this week that we have spent R15-billion on higher education in the past five years, including R18.6-billion on the National Student Financial Aid Scheme. He will give the scheme R19.4-billion in the next three years, assisting 500 000 students a year.

Well, we better do something. Only miserable, battle-scarred little Yemen is worse than us in world rankings of mathematics skills.

Loane Sharpe of Adcorp estimates that there are about 470 000 vacancies in the private sector that could be filled immediately if the skills were available. Broad-based unemployment, including the discouraged, is 37%. And of those people younger than 35, 69% are unemployed. On the other hand, the unemployment rate for high-skilled individuals is 0.4%.

Among our youth, we have the third-highest unemployment rate — more than 50% — in the world, according to the World Economic Forum. It ranks us 143 out of 144 for the quality of our maths and science education and 140 for the quality of

our education system, and primary education comes in at 132.

Most of our higher-education students opt for soft disciplines such as the arts, humanities and social science, whereas, Sharpe points out, employers seek managers and high-level professional graduates such as accountants, lawyers, doctors and engineers.

Last year, 56% of doctor posts were vacant (14 851) and 46% (44 780) of nursing jobs were unfilled. And you should try, as I did recently, to see a specialist: someone can wait six months. I was fortunate to secure an appointment on April 7. Provided, of course, that I am still around.

Our leaders have seen fit to make it increasingly difficult for skilled foreigners to seek work in South Africa. They now wait more than five years for work permits as largely unskilled migrants cross our porous borders daily, bringing with them competition at the lower scale of jobs and, frequently, habits of crime bred in poverty.

## Blow whistle on border post bribery

### Dear Corruption Watch

I run a small business that requires some of my employees to drive through border crossings. They are often asked for bribes, but I tell them it is wrong and we should not pay. Last week, late on a Friday, one of my employees called to say he was being threatened with jail if he did not pay. The safety of my employees is paramount, but so is an ethical business. How are we meant to balance these risks? — Courier

### Dear Courier,

You are faced with a dilemma that is sadly all too familiar. The safety of your employees is paramount, but, if there is to be an end to the corrupt practices at the borders, travellers must take a firm stance and blow the whistle repeatedly. Remember that all services offered by government officials at border posts are supposed to be free of charge.

number of reports about corrupt border guards, and the allegations range from bribes to officials who flout regulations, abuse their power and exploit members of the public.

South Africa has more than 60 border posts, shared with Lesotho, Swaziland, Mozambique, Zimbabwe, Botswana and Namibia.

Services at these posts range from security to immigration and customs and excise.

Various government departments staff the borders, including the army, police, SARS, Department of Home Affairs and Department of Public Works.

A border control operational co-ordinating committee is responsible for coordinating the activities of the

various departments and also for preventing, detecting, investigating and prosecuting cases of corruption at the borders.

The committee has designated anti-corruption coordinators in each province and for each port of entry.

When your employees are confronted with bribery and corruption at the border posts, they must make an effort to obtain the names of the guilty officials and report the incidents.

They can report incidents to Corruption Watch on 0800 023 456, or by filing an online complaint at corruptionwatch.org.za.

The incidents should also be reported to the police, the government department in which the guilty bor-

der guard or official is employed and the committee coordinator responsible for that port of entry.

To give you and your employees some encouragement, we remind you

that in May last year the Free State Hawks and the SAPS arrested nine police officers and six home affairs officials stationed at the Caledonport border post with Lesotho for corruption.

That followed a police surveillance operation that was initiated after members of the public blew the whistle on the corrupt activities at the border post.

Here are some practical tips for your employees and other travellers to avoid becoming a target of bribery at the border:

- Do not give your passport to all those "officials" flashing badges outside border control;
● Do not pay any money to anyone saying they are there to "help" you; and
● Have a letter from your motor insurance that the car is covered while outside the country.

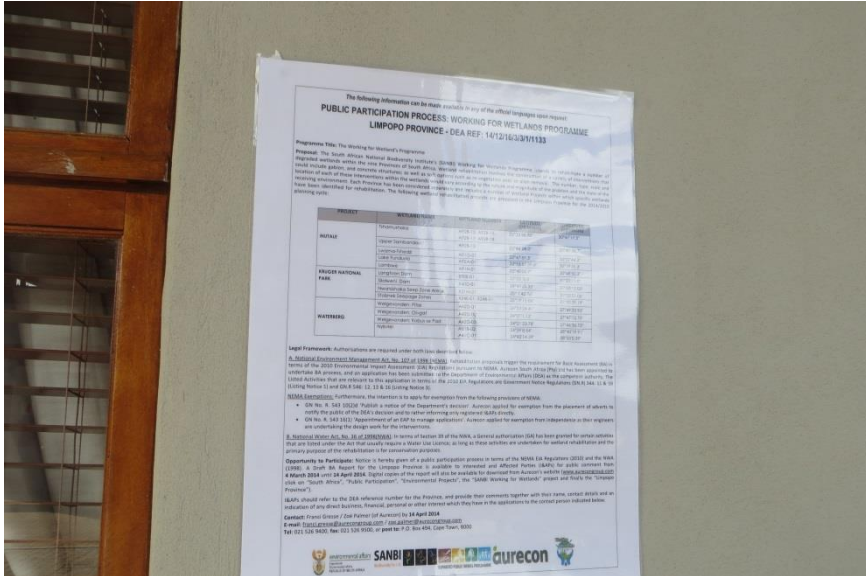

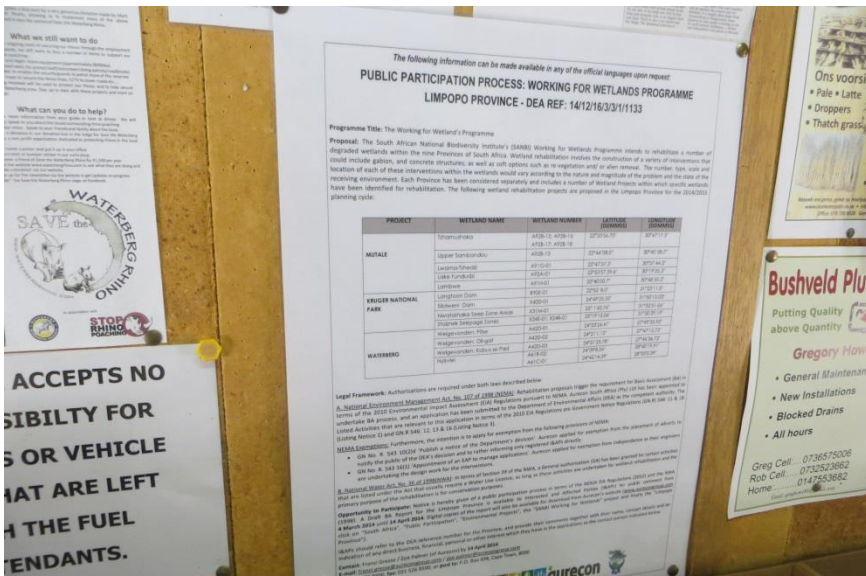

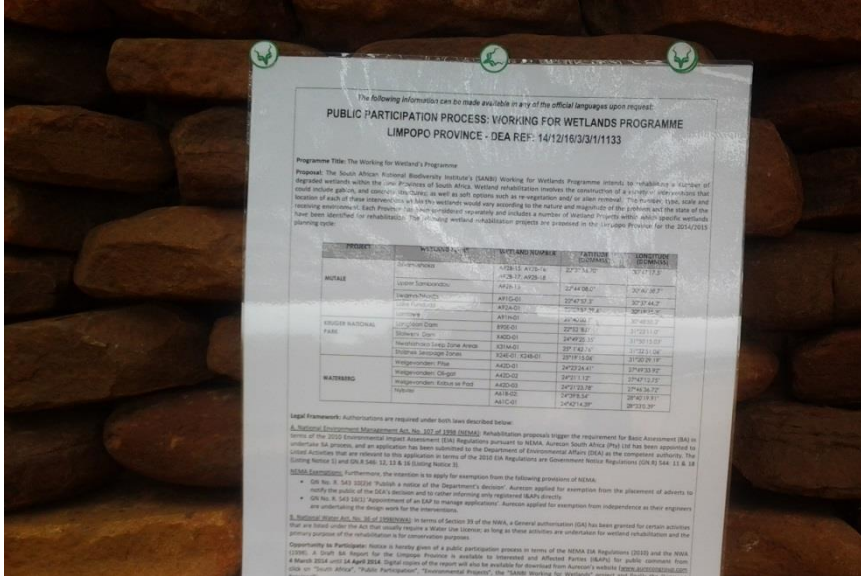

We would also like to notify you of your opportunity to comment on the proposed wetlands in which rehabilitation is proposed in terms of Regulations pursuant to the National Environmental Management Act, No. 107 of 1998 (as amended) (NEMA).

#### **1. BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

Working for Wetlands (WfWetlands) is a government programme managed by SANBI, and is a joint initiative of the Departments of Environmental Affairs (DEA), Water Affairs (DWA) and Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries. The programme is mandated to rehabilitate damaged wetlands and to protect pristine wetlands throughout South Africa. Emphasis is placed on complying with the principles of the Expanded Public Works Programme which seeks to draw significant numbers of unemployed people into the productive sector of the economy, gaining skills while they work and increasing their ability to earn an income.

Aurecon South Africa (Pty) Ltd (Aurecon) has been appointed to undertake the project activities and associated reporting required by the WfWetlands Programme. The Aurecon team comprises Design Engineers and Environmental Assessment Practitioners (EAPs) who undertake the planning, design and authorisation components of the project. The Aurecon Team is assisted by an external team of Wetland Ecologists who provide scientific insight into the operation of wetlands and bring expert and often local knowledge of the wetlands. The project team is also complimented by the SANBI Provincial Coordinators (PCs) who are each responsible for provincial planning and implementation.

## **2. THE NATIONAL ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT ACT, NO. 107 OF 1998 (NEMA)**

### **2.1 Basic Assessment**

In terms of the environmental management principles of NEMA certain activities that may have a detrimental impact on the environment (termed Listed Activities) require Environmental Authorisation (EA) from DEA. Many activities associated with the rehabilitation of wetlands are Listed Activities in terms of GN.R544 Listing Notice 1 and GN.R546 Listing Notice 3 of NEMA:

- 11 and 18 of Listing Notice 1 in GN.R. 544, 2010; and
- 13 and 16 of Listing Notice 3 in GN.R. 546, 2010.

The requisite procedures for applying for an EA require that the Basic Assessment Process be undertaken where the biophysical and socio-economic impacts are identified and assessed. The process of Basic Assessment has been undertaken on behalf of SANBI by Aurecon (independent Environmental Assessment Practitioners), and separate Basic Assessment applications for each province have been submitted to DEA.

The Basic Assessment Reports (BARs) provide the findings of the associated investigations, and draft versions of these have been prepared and are available for public comment. The Draft BARs also include a description of all of the Wetland Projects that are proposed in each province, together with baseline information regarding the quaternary catchments and the wetland units that have been prioritised for the next planning cycle (2014/15). An EA is sought for each province, and if EA's are granted then they will permit the commencement of Listed Activities in the proposed Wetland Project areas.

A condition of the EA's will be that annual Rehabilitation Plans be submitted to DEA for approval after sufficient annual field work has been undertaken for each of the authorised Wetland Projects. These Rehabilitation Plans will include specialist reports prepared by the Wetland Ecologists (which provide a site description, detailed baseline information, and the wetland context within the greater catchment). The Rehabilitation Plans will also include the proposed interventions, their design details and specifications, and proposed locations. Opportunity will be provided at a later stage for registered I&APs (including landowners and State Departments) to comment on the annual Rehabilitation Plans.

### **2.2 Exemptions**

SANBI has applied for two exemptions from the mandatory requirements of Basic Assessment. Firstly an exemption from NEMA GN R.543 16(1) 'Appointment of an EAP to manage applications' has been sought in order to address the involvement of both the Aurecon Design Engineers and the Aurecon EAPs in different phases of the same project as it may be deemed to be "circumstances that may compromise the objectivity of the EAP" (Definition of Independence: GN R.543). Since Exemption from "Independence" is not permitted, SANBI has requested an Exemption from appointing an EAP.

Secondly exemption has been sought from NEMA GN R.543 10 (2)(d) 'Publish a notice of the Department's decision'. Given the rural nature of the locations, it is anticipated that the general interest in the project will be limited to immediate and adjacent landowners / businesses, stakeholders, environmental watchdogs and authorities, all of whom will be notified directly of the Department's decision.

Please note that an integrated Public Participation Process (PPP) to simultaneously notify Interested and Affected Parties (I&APs) of the Basic Assessment and the exemption applications will be undertaken.

### 3. THE NATIONAL WATER ACT, NO. 36 OF 1998 (NWA)

Activities associated with rehabilitation of wetlands may constitute "water uses" in terms of the NWA, and may therefore require authorisations or licenses from DWA. In general, a water use must be licensed unless: a) it is listed in Schedule I of the NWA, b) is an existing lawful use, c) is permissible under a General Authorisation (GA), or if a responsible authority waives the need for a licence. GN. R. 1198 of 18 December 2009 introduced a GA for activities undertaken for the rehabilitation of wetlands for conservation purposes. Applications for a GA will be submitted to DWA simultaneously with the other authorisations required for this work.

### 4. OPORTUNITY TO PARTICIPATE

Public participation procedures are specified as a minimum requirement of Basic Assessment and must ensure that all I&APs (including State Departments) have an opportunity to participate in the process. The requisite Public Participation Process (PPP) in terms of NEMA has commenced, and to date has included the publication of national advertisements in the *Sunday Times* and *Die Rapport* on 2 March 2014 and the placement of site notices. The Draft BARs for each of the nine provinces will be made available for a **40 day** comment period from **Tuesday 4 March 2014 to Monday 14 April 2014** (please note that the Draft Rehabilitation Plans will be made available for comment at a later stage if EAs are obtained for the Wetland Projects in question). The Draft BARs are also available for download from the Aurecon website: <http://www.aurecongroup.com> (please indicate "Current Location" as "South Africa" and click on the "Public Participation" link, then "Environmental Projects" and then "SANBI Working for Wetlands" project).

In terms of regulations pursuant to NEMA, DEA will also contact any State Department that administers a law relating to a matter affecting the environment relevant to an application for EA. The State Department must submit comments within 40 days from the date on which DEA requests such comment. We anticipate this request to be made by 4 March 2014.

I&APs have until **14 April 2014** to submit their comments on the Draft BARs to the contact person below. I&APs should refer to the relevant DEA reference numbers for the relevant province as provided above. They must include their name, contact details and an indication of any direct business, financial, personal or other interest which they have in the applications in their submission.

### 5. WAY FORWARD

Following the 40 day public comment period, the Draft BAR will be updated by incorporating any I&AP comments received on the reports. The updated Final BARs will then be submitted to DEA for their decision. Registered I&APs will simultaneously be afforded a further **21 days** to provide comment on the Final BAR. Any further comments received after the 21 day comment period will be collated by Aurecon and submitted to DEA directly.

Once DEA have made their decision on the proposed project, all registered I&APs on the project database will be notified of the outcome of the decision within twelve (12) calendar days of the date of the decision. Should anyone (a member of public, registered I&AP or the Applicant) wish to appeal DEA's decision, a Notice of Intention to Appeal must be lodged with the Minister within twenty (20) calendar days of the date of the decision. If appeals are not received, then the Annual Rehabilitation Plans will be prepared for each authorised Wetland Project, circulated for comment to registered I&APs,

and submitted to DEA for approval. Interventions detailed in the 2014 Rehabilitation Plans will be carried out from April 2014 until March 2015.
