burials (305), the built environment and landscape (307) or the registration of private collections (402). Applicants are advised that without full details no permit may be issued.

# C. PURPOSE OF APPLICATION

12. Purpose of and reasons for application\*

The previously unknown site was accidentally disturbed during the excavation of a short services pipeline required for the Official Residence of the Governor of the Reserve Bank located at 134 Eastwood Street, Pretoria. It forms part of alterations undertaken on the Official Residence of the Governor of the Reserve Bank. Permission to undertake modification on the dwelling was obtained from the Provincial Heritage Resources Agency – Gauteng. When the historic artefacts were uncovered all development in that area were halted and an archaeologist was brought to the site for an assessment. The archaeologist indicated that excavations need to be undertaken. PGS Heritage & Grave Relocation Consultants was subsequently commissioned to undertake the necessary mitigation measures on the site aimed at obtaining a destruction permit.

The following mitigation measures were proposed:

- Rescue excavation permit application to the South African Heritage Resources Agency to allow archaeological excavation to take place on the rubbish dump.
- Once the permit is obtained, test excavation can be undertaken. Once completed the site can be destroyed.
- Analysis and interpretation of excavated artefacts
- Writing of an archaeological excavation report.
- Submission of the report to the South African Heritage Resources Agency.

After receipts of the archaeological excavation permit (SAHRA Permit No. 80/11/12/001/51) the archaeological excavations were undertaken between 12 and 14 December 2012 by PGS. The excavated material (with the exception of metal artefacts which will be included in the final report) was analysed, recorded and photographed and a draft archaeological report compiled by PGS to fulfil the requirements of applying for a destruction permit from SAHRA. The report was submitted to Ms. Colette Scheermeyer of SAHRA Head Office on Monday, 4 June 2012, and acknowledgement of receipt of report was received on Friday, 8 June 2012.

The site comprises a small historic rubbish dump located on the grounds of the Reserve Bank Governor's Residence, Eastwood, Pretoria. The previously unknown site was accidentally exposed during excavations undertaken to install a short services pipeline required for the house. The visible presence of the rubbish dump in the excavated pipeline trench extends over a distance of roughly five meters. Material that was accidentally excavated include a metal kettle, a glass fragment from a South African Breweries beer bottle typical of the late 19<sup>th</sup> century to early 20<sup>th</sup> century, one eating plate fragment of lined ware typical of the late 19<sup>th</sup> century as well as numerous other artefacts typically associated with the Colonial Period.




Figure 2 Map Source image of the site located within its wider context.
