## APPLICATION FOR ENVIRONMENTAL AUTHORISATION AND WATER USE LICENSE FOR A PROPOSED PIPELINE FROM TWEEFONTEIN WATER RECLAMATION PLANT TO MBALI COLLIERY, MPUMALANGA PROVINCE

The Mbali Colliery is situated approximately 10 km south of the town Ogies adjacent to the Ogies – Bethal Road in the Mpumalanga Province. The colliery is located on portions 16, 17, 20, 31 and the Remaining Extent (RE) of portion 9 of the farm Klippoortjie 32 IS. The Mbali Mining Right (Reference No. MP 30/5/1/2/2 228 MR) was granted by the Department of Mineral Resources (DMR) in June 2008 and is valid until 25 June 2018. Mbali Coal (Pty) Ltd (Mbali Coal) intends to apply for extension of validity of this mining right in due course. Mbali is experiencing water shortages and requires an additional source of process water.

Mbali Coal intends to apply for Environmental Authorisation (EA) and a Water Use License (WUL) for the proposed construction of a water supply pipeline from Tweefontein Water Reclamation Plant at the Goedgevonden Mine (operated by Glencore) to the Mbali Colliery.

Construction of the pipeline in proximity to wetlands and water courses (specifically the Klippoortjiespruit) will require a Water Use License (WUL) in terms of the National Water Act, 1998 (Act No. 36 of 1998) (NWA). Furthermore, the construction of the pipeline is associated with activities identified in the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations, 2014 (as amended) and require a Basic Assessment Process to be followed in applying for Environmental Authorisation in terms of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act No. 107 of 1998) (NEMA) and the EIA Regulations, 2014 (as amended)

The purpose of this document is to provide you, the reader, with information about the proposed activities and to allow you as an Interested & Affected Party (I&AP) to comment on the proposed Project.

#### 1 PROJECT OVERVIEW

Mbali is experiencing water shortages due to regional drought and requires an additional source of process water. The Goedgevonden (GGV) Mine is situated approximately 3.6 km north of Mbali Colliery. Operational management of the Tweefontein Water Reclamation Plant at GGV Mine is contracted to Glencore Operations South Africa (Pty) Ltd (Glencore). Glencore has agreed, in principle, to supply water to Mbali Colliery from the Tweefontein Water Reclamation Plant. To facilitate the water supply, Mbali Coal will have to construct

(and licence) a pipeline for the conveyance of treated water from Tweefontein Water Reclamation Plant to Mbali Colliery.

The design capacity of the pipeline will be 2 Mega-Litres per day (Ml/ day) (2,000 m<sup>3</sup> per

day at around 30 litres per second ( $\ell$ /s). The pipeline diameter will be around 250 mm (0.25 m) and the length is approximately 3.6 km. The proposed pipeline route extends along the existing R545 Road from the Tweefontein Water Reclamation Plant at GGV in a south-easterly direction for approx. 1.6 km. The pipeline route then follows the Mbali access road in a southern direction for approximately 2 km. Along this route, the pipeline crosses the Klippoortjiespruit at an existing bridge, 0.5km south of GGV.




Figure 1: Project Location and Layout

The location of the proposed project is provided in Figure 1.

#### 2 Application Process

Environmental Authorisation (EA) under the NEMA has to be obtained prior to commencing with Activities which are Listed in the NEMA EIA Regulations, 2014 (GN R 982 of 4 December 2014) (as amended).

Activities included in Listing Notice 1 (GN R 983) or Listing Notice 3 (GN R 985) requires that a Basic Assessment Process be followed, while activities listed in GN R 984 require that a Scoping and EIA Process be followed in applying for authorisation.

In terms of the proposed pipeline, Activities identified in Listing Notice 1 and 3 are applicable to the proposed project. Therefore a Basic Assessment Process as described in GN R 982 (as amended) will be undertaken in applying for EA. The following listed activities are being applied for:

- GN R 983 (as amended), Activity 19, involving the moving of more than 10 m³ of material within a watercourse, which may be required for the construction of the pipeline over the Klippoortjiespruit, although the pipeline will be attached to the existing bridge and not trenched through the spruit.
- GN R 985 (as amended), Activity 12, which describes the clearance of more than 300 m² of indigenous vegetation within a threatened ecosystem (The site is located in the Eastern Highveld Grassland (Vulnerable) and the Moist Grasslands Priority Area, and will involve vegetation clearance in a servitude approximately 5 m wide and 3.6 km long.)

Activities identified as water uses in terms of Section 21 of the NWA may not be undertaken without a Water Use Licence (WUL). The following Water Uses are relevant to the proposed Project:

- (a) taking water from a water resource;
- (c) impeding or diverting the flow of water in a watercourse; and
- (i) altering the bed, banks, course or characteristics of a watercourse.

As part of the proposed project a Heritage Resources Management process will be followed in terms of Section 38 of the National Heritage Resources Act, 1999 (Act No. 25 of 1999) NHRA). In addition to the Heritage Study, a Specialist Flora and Wetlands Assessment will be undertaken and appended to the Draft Basic Assessment Report (BAR).

#### 3 Public Participation Process

Stakeholders affected by or who are interested in the project are invited to register as an Interested and Affected Party (I&AP) to participate in the consultation process. The Public Participation Process (PPP) for the Basic Assessment and WULA will be undertaken as an integrated process, in accordance with Regulation 40 and 41 of the NEMA EIA Regulations, 2014 (as amended) and Regulation 17(2) of GN R 267. Activities that are planned to take place as part of the PPP are discussed below.

#### 3.1 Notification

All stakeholders are hereby notified of the proposed project and invited to register as I&APs and provide comments on the proposed project. In addition to this Background Information Document (BID) serving as notification, three site notices have been erected along the proposed pipeline route providing background to the project and application processes. Furthermore, an advertisement will be published in the Witbank News local newspaper to notify potential stakeholders of the project and invite them to register as I&APs. The abovementioned notifications also contain details of Digby Wells Environmental, where further information on the project can be obtained.

#### 3.2 Public Review of Draft Documents

The BAR, Environmental Management Plan (EMP) and WUL Technical Reports will be made available to registered I&APs for a 30 day comment period **23<sup>rd</sup> February 2018 to 26<sup>th</sup> March 2018**, as required in terms of Regulation 40(1)(a) of the EIA Regulations 2014 (as amended). The draft Scoping Report has will be available from the below public spaces.




Figure 2: BAR and WULA Process
