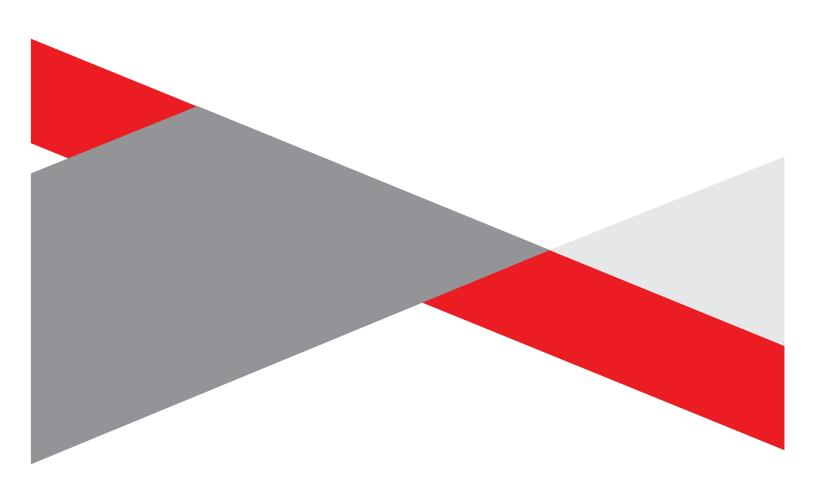

#### **Final Comment**

In terms of Section 38(4), 38(8) of the National Heritage Resources Act (Act 25 of 1999)

The development of a renewable energy facility, overhead powerline and associated infrastructure proposed by FREEGOLD HARMONY (PTY) LTD. The project entails the development of an 18MW solar PV over 36 ha of land and will be known as Harmony Joel Solar PV Facility, the facility will include a grid connection solution and other associated infrastructure. The Solar PV facility is based approximately 2.3km north of the Harmony Joel mining operations, located ~20km NorthEast of the town of Theunissen within the Masilonyana Local Municipality, and within the Lejweleputswa District Municipality, Free State Province.

Freegold Harmony (Pty) Ltd appointed Savannah Environmental (Pty) Ltd undertake the Environmental Authorisation (EA) Application for the proposed development of Harmony Joel Solar PV Facility on Portion 0 of the Farm Leeuwbult 580 near Theunissen in the Masilonyana Local Municipality, Free State Province.

The Scoping Report was submitted in terms of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (NEMA) and the 2017 NEMA Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations. The development footprint is about 220ha and the generating capacity of the PV facility will go up to 18MW. The associated infrastructure for the development includes a grid connection.

CTS Heritage and Prof Marion Bamford were appointed to provide heritage specialist input into the EA process as per section 24(4)b(iii) of NEMA and section 38(8) of the National Heritage Resources Act, Act 25 of 1999 (NHRA) that complies with section 38(3) of the NHRA.

Lavin, J. 2022. Heritage Screener: Proposed development of the Joel PV Facility near Welkom

It is unlikely that significant heritage resources will be impacted by the development, however burial grounds may be present within the development area. The development area is underlain by the Adelaide Subgroup of the Beaufort Group and Quaternary Sands. There is a very small chance that fossils from the Adelaide

Subgroup below the ground surface may be disturbed and it is recommended that a Fossil Chance Find Protocol be implemented during development. It is recommended that a Heritage Impact Assessment which assesses likely impacts to archaeological and palaeontological heritage be undertaken.

Lavin, J. 2022. Heritage Impact Assessment: Proposed development of the 18MWac Harmony Joel Solar PV Facility, Theunissen, Free State Province

Out of context stone artefact scatters (JL1, JL3, JL4) that are of low heritage significance were identified during the site survey. Site JL2 is a concentration of MSA-LSA artefacts that are of grade IIIC significance and site JL5 is a concentrations of artefacts with a grade IIIB significance.

#### Recommendations

- A 30m buffer is recommended to be maintained around site JL2.
- The 50m buffer is recommended to be maintained around site JL5.

Bamford, M. 2022. Desktop Study: Palaeontological Impact Assessment for the proposed development of the Harmony Joel PV Facility, southwest of Virginia, Free State Province

The preferred development site lies on the potentially fossiliferous Adelaide Subgroup (Beaufort Group, Karoo Supergroup) and the moderately sensitive Quaternary sands and alluvium. The area has been disturbed by farming and mining activities and no vertebrate fossils have been reported. No potential traps for Quaternary fossils are visible from the satellite imagery. A Fossil Chance Find Protocol has been attached and it should be added to the EMPr.

SAHRA issued an interim comment dated 07/09/2022 which requested that the Draft EIA document along with its appendices be submitted to the case on SAHRIS. The Draft EIA document was subsequently submitted to the development application on SAHRIS on the 24/03/2023.

## COMMENTS ON THE DRAFT SCOPING REPORT FOR PROPOSED HARMONY JOEL SOLAR PV, FREE STATE PROVINCE.

The Directorate: Biodiversity Conservation reviewed and evaluated the report.

Based on the information provided in the report, the site for the proposed solar development falls within a Critical Biodiversity Area 2 (CBA 2) and Ecological Support Areas 1 & 2 (ESA 1 & 2) as per the Free State Biodiversity Plan. The site is quite heavily transformed with dryland crop cultivation and mining activities. However, there are natural areas that may have elements of conservation concern on site. In addition, the study site is also located adjacent to the H.J Joel Private Nature Reserve which is proposed to be included as part of the protected areas expansion strategy. The site is also situated adjacent to the Doring River and from the survey it was also evident that the vegetation on the site is much more representative of the Highveld Alluvial Vegetation type which is associated with riparian areas.

Considering the above, the development can proceed to the next phase of the EIA process. However, the FSR should consider the following recommendations:

- The detailed Biodiversity Specialist studies must comply with the Procedures for the Assessment and Minimum Criteria for Reporting on Identified Environmental Themes in terms of Sections 24(5)(A) and (H) and 44 of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998.
- Comments must be obtained from Department of Forestry, Fisheries and the Environment
  Directorate: Protected Areas Planning and Management Effectiveness at Email

Your e-mail dated 14 November 2022 regarding above mentioned project hereby refers. Eskom Distribution (Dx) has no objection to the proposed project. Eskom services are affected as per the attached sketch. However, please adhere to Eskom's conditions and treat Eskom's powerlines as live at all times and keep a building restriction of 9 meters on either side of the power line for 11kV lines, 11 meters on either side of the power line for 88kV lines ,18 meters on either side of the power line for 132kV lines

11 kV,88kV ,132kV and 400kV lines are affected

Please find Eskom's conditions which must always be respected when working near or closer to our services:

- 1. Eskom Dx shall at all times retain unobstructed access to and egress from its servitudes.
- 2. Eskom Dx's consent does not relieve the applicant from obtaining the necessary statutory, landowner or municipal approvals.
- 3. The applicant will adhere to all relevant environmental legislation. Any cost incurred by Eskom Dx as a result of non-compliance will be charged to the applicant.
- 4. No drilling shall take place within 11 metres from any Eskom Dx power line structure,
- 5. All work within Eskom Dx's servitude areas shall comply with the relevant Eskom earthing standards in force at the time.

6. If Eskom Dx has to incur any expenditure in order to comply with statutory clearances or other regulations as a result of the applicant's activities or because of the presence of his equipment or installation within the servitude area, the applicant shall pay such costs to Eskom Dx on demand.

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- 7. The use of explosives of any type within 500metres of Eskom Dx's services shall only occur with Eskom Dx's prior written permission. If such permission is granted the applicant must give at least fourteen working days prior notice of the commencement of blasting. This allows time for arrangements to be made for supervision and/or precautionary instructions to be issued in terms of the blasting process. If blasting becomes necessary, application in this regard should be made separately.
- 8. Changes in ground level may not infringe statutory ground to conductor clearances or statutory visibility clearances. After any changes in ground level, the surface shall be rehabilitated and stabilised so as to prevent erosion. The measures taken shall be to Eskom Dx's requirements.
- 9. Eskom Dx shall not be liable for the death of or injury to any person or for the loss of or damage to any property whether as a result of the encroachment or of the use of the servitude area by the applicant, his/her agent, contractors, employees, successors in title, and assigns. The applicant indemnifies Eskom Dx against loss, claims or damages including claims pertaining to consequential damages by third parties and whether as a result of damage to or interruption of or interference with Eskom Dx's services or apparatus or otherwise. Eskom Dx will not be held responsible for damage to the applicant's equipment.
- 10. No mechanical equipment, including mechanical excavators or high lifting machinery, shall be used in the vicinity of Eskom Dx's apparatus and/or services, without prior written permission having been granted by Eskom. If such permission is granted the applicant must give at least seven working days prior notice of the commencement of work. This allows time for arrangements to be made for supervision and/or precautionary instructions to be issued by the relevant Technical Service Centre.
- 11. No work shall commence unless Eskom Dx has received the applicant's written acceptance of the conditions specified in the letter of consent and/or permit.
- 12. Eskom Dx's rights and duties in the servitude shall be accepted as having prior right at all times and shall not be obstructed or interfered with. Note: Where an electrical outage is required, at least fourteen workdays are required to arrange same.
- 13. Under no circumstances shall rubble, earth or other material be dumped within the servitude area. The applicant shall maintain the area concerned to Eskom Dx's satisfaction. The applicant shall be liable to Eskom Dx for the cost of any remedial action which has to be carried out by Eskom Dx.
- 14. The clearances between Eskom Dx's live electrical equipment and the proposed construction work shall be observed as stipulated by *Regulation 15* of the *Electrical Machinery Regulations of the Occupational Health and Safety Act, 1993 (Act 85 of 1993).*

#### 15. Eskom shall be regarded electrically live and therefore dangerous at all times.

- 16. In spite of the restrictions stipulated by Regulation 15 of the Electrical Machinery Regulations of the Occupational Health and Safety Act, 1993 (Act 85 of 1993), as additional safety precaution, Eskom Dx will not approve the erection of houses or structures occupied or frequented by human beings under the power lines or within the servitude area.
- 17. Eskom Dx may stipulate any additional requirements to illuminate any possible exposure to Customers or Public to coming into contact or be exposed to any dangers to Eskom plant.

18. It is required of the applicant to familiarise him/herself with all safety hazards related to Electrical plant.

Should the applicant or his/her contractor damage any of Eskom's services during execution of any work whatsoever, the incident must be reported to Eskom's Technical service centre **Pitso Ramalitsi** @051-853 9704 and 082495 8144 immediately. The same person must be contacted **before** commencement of the project as well.

For the re-location of any Eskom's services, our customer service centre should be contacted on **051-404 2211.** 

The above conditions should be accepted in writing before any work within Eskom Services commences and the technical service centre must be informed of the future activities.


