

BACKGROUND INFORMATION DOCUMENT ON THE PROPOSED HOOGLAND PROJECT AT EVEREST SOUTH PLATINUM MINE

INTRODUCTION

Aquarius Platinum (South Africa) (Pty) Ltd (Aquarius) is planning its mining operations at Everest South Platinum Mine (Everest) near Lydenburg in the Mpumalanga Province. The main aim of the proposed Hoogland project is to:

- undertake open cast mining in two separate pits;
- extending existing support services and networks at the mine to service the mining extensions

The location of the mine and the proposed project is shown in Figure 1.

ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT AND MANAGEMENT PROGRAMME

Prior to the commencement of the proposed project an environmental assessment process including: a scoping phase, environmental impact assessment (EIA) phase and an environmental management programme (EMP) will be conducted in terms of both the Mineral and Petroleum Resources Development Act, 28 of 2002 and the National Environmental Management Act, 107 of 1998. Both laws apply because the proposed project is a mine and it incorporates a number of listed activities.

In addition to this, the project will also require authorisation in terms of the National Water Act, 36 of 1998 and the National Environmental Management Waste Act, 59 of 2008.

PURPOSE OF THIS DOCUMENT

This document has been prepared by Metago to inform you:

- about the proposed project
- about the environmental assessment process to be followed
- of possible environmental impacts
- of how you can have input into the environmental assessment process.

Metago Environmental Engineers (Pty) Ltd (Metago), an independent firm of environmental consultants, has been appointed by Everest to manage the environmental assessment process.

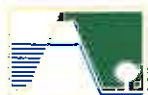
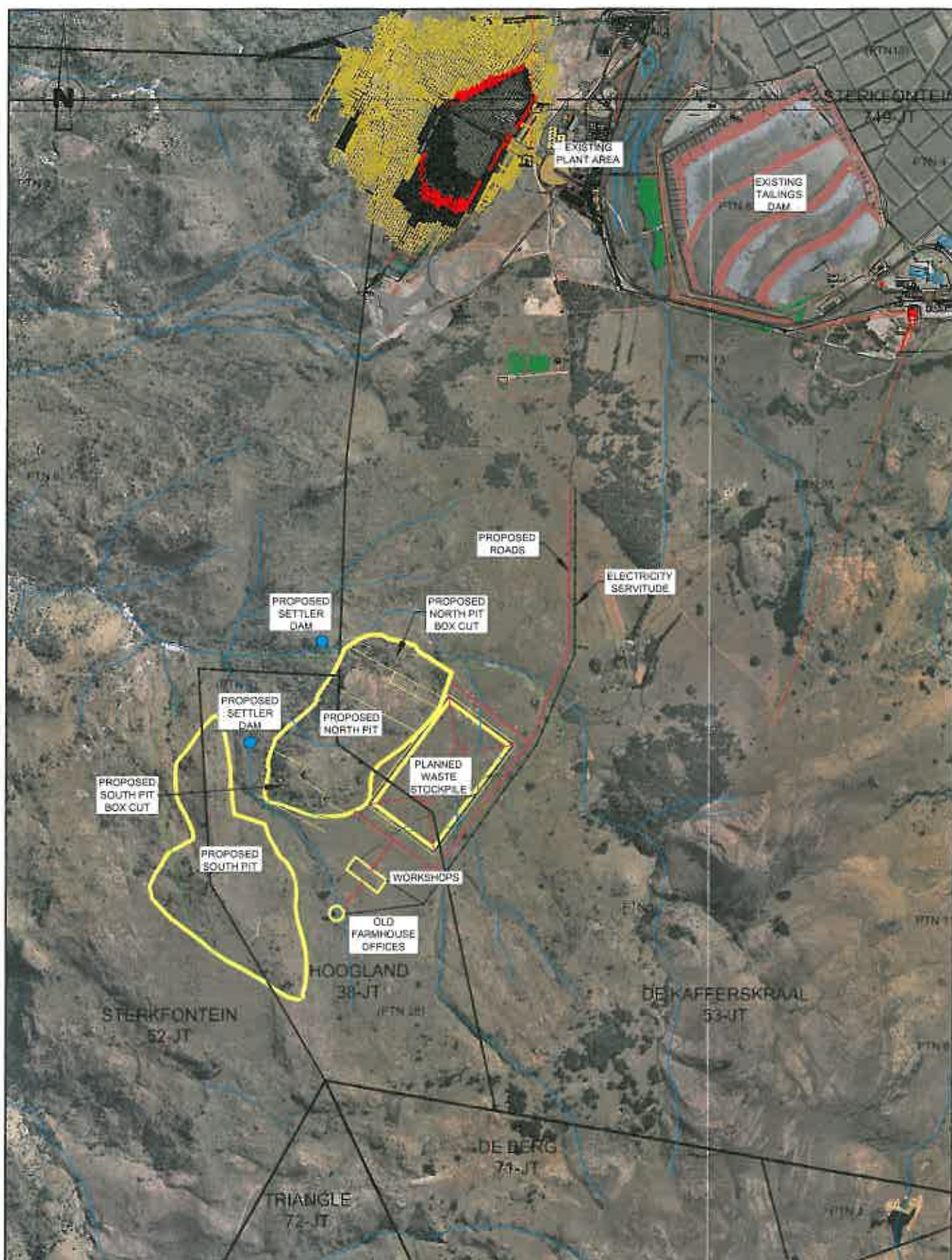

OVERVIEW OF THE PROPOSED PROJECT

PROPOSED OPENCAST MINING OPERATION

The proposed project will involve the surface mining of two new open pit areas within the UG2 ore body using the 'drill and blast' opencast mining method. The proposed opencast operation will not increase the production rate at the mine but will extend the life of the opencast operations by about three (3) years.

Additional infrastructure planned for the opencast operation is as follows:

- two new opencast pits (North and south on Figure 1)
- temporary overburden, ore and topsoil stockpiles;
- temporary storm water management at the pits;
- extending existing power lines to the open pits; and
- access road for administration and management vehicles

An existing mining contractor and contractor's area (located on site away from pits) will be used for the project. No additional jobs are planned.

OPEN CAST MINING

Resource to be mined: The platinum group metals of the UG2 reefs will be mined.

Surface infrastructure: See bulleted list for a summary of the proposed infrastructure in section above. The ore will be processed at the existing Everest Concentrator and tailings will be disposed of to the existing operating tailings dam.

Planned production rate: At full production, material will be mined at a rate of approximately 50 000 tons per month (ktpm) from the various open pits.

Water: Water will only be required for dust suppression, and will be sourced from the existing water pipelines.

Power: New extensions to the current powerlines will be required for the proposed project.

Transport: Ore will be trucked to an existing crusher at the existing mine site and processed in the existing plant. All tailings will be disposed of to the existing operating tailings dam.

Opportunities for employment: No new jobs are expected to be generated by the project, as an existing contractor workforce will be moved from other areas of the mine to mine the open pits.

Timing: Mining activities expected to commence in 2011, with a life of mine of approximately 3 years.

Project alternatives: The process of considering alternatives is ongoing and will form part of the scoping, EIA and EMP phases of the environmental assessment process. Alternatives will be considered for mining methods, the proposed project footprint, air quality management, water management, waste management and rehabilitation.

Motivation for the project: Anticipated market prices in the medium and long-term is considered to be acceptable for project development. The project will have a positive impact on both indirect businesses and sustaining employment levels.

TIMING OF THE PROPOSED PROJECT

Opencast operation: Aquarius would like to start mining the new areas by May 2011.

EVEREST PLATINUM MINE

Everest comprises mining operations, mineral processing, waste and water management and various support services.

MINING: The ore body being mined is the platinum bearing UG2 reef. The ore body is currently mined using both opencast and underground mining methods.

Existing mining infrastructure comprises temporary overburden and topsoil stockpiles; two opencast pits (one in operation and one in the process of being rehabilitated); and an underground portal system.

MINERAL PROCESSING OPERATION: There is one mineral processing plant at the mine. Ore from the mining operations is transported via a conveyor system to a primary crusher, from where it is conveyed to the plant for processing. Product (filter cake) from the plant is transport to Impala's Refining Services near Rustenburg for further processing.

WASTE DISPOSAL AND MANAGEMENT:

Wastes generated by the mine include mine residues (overburden and tailings), domestic waste and industrial waste.

Overburden from the opencast operation is temporarily stockpiled on site and used to rehabilitate the open pits. Tailings from the processing plant is pumped to the tailings dam.

Domestic and industrial waste is disposed of off-site at permitted waste disposal facilities in Holfontein and Lydenburg.

WATER MANAGEMENT: There are storm water management and pollution control facilities at the mine including two sewage plants, a return water dam and pollution control ponds.

WATER AND POWER SUPPLY: Potable and process water at the mine is sourced from boreholes, groundwater inflows into the workings and rainfall inputs to the pits. The water is pumped to storage tanks before being used. Power at the mine is supplied by Eskom. There is an internal power and water supply network at the mine.

TRANSPORT: There is an existing access road to the mine with a security point. There is a network of internal haul roads.

CONTRACTOR'S AREAS AND OFFICES:

There are three existing contractor's areas (offices and workshops) at the mine (one for the opencast contractor, one for the underground mining contractor and one for the plant).

There is an Aquarius office complex located near the processing plant.

ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT PROCESS

The environmental assessment process provides information on the proposed project and the environment in which it is being undertaken; identifies, in consultation with IAPs, the potential impacts of the proposed project; and reports on management measures required to mitigate impacts to an acceptable level. The environmental assessment process being followed is outlined below

- Receive comments from IAPs on the EIA/EMP amendment report and forward to DMR and DEDET for consideration (September 2010)

APPENDIX B: LETTER OF CONSENT FROM LANDOWNER

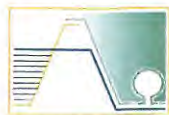

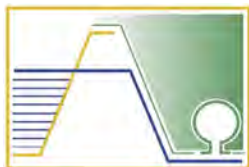

PURPOSE:	The purpose of the scoping meeting was to: 1. outline the project and environmental assessment process; 2. record any issues and questions raised; and 3. agree on the process to be followed and the way forward.

1. OPENING AND INTRODUCTION

Hylton Allison (HA) from Metago Environmental Engineers (Pty) Ltd (Metago) opened the meeting and introduced his colleague Charlene Mureverwi (CM) also from Metago. Upon registration, all attendees were provided with a copy of the project's background information document (BID). HA outlined the agenda and the structure of the meeting.

2. APOLOGIES

Apologies were received from the Department of Mineral Resources (DMR).

3. PRESENTATION AND SITE VISIT

HA (Metago) gave an overview of the project as outlined in the BID. With reference to the locality map included in the presentation. Metago highlighted the proposed Hoogland project. The main activities associated with this project include; to excavate and mine via the open cast method two separate open pits and to extend and establish supporting infrastructure at these pits to enable the mining of PGM minerals. HA from Metago highlighted the proposed changes to surface infrastructure at the mine. These include:

two new opencast pits;
temporary overburden, ore and topsoil stockpiles;
temporary storm-water management at each of the open pits;
extending existing powerlines to the open pits; and
access road for administration and management vehicles.

Metago presented information on the environmental assessment process that will be followed for the proposed project. A site visit was then undertaken by all attendees. Attendees were shown the location of the proposed project.

4. DISCUSSION

All issues raised/questions asked during the meeting with responses given by the project team is presented in Table 1.

Frans Krige (FK)	Will all the rock be crushed on site?	No, Material will then be transported back to the Everest processing plant via haul roads and crushed there.
Mervyn Lotter	What is the reason for the box-cut project failing?	This structure is referred to as a decline and failed as a result of excessive rain during the season.
Helia Meintjes (HM)	How is the mine going to rehabilitate?	The mine is proposing to begin concurrent rehabilitation in Year 1 of the mining operations. Aquarius intends to rehabilitate the site back to its current wilderness potential. A strip and fill mining method will be used which allows for concurrent rehabilitation to take place.

Frans Krige	What are the mine's rehabilitation plans?	This will be raised as an issue in the scoping report and discussed in the EIA EMP documents.

However, what was said in the EMP is not followed through or audited.	Commitments such as these in the original EMP are a legal requirement and if Aquarius are not carrying out such a commitment this aspect will be legally non-compliant in terms of the EMP.
Frans Krige	Rehabilitation requirements must become standardised and not simply fulfilling minimum requirements.	Comment noted. The mine is proposing to begin concurrent rehabilitation in Year 1 of the mining operations. Aquarius intends to rehabilitate the site back to its current grazing potential. Previously, AQPSA have rehabilitated previously mined out area back to their original land use.
Frans Krige	When mine first applied for EMP wasn't there an agreement for a trade-off?	ML- no formal agreement was set. AQPSA management will be approached on this matter
	It is hard to find an equivalent area to trade-off	FK- Aquarius must provide an area for conservation and if project area is irreplaceable then it should be deemed a no-go zone area for mining.
Hylton Allison	Is there any information on the nature reserve?	ML- Yes will email it to HA. ML goes on to note all the sensitive areas and talks about species in the area.
Mervyn Lotter	The mine life is only 3 years. It is not worth destroying such a nature resource.	The financial viability of this proposed project will have been evaluated in the mine works programme (MWP) and with the platinum price at the level it is Aquarius management will need to provide technical information as part of the motivation in the scoping report. Aquarius to confirm what rehabilitation can be accomplished in 3 years and then within the life of the entire mine. The mining life is over 5 years with options to increase a further 3 years.
Mervyn Lotter	Notes a plant that is endemic and is on the proposed project area.	Noted.
Hylton Allison	Is there any documentation on a buffer zone?	ML- There is a limited use zone (1-1.5km) from reserve boundary and a medium use zone.
Ground water and surface water		

Sydney Nkuna	The mine has a current water use licence and one of the conditions for this licence was that an integrated waste, water plan (IWWP) and rehabilitation plan be developed within a year. This has not been submitted. Therefore DWA would like to get a compliance report of current water use before giving a recommendation on any extension activities. We are not sure whether they are complying or not, so we need a report. In addition, is current water supply infrastructure capable of sustaining proposed extension? If it is not, then where will the mine get more water from?	Comment noted. Aquarius have a water balance for the existing mine and will need to extend this to include the proposed Hoogland area.
Sydney Nkuna	What is the waste water infrastructure? And what will happen after 3 years?	This is conceptually indicated on the layout plan. The issue of surface water quantity and quality as well as storm water management is being studied by a specialist and the outcome of this study will be included in the EIA_EMP document. Aquarius management will need to provide technical information as part of the motivation in the scoping report. Aquarius to confirm what rehabilitation can be accomplished in 3 years and then within the life of the entire mine.

Robyn Luyt (RL)	Where will the haul roads be? The mine must assess the area and get recommendations from all the specialists regarding the best route option.	Comment noted. Mervyn Lotter	What does Mr Nel have to say about the proposed project?	Mr Nel is against this project, and Metago is consulting and informing him of all available information.

- IAPs will be given 30 days review the scoping report and/or summary and to submit comments in writing directly to Metago.

- IAPs will be given 30 days to review the report and/or summary and to submit comments in writing directly to Metago.
- the EIA/EMP amendment report, including IAPs comments, will then be forwarded to DEDET for review.
- The environmental authorisation/decision will be distributed to all IAPs registered on the project's public involvement database.
