Establishment of new 2 lane bridge. The existing single lane river bridge is a steel truss that is deemed structurally inadequate. The bridge, build shortly after 1931, does not comply with the required standards for the class and loading it has to carry. In addition, adequate provision is essential in terms of the requirement to serve as an emergency road to the N2. Going forward, 5 it is planned that the road be upgraded to a Road Class 3 with a 100km/h design speed (Note: this upgrade falls outside the scope of the bridge upgrade project). Preservation of the existing steel bridge being a historical structure is proposed.		
We acknowledge receipt of your application for HIA requirements. Please note that the steel structure adjacent the area of the proposed new bridge requires protection in terms of the KwaZulu Natal Heritage Act No.4 of 2008 and the National Heritage Resources Act No. 25 of 1999 (Section 38 (1)), therefore a Heritage Impact Assessment is required for the above proposed project. Amafa KZN Heritage therefore requires the appointment of an Amafa accredited Heritage Practitioner to assist in the provision of recommendations and mitigation procedures.
