





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1 OVERVIEW





Stakeholder engagement is based on the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act No. 107 of 1998) and industry best practice guideline by the Department of Environmental Affairs and Development Planning, the guideline on public participation 2009. Guidance to stakeholder engagement in further phases will be based on comments and issues raised by stakeholders during the commenting period.

The EIA Regulations promulgated in June 2014 (as amended in 2021), Chapter 6 specify the minimum requirements for public participation in an EIA under NEMA.

The public participation process for the Kokerboom Upgrade commenced on 18/08/2021 and the provisional list of stakeholders were notified via email, advertisements, posters and SMS Notifications of its commencement.

2 PROCESS TO DATE

To date the stakeholder list has been compiled to determine key stakeholders that will be engaged in the public participation process. This stakeholder list has been continuously updated throughout the participation process.

Initial notification of the Kokerboom Upgrade is complete. Stakeholder engagement documents have been drafted and distributed to the general public and listed stakeholders notified via electronic mail and personal cell phone messages.

The Background Information Document (BID), advertisements and posters provided a short summary of the project and invite stakeholders to register as interested and/or affected parties. The following information was included:

- EndemicVision Environmental Services (Pty) Ltd is the independent environmental assessment practitioner;
- A simplified description of the proposed project, and a rationale for it;
- A map indicating the extent of the proposed project area;
- The public participation process for the Kokerboom Upgrade Environmental Authorisation Application of Black Mountain Mine, Namaqualand, Northern Cape has commenced;
- The Environmental Impact Assessment process and stakeholder engagement process to be followed;
- That stakeholders are invited to register as an I&AP and to participate in the basic assessment process and public participation process; and
- A description of how and when stakeholders can contribute during the environmental authorization and public participation process.

Stakeholders have been invited to register as I&APs and to participate in the process before or on 01/08/2021.

An advert was placed in the local newspaper 'Gemsbok' on 18/08/2021 (refer to Appendix E1) and posters were distributed in Aggeneys on 20/08/2021 (refer to Appendix E1) at strategically positioned sites such as the library and other public places.

A BID has been sent to all stakeholders on 18/08/2021.

All concerns and input received are addressed and presented as the DBAR / EMP Report.

The comments and response report for the Kokerboom Upgrade has been opened and all comments received have been captured (refer to Appendix E3).

The draft copy of the BAR and EMPr were provided to all I&APs registered on the project database for a period of 30 days to allow I&AP the opportunity to comment on the findings of the EMPr. The draft BAR & EMPr report were made available to the I&APs on 08/09/2021.

All concerns and input received are addressed and presented as the FBAR / EMP Report.





Background

Black Mountain Mining (Pty) Ltd has initiated the process to ensure that their activities are conducted effectively, legally and in the most efficient manner.

Black Mountain Mining (Pty) Ltd is currently planning to:

 Upgrade the Kokerboom Reservoir and Pipeline on Portion 01 and Remaining Extent of the Farm Aggeneys 56, within the Khâi-Ma Local Municipality, Northern Cape Province.

Before the proposed project may go ahead, a Basic Assessment Report (BAR) process need to be completed in terms of the following legislation:

 National Environmental Management Act (No. 107 of 1998 as amended June 2021)

EndemicVision Environmental Services (Pty) Ltd has been appointed as the independent environmental assessment practitioner, to undertake the Basic Assessment Reporting (BAR) and associated public participation process for the application.

This document intends to:

- Inform interested and affected parties (I&APs) of the application for upgrading;
- Provide I&APs with documents at various stages during the environmental assessment process; and
- Invite comment and input into the process.

You are invited to engage in the process by submitting issues of concern and suggestions to the proposed application.

Application and Activities

The following application will be submitted to the competent authority, namely:

 Application for Environmental Authorisation in terms of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act no. 107 of 1998). Submission is made to the Department: agriculture, environmental affairs, land reform and rural development, Northern Cape Province.

The development of reservoirs, excluding dams, with a capacity of more than 250 cubic meters.

Development – BAR Process Kokerboom Reservoir and Pipeline

Upgrading activities triggering the listed activities include:

- The upgrading of the current Kokerboom pipeline by constructing a 7.1 km uPVC pipeline of 0,400 meters in diameter and a 0.7 km uPVC pipeline of 0,315 meters in diameter.
- Two reservoirs will be constructed. The capacity of each reservoir will be 5 200 cubic meters. The combined capacity will thus be 10 400 cubic meters and exceeds 250 cubic meters within a critical biodiversity area (CBA1).
- The clearance of vegetation for the upgrade of the reservoirs and pipeline will exceed 300 square meters within critical biodiversity areas (CBA1 and CBA2).

Before the proposed project may go ahead, a Basic Assessment Reporting process must be completed. This process must be submitted as part of the Application.

The submission of reports to the competent authority will include an assessment of all impacts related to the project with avoidance, mitigation and management measures included in the EMPr.

Basic Assessment Report Process

The objectives of the BAR process are to provide:

 I&APs with adequate information to understand the potential environmental and socio-economic impacts associated with the proposed project and opportunities for them to comment on the BAR process; Background Information Document

- the engineering team with information that will assist them to incorporate effective measures into the construction of the reservoir and pipeline to minimise negative impacts and enhance benefits of the project; and
- the regulatory authorities with sufficient information to serve as a basis for sound decision making.

Aim of the Application

The aim of the application is to upgrade the Kokerboom Reservoir and Pipeline on Portion 01 and Remaining Extent of the Farm Aggeneys 56, legally and in the most efficient manner.

Project Description & Location

The Kokerboom Reservoir and pipeline will cover an approximate area of 13 ha and is situated on Portion 1 and the Remaining Extent of the Farm Aggeneys 56. The reservoir is located approximately 4km North-East of Aggeneys with the pipeline extending from the reservoir towards the edge of the town and around the town, within the Khâi-Ma Local Municipality, Northern Cape Province.

The development will consist of the construction of a 7.8 km uPVC pipeline and two 5200 cubic meters prefabricated reservoir tanks consisting of AZ150 Aluminium Zinc coated steel sheets and lined with PVC.

The locality map below indicates the site where the development is planned.




Figure 5: BID p. 3



According to the Ecological Impact Assessment Report, the affected vegetation types are: (1) Bushmanland Arid Grassland, (2) Aggeneys Gravel Vygieveld, and (3) Bushmanland Inselberg Shrubland (classified as Threatened). The report confirmed that the greatest impacts would be on provincially protected plant species, mostly succulents. The checklist of plant species encountered on site confirmed the presence of protected Vachellia erioloba (Camel thorn) and Boscia albitrunca in the Plateau. However, it seems as if only a single specimen of the provincially protected <i>Ve. erioloba or B. albitrunca</i> would be negligent (if any). If protected trees such as <i>V. erioloba, B. albitrunca</i> or <i>Euclea pseudebenus</i> are encountered, the developer must apply for and obtain a valid Forest Act License, prior to disturbance of such trees. The Ecological Impact Assessment report stated that the proposed pipeline will cross town gardens, some with protected tree may not be removed, damaged, disturbed or destroyed without a valid Forest Act License, irrespective of whether it occurs naturally or was planted artificially. The Ecological Impact Assessment report stated that nationally protected trees near the development footprint shall be identified as no-go areas. The Department supports this recommendation.
