EXEMPTION APPLICATION:

You have requested exemption from the provisions of the following regulation: Regulation 17(a): "An EAP or person compiling a specialist report or undertaking a specialised process, appointed in terms of regulation 16(1) must - (a) be independent".

The reason for the exemption application is:

Both the Aurecon Engineering team and; the Aurecon Environment and Advisory Services team is involved with the different phases of the same project; which may be deemed to be "circumstances that may compromise the objectivity of the EAP" (Definition of independence: GN R.543).

The Department has decided to grant the exemption application.

Although both the Aurecon Engineering team and the Aurecon Environment and Advisory Services team is involved with the different phases of the same project, the applicant for the proposed project is SANBI and not Aurecon South Africa (Pty) Ltd. Therefore objectivity of the EAP will therefore not be compromised. The respective declaration forms for the EAP and/or any specialist input into the EIA process will thus applicable and should be duly completed and signed.

DEVIATION REQUEST:

You have requested deviations from the provisions of the Regulation 10 (2)(d).

The Department has decided to grant the deviation from this regulation.

In terms of regulation 10(2) of the Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations, 2010 (the Regulations), you are instructed to notify all registered interested and affected parties, in writing and within 12 (twelve) days of the date of this letter, of the Department's decision in respect of your **application for** 12 (twelve) as well as the provisions regarding the submission of appeals that are contained in the Regulations.
