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### SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION TO SUPPORT EXPORT PERMIT APPLICATION

#### 1. Motivation for application (refer Section B.4):

The objective is to obtain DNA from three specimens of *Homo sapiens* from Border Cave: BC1, BC2 and BC 5, all of which have been regarded as Late Pleistocene (Middle Stone Age) specimens (Beaumont, P., H. de Villiers, and J. Vogel (1978) Modern man in sub-Saharan Africa prior to 49,000 years BP: A review and evaluation with particular reference to Border Cave. South African Journal of Science 74:409-414; Beaumont P.B. and Vogel J.C. (1972). On a new radiocarbon chronology for Africa south of the Equator, Part 1. *Afr. Stud.* 31, 65-89; Butzer, KW et al, 1978. Lithostratigraphy of Border Cave, Kwazulu, South Africa: a Middle Stone Age sequence beginning c. 195,000BP. *Journal of Archaeological Science*.5, 317-341; Grun, R. et al, 1990. ESR dating evidence for early modern humans at Border Cave in South Africa. *Nature*.
