2. Summary of Motivation for proposed work (A full report must accompany this application)

Little is known about the subsistence practices of the earliest pioneer farmers who settled coastal KwaZulu-Natal about 1700 years ago (e.g., the "Mzonjani phase"). Particularly, we do not know how important cattle were for these economies, or the role of marine resources such as shellfish. My project will analyze organic lipid residues preserved in the matrix of ancient cooking pots to detect major classes of foods utilized by ancient farming groups (i.e., marine, dairy, etc). Additionally, I will analyze the elemental composition of ceramic sherds using portable x-ray fluorescence analyses (pXRF) to assess the ceramic production choices of the earliest farmers relative to later farming groups. This project is funded by an European Union Commission MSCA Individual Fellowship awarded to Dr Emma Loftus.

5. Summary of Details of the proposed work: (A full report must accompany this application)

Analysis using gas chromatography mass spectrometry (GC-MS) and GC-MS isotope ratio mass spectrometry
can distinguish major classes of food lipids, including marine-derived fats, carcass fats of terrestrial ruminants,
such as cattle and sheep, dairy lipids and plant-derived lipids. The residue analysis will be completed by Dr

Emma Loftus in the Department of Chemistry and Pharmacy at Friedrich—Alexander University Erlangen—
Nürnberg in Bavaria, Germany, one of only a handful of laboratories in the world with the know-how and
capacity to analyze lipids from archaeological material, as this is a relatively complex, multi-stage analytical
procedure. A few grams of ceramic powder will be drilled from the inside surface of the pot, preserving the
overall integrity of each sherd, and minimising damage to the overall shape and appearance of each sample.

The pXRF analysis will be carried out subsequently on the already drilled surfaces (i.e., freshly exposed ceramic
matrix) using two instruments (Bruker Tracer 5i and a Niton XL3t) at the Institute for Prehistory, LudwigMaximilians University Munich. This analysis will not incur any further damage to the individual sherds.

The entire assemblage will be returned to the KZNM collections after the analysis, having been fully
documented both prior to, and after the drilling and analysis.

When submitting on sahris note that you must check "Permits" under the case type and KZN Amafa for the Provincial Heritage Resources Authority.

The applicant is the "owner" and the Assessor is the "Consultant" and the correct fields must be completed.

The Consent Letters allowing a Consultant to act on behalf of the owner and/or to upload the case to sahris must be placed in the correct boxes which are blocked from public view. The proof of payment must also be loaded to the designated box to prevent members of the public obtaining banking details, etc from the document.

3. PROCESSING OF APPLICATIONS: applications are processed in the order in which they are received, except during the December/January holiday break. The Institute will receipt the application and alert the applicant to any missing information within 2 weeks of submission.
