The Phase 2 Heritage Impact Assessment by Francois Coetzee (enclosed with this information, has reference.

Francois Coetzee has conducted a Phase 2 Heritage Impact Assessment (HIA) for Canyon Rock (Pty) Ltd, Rosslyn Quarry. Following the HIA, Mr Coetzee is submitting an application for a Destruction Permit to allow for the quarry to expand into an area where two Late Iron Age stone-walled sites (Sites 1 & 2) and a historical structure (Site 3) have been identified. This Public Participation Feedback report is to accompany the Destruction Permit application.

A Public Participation (PP) process was undertaken in order to give members of the public in the vicinity of the mine, an opportunity to comment on the Permit application. Mr Coetzee requested assistance from Umhlaba Environmental Consulting CC to run the PP process.

1. PUBLIC NOTIFICATION PROCESS

At the time of running the PP process, Umhlaba was of the understanding that the Destruction Permit application would be submitted to the Provincial Heritage Resource Agency – Gauteng (PHRA-G) and hence the process following was in line with the process as undertaken for another site – process followed was confirmed with PHRA-G at the time. A copy of e-mail communication is included in Section 3A. (page 5). Confirmation to proceed was obtained from Ms Molokomme telephonically on the afternoon of the 5th April 2022. In addition, Ms Molokomme contact details was included on the site notice and in the adverts.

A. SITE NOTICE

A Site Notice was erected at the entrance to the mine, on a notice board / wall on the outside wall of the mine security entrance point – see blue circle in Photo 1. The advert was placed in the afternoon of the 10th May 2022. The site notice remained on this board / wall until the 12th June 2022.

The wording of the notice is presented in Section 3B. (page 6).

B. Newspaper Advertisement

Newspaper advertisements were placed under "Legal Notices" a local newspaper for the area, on the 27th May 2022; the Pretoria North Rekord – see blue rectangle in Photo 3. This newspaper was selected based on advice from Caxton, given the wide area of distributions – see Photo 2 – taken from mail to Caxton on 19th May 2022.

The advertisements asked for comment by the 27th June 2022.

The wording of the advertisement is presented in Section 3C. (page 7).




Photo 3: Advertisement placed in Pretoria North Rekord, on the 27th May 2022.

To date, no responses / feedback has been received by Umhlaba (or the applicant directly), from Interested and Affected Parties (I&AP).



CULTURAL HERITAGE IMPACT ASSESSMENT AND DESTRUCTION PERMIT APPLICATION

Notice is given in terms of the National Heritage Resources Act, 1999 (Act No. 25 of 1999), following communication from the South African Heritage Resource Association (SAHRA)

10th May 2022

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

During a Phase 1 Heritage survey in 2009, cultural heritage sites were identified; namely two Late Iron Age stone-walled sites (Sites 1 & 2) and a historical structure (Site 3) – photos alongside, and summary from the Phase 2 Heritage Impact Assessment (HIA)¹ below.

- ► <u>Sites 1 & 2</u> are part of the same structure, probably dating to between AD 1780 and AD 1830, part of the Later Moloko period within the Late Iron Age. Ethnographic and historical data link the site to the Tswan group: Bakgatla ba Mmakau. The site is ~200m by ~70m, consisting of two sections built with dry stone walling and probably functioned as a cattle/livestock outpost. No indication of long-term occupation was found.
- Site 3 includes the foundation of a single room house (probably used by a farm worker as a home base) and no refuge midden or any cultural material was found in association with the structure. Based on 1939 topographic maps, the structure might date to the early AD 1900s.

Both sites fall within the Mining Right area for GP 30/5/1/2/2 (172) MR, issued to Raumix Aggregates(Pty) Ltd, over Portions 34, 35, 72 and 73 of the farm Klipfontein 268 JR.

The current long-term plan for the mine includes the expansion of the pit into the area where Sites 1 & 2 have been identified. Hence, the applicant has undertaken a Phase 2 HIA and is applying for a Destruction Permit from the SAHRA.

The work has been undertaken by Francois Coetzee2.



The following quotes are taken from the HIA1 Conclusions and Recommendations:


- Sites 1 & 2: "Due to the third-tier status of the site and limited cultural material the field rating of the site is re-evaluated as Generally Protected B (Medium significance)."
- <u>Site 3:</u> "Due to the condition and limited cultural material the field rating of the site remains as Generally Protected C (Low significance)."

The applicant will be applying for a Destruction Permit in due course.

This consultation process is being run as part of the supporting documentation that will be submitted with the Permit Application.

C. WORDING OF NEWSPAPER ADVERTISEMENT

Notice is given in terms of the National Heritage Resources Act, 1999 (Act No. 25 of 1999) and following a request from the Provincial Heritage Resources Authority of Gauteng (PHRA-G).

Three heritage sites have been identified within the proposed expanded pit area of Canyon Rock (Pty) Ltd, Rosslyn Quarry - Mining Right 30/5/1/2/2 (172) MR, operated by Raumix Aggregates (Pty) Ltd. The quarry is located approximately 2.5km north-west of the Rosslyn Industrial Township, on Portions 34, 35, 72 and 73 of the farm Klipfontein 268 JR.

Canyon Rock (Pty) Ltd - Rosslyn Quarry has conducted, a **Phase 2 Heritage Impact Assessment** (HIA) and will be submitting an application for a **Destruction Permit** to PHRA-G.

The HIA – undertaken by Francois Coetzee (ASAPA #028) – describes the heritage sites as a Late Iron Age stone-walled site (Sites 1 & 2) and a historical structure (Site 3). Site 1 & 2 are ~200m by ~70m, consisting of two sections built with dry stone walling and probably functioned as a cattle/livestock outpost; no indication of long-term occupation was found. Due to the third-tier status of the site and limited cultural material the field rating of the site is Generally Protected B (Medium significance). Site 3 is the foundation of a single room house (early AD 1900s) and no refuge midden or any cultural material was found in association with the structure. Due to the condition and limited cultural material the field rating of the site remains as Generally Protected C (Low significance).
