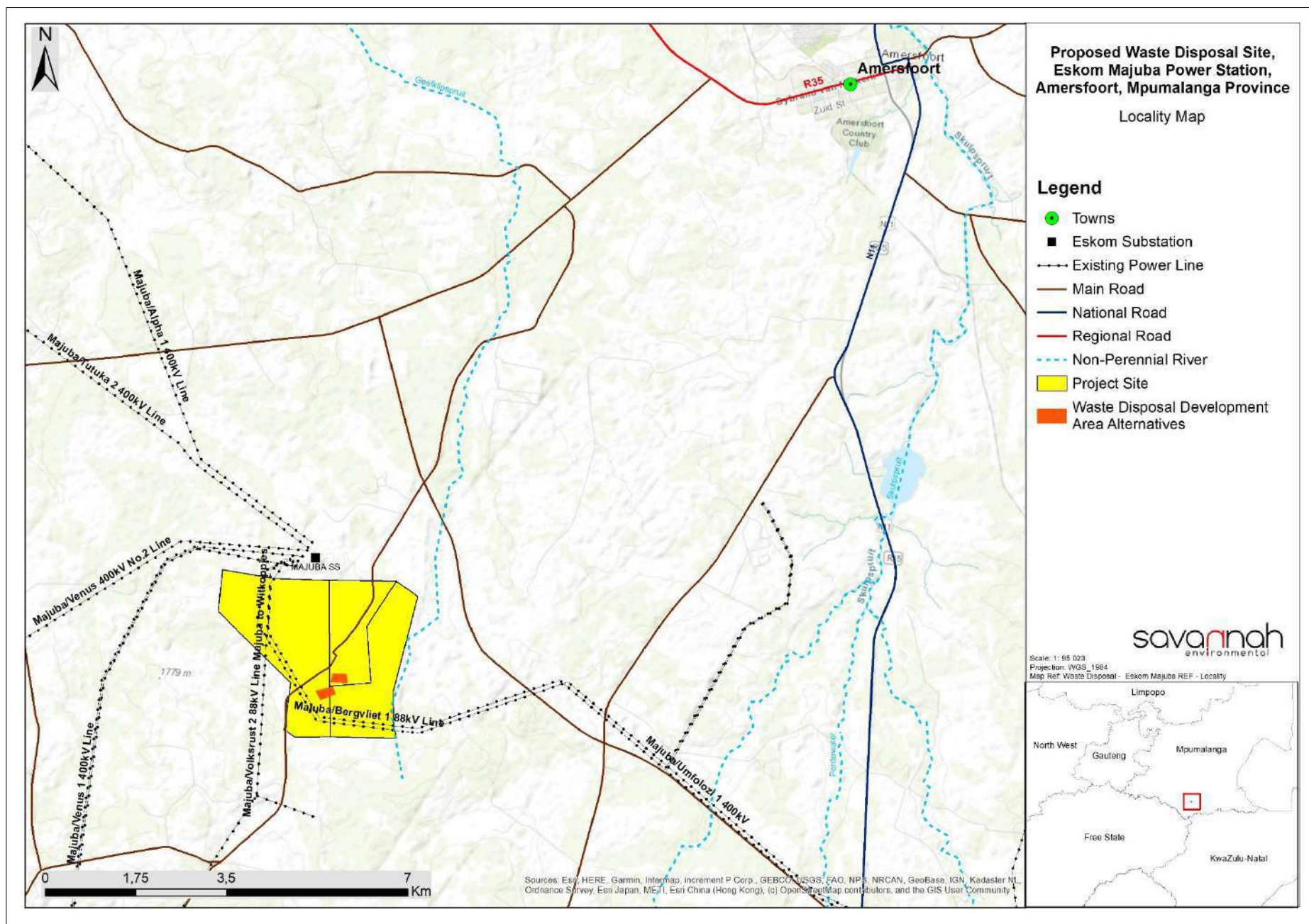

In accordance with the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations of December 2014 (as amended in April 2017), published in terms of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act No. 107 of 1998) (NEMA), the National Environmental Management: Waste Act, 2008 (Act No. 59 of 2008) (NEM:WA), and the List of Waste Management Activities (GNR 921), the construction and operation of the general waste disposal site is a listed activity requiring an Integrated Environmental Authorisation (IEA) and Waste Management Licence (WML) from the Department of Forestry, Fisheries and the Environment (DFFE). In terms of GNR 326 and GNR 921, the application for an Integrated EA and WML is required to be supported by a full Scoping and EIA process. The application for an Integrated EA and WML is required to be supported by comprehensive, independent environmental studies.

The Scoping and EIA process is an effective planning and decision-making tool. It allows the environmental consequences resulting from the construction and operation of a project to be identified and appropriately managed. It provides the opportunity for the developer to be forewarned of potential environmental issues and allows for the resolution of the issue(s) reported on in the Scoping and Environmental Impact Assessment Reports, as well as opening a dialogue with interested and affected parties.

In accordance with Regulation 12 of the EIA Regulations, 2014, as amended, Eskom had previously appointed BTW & Associates as the Independent Environmental Assessment Practitioner (EAP) to undertake the Scoping and EIA process and prepare a Scoping and EIA Report in support of the proposed project.

The Scoping Report and Plan of Study for the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) prepared by BTW & Associates was submitted to the DFFE on 20 September 2019. The Scoping Report was accepted and the Plan of Study for the EIA approved by the DFFE on 04 November 2019. Since acceptance of the Scoping Report and approval of the Plan of Study for the EIA by the DFFE in 2019, an EIA Report, inclusive of specialist reports and an Environmental Management Programme (EMPr), has not been submitted to DFFE for their consideration and decision-making.

As part of these environmental studies, Interested & Affected Parties (I&APs) will be actively involved through the public participation process being undertaken by Savannah Environmental.

WHAT ARE THE POTENTIAL ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE PROPOSED PROJECT?

Various specialists were appointed by BTW & Associates (i.e., the previous EAP on this project) in 2018 to undertake an assessment of the project site as part of the Scoping Phase, with the aim of identifying the potential for environmental impacts. These specialist studies will be updated further to inform the EIA Report during the EIA Phase of the project. Specialist studies relevant to this project include the following:

- » **Wetland Delineation and Biodiversity Impact Assessment** – which includes an assessment of impacts and associated disturbance to drainage lines, rivers, and wetlands at a broad and fine scale. It also includes ecology, fauna and flora and assesses the potential impact and the associated disturbance of vegetation on the biodiversity of the area (including critical biodiversity areas and broad-scale processes).

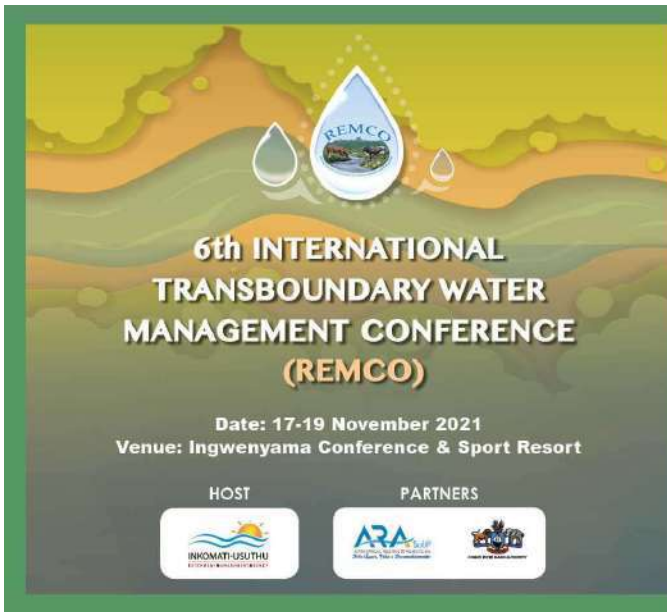

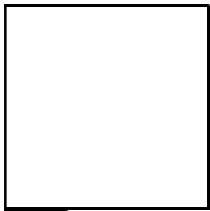

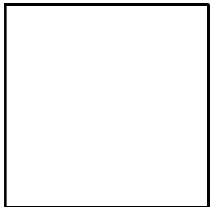
