



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

With reference to your fax dated 14 November 2011 in connection with the above-mentioned, I wish to Inform you that your application has been approved, as set out below, subject to the following conditions:

1. The Roads Technician VRYBURG (053 928 7200) must be informed at least seven days before commencement of any work and shortly before completion thereof in order to make the necessary arrangements for inspection.

The Inspection and Completion certificate must be completed during the inspection and handed to the Roads Technician,

The necessary and prescribed road signs for the proposed work must conform to the SA Manual for 2. Road Traffic Signs.

You must provide the signs and erect them to the satisfaction of the Regional Manager or Roads Technician before commencing with the work.

The minimum tay-out of the road signs is shown on the sketches included in the attached Addendum.

The necessary precautions are to be taken at all times to safeguard traffic while installation operations
are in progress due to negligence on the part of your own employees or contractors will be your
responsibility.

- 4. Any damage to existing way-leaves or to the rights of other people as a result of your installation operations will be your responsibility. If you are not the owner of the relevant property, this way-leave is granted to you without prejudice to the rights of the ownership of the owner or any other parties concerned.
 - When the road servitude ceases to exist, either by the closing or deviation of the relevant road, the full authority and control of the land taken u by the road reserve, will revert to the owner or other parties concerned and removal of your service may be demanded. It will thus be necessary to obtain the consent to this way-leave from the owners of the land in question and/or other parties concerned in order to protect your interests.
- 5. Roads Branch will not be involved in any expenditure in connection with the laying / erection / installation or maintenance of your service. You must undertake to move or deviate your service(s) at your own expense, within the prescribed period if requested by Roads Branch, should this become necessary as a result of road widening, road works, road maintenance or road surfacing. This includes everything concerned and connected to the service(s) such as meter boxes, moters, transformers, poles, street distribution cabinets, anchors, stays, manholes or any other fittings or parts thereof. Where special conditions were allowed, you still be held responsible for all costs incurred should your service(s) and all appurtenant items have to be shifted.
- 6. The shifting of the service(s) could be permitted to a position within a new <u>planned</u> and <u>proposed</u> road reserve. This will, however, be subject to specific approval from Roads Branch and will only be considered if the service compiles with current standards and policy as laid down by Roads Branch. All obstacles / hindrances and permission / negotiations (landowners, etc.) required to achieve this new position within the proposed road reserve will have to be surmounted and undertaken by yourselves, <u>irrespective</u> of what stage / phase the planning of the new proposed road reserve has reached.
- 7. NB: This permission with regard to parallel service and services within the existing road reserve can expire later when you are instructed to shift / remove your services and can, therefore, mean that your service will not automatically be allowed within the future / new road reserve. Your service will then have to be placed outside the road reserve and the building line.
- 8. You will be held responsible for any damage suffered by Roads Branch as a result of your negligence to shift the service(s) within the prescribed period(s).
- 9. If it deemed necessary in the future by Roads Branch to repair, resurface or do repair work directly as a result of the presence of your service (in spite of the duration of when the service was installed), you will have to accept full responsibility for the extra costs (that is those repair costs directly attached to the presence of your service within the road reserve) incurred by Roads Branch. You will have to pay the full amount, within three months from date of the written notice, to be above-mentioned Roads Technician.
- 10. You will be responsible for all liaison and co-ordination work including any and all correspondence between your commission / department and any private property owners. Roads Branch will mot be involved with any individual property owners with regard to the service, as this is then still your responsibility. See also clauses 4 and 5 of this way-leave.
- 11. You indemnify the Premier of the North West and exempt him from any claim or damage which may be instituted or suffered by any person, including legal costs, as a result of the laying or erection of any service or any other works caused or erected by you, or as a result of negligence on your part to

- protect or maintain the service or other works caused by any other person unless you can prove negligence on the part of Roads Branch or its officials.
- 12. Roads Branch will not be tiable for any damage suffered by the applicant as a result of operations carried out on road construction or road maintenance or any other operations whatsoever, unless negligence on the part of Roads Branch or its officials can be proved.
- 13. The work must be carried out to the entire satisfaction of the above-mentioned Regional Manager/ Roads Technician. No trees, shrubs, cultivated grass or fencing must be removed or damaged. If such plants or fences were removed or damaged you will have to replace it to the entire satisfaction of the said Regional Manager / Roads Technician.
- 14. Permissions must be obtained from the Roads Technician before any trees or shrubs can be pruned or removed for erection / installation or maintenance purposes. All branches and tree trunks or other waste must be removed and the road reserve must be cleaned u before the final inspection takes place. The service(s) must be erected in such a manner that no trees are affected or will fall within the safe area of the service(s).
- 15. Drainage systems (surface and sub-surface) must not be interfered with or damaged in any way. The road reserve must be left clean and all waste products be removed.
- 16. No <u>permanent</u> access to and from the road to the service will be allowed. <u>Temporary</u> access points must be approved by the Regional Manager.
- 17. The work must be done within twelve months from the date of this letter. If for any reason at all, the work is delayed for a longer period, extension of the time must be requested in writing or a new application will have to be submitted.
- 18. The official in charge of the construction or maintenance work on the site must, at all times, be in possession of a complete copy of the letter of approval, including the general conditions, special conditions and specific conditions where applicable to the service concerned, as well as all plans that are required and are referred to in the correspondence, so that during an inspection the official can submit it to the official(s) of the controlling authority when requested to do so. If no approval can be submitted the official of the controlling authority then can order that the road be secured and the work immediately ceased. Any cost incurred by Roads Branch to secure the road, will be to your account.
 - 19. The conditions of this way-leave are applicable to you as well as your successor-in-title (where applicable). If property rights of your service be transferred to any other person or institution, it will be your responsibility to bring the contents of this way-leave to the attention of your successor-in-title as the conditions of this way-leave together with your property rights will be transferred to your successor-in-title and will still be applicable.
 - 20. This clause is applicable to the Department of Posts and Telecommunications or any other institution / company acting on their behalf within the said acts as set out below:

The Postal Act No 44 of 1958 (as amended) and any further amendments to the act will not be applicable with regard to this application and approval. Only the conditions laid down in this way-leave will be considered as legal and binding! Therefore, any claims that may arise as a result of the presence of your service will be treated strictly according to the conditions laid down in this way-leave. Therefore, section 108 of the Postal Act 44 of 1958 or section 50 of the Postal Amendment Act No 113 of 1976 or any other sections of any Postal Act, will not be applicable to Roads Branch.

Upon non-acceptance of this condition, this approval is withdrawn and your application is not approved. Application must then be re-submitted.

21. If you fail to comply with any of the general, specific and special conditions of this way-leave during the laying / installation / erection or maintenance of the concerned service, the Administrator reserves

the right to withdraw this way-leave and you will be obliged to cease all work immediately or to rectify the situation or in failure of the latter you can be ordered (Act 21 of 1940), to remove the service from within the building restriction area.

CONDITIONS CONCERNING OVERHEAD POWER LINE / TELEPHONE LINES:

- 22. Except where the service crosses the road it may in terms of section 9 of the Advertising on Roads and Ribbon Development Act (Act 21 of 1940, as amended) not be laid nearer than 95 metres from the centre line of the road or within a 500 metre radius measured from the centre line of the junction of a building restriction road and the centre line of any other road (except a national road), without the specific permission of Roads Branch. For any specifications see clause 45.
- 23. Where the route crosses the road, prescribed safety measures must be provided.
- 24. The overhead wires are not to be lower than 6,1 metres above the highest point of the road surface. This free clearance is the minimum distance but the relevant regulation of the Act on Machinery and Work Security (Act 6 of 1983) or any other regulation of any other law which defines a greater free clearance, will still be applicable.
- 25. At crossings no pylons, poles, anchors or parts thereof may be created within a distance of 16 metres from the road reserve. Where the routes of the lines are parallel to the road, it must not be closer than 1 meters away from the road reserve.
- 26. You agree to maintain at all times and at your own expense all pylons, poles, anchors, stays, overhead wires and all appurtenant items. Precautions are to be taken to safeguard the travelling public.
- Distances mentioned above are to the absolute minimum distance allowed for the erection of the overhead lines along and across the road reserve.

CONDITIONS FOR UNDERGROUND PIPES/CABLES:

- 28. Except where the service crosses the road it may in terms of section 9 of the Advertising on Roads and Ribbon Development Act (Act 21 of 1940, as amended) not be laid nearer than 95 metres from the centre line of the road or within a 500 metre radius measured from the centre line of the junction of a building restriction road and the centre line of any other road except a national road), without the specific permission of Roads Branch. For any special specifications see clause 39.
- 29. The service must be laid in a sleeve pipe over the full width of the road reserve. The top of the sleeve pipe must be laid at least one metre under the lowest point of the road or road reserve and follow a straight line. The cable must cross the road perpendicular as far as possible and no manholes/distribution cabinets, access chambers, etc., must be crected within the road reserve. Manholes, access/valve chambers, air valves, etc., may only be crected on one side of the road and outside the road reserve. Should permission be given to allow one or more of the foregoing structures within the road reserve, it shall not protrude above the surrounding surface and the structure must be of sufficient strength to withstand and carry axle loading as prescribed by Roads Branch.

The pipe may be erected not more than one meter from the fence within the road reserve.

The sleeve pipe or duct must be acceptable and comply to the standard types approved by Roads Branch. A list of standard types is available on written request. In the event of the sleeve/pipe being larger than 150 mm (inside diameter) a note on the <u>detail plans</u> is to be added confirming that the sleeve/pipe is strong enough for the required purpose. (Detail plans will normally encompass a layout plan, locality plan, longitudinal and cross sections to a suitable scale signed by a professional Engineer).

30. A bright weather-proof plastic tape must be laid, where applicable, ± 300 mm above the sleeve to act as a warning.

- 31. The material that is used must be of such quality that during the expected life of the road it will not be necessary to disturb the road surface to do repairs to the service.
- 32. If the open trench method is used the sleeve pipe must be laid in two sections across the roadway to obviate interruption to the flow of traffic; only one lane may be closed to the public at a time. A deviation to make the crossing of the road easier, can be considered but it must be shown on a fully detailed plan and approved by the Regional Manager before commencement of the work.
- 33. Care must be taken that existing storm-water drains or subsurface drainage systems or survey beacons/pegs are not damaged or interfered with by excavations. Excavation within the road reserve must be fenced and secured.
- 34. (a) Any survey pegs/beacons that are damaged as a result of your activities must be replaced at your own cost by a surveyor who is on an approved panel of surveyors appointed by Roads Branch.
 - (b) Cadastral beacons, however, must be replaced by a registered surveyor.
 - (c) After the beacons have been replaced a Completion Certificate, marked for the specific attention of the Chief Industrial Technician: Survey, must be handed in at the office of the Regional Manager for approval.
 - (d) All arrangements for the Implementation of the above-mentioned procedures will be arranged by the service owner/applicant and will they accept full responsibility thereof.
 - 35. Treatment of the layers for service excavations must conform to the Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Works as well as the Material and Pavement Design Manual (L1/78, as amended) issued by the Deputy Director General: Roads, NORTH WEST GOVERNMENT., MAFIKENG Should these specifications in any instance be less stringent and/or a lesser standard than the general specifications as given below, these will apply:

Back-filling alongside and over all sleeve pipes must be placed and compacted in layers of at most 100 mm after compaction to a density required for the material in adjacent fill, sub-grade or sub-base layer. The density of the backfill in excavations in natural ground must be at least 90 % of modified AASHTO density.

You will be held responsible for any subsidence in the backfill or accidents due to such subsidence.

- 36. You agree to maintain at all times underground services and appurtenant items including repair work to the surface of the road if requested and to take the necessary precautions to safeguard the travelling public.
- 37. No excavation in the roadway may be left open overnight.
- Service markers as specified on attached plan W93 indicating the nature, position and depth of the service will have to be erected on both sides at crossings, by the service owner. For parallel services within the road reserve the markers must be erected at least at every 100 metres alongside the underground service. The markers must be at least 200 mm high and also be clearly visible.
- 39. You will not be allowed to excavate at any time to effect repairs to the service. If a defect occurs you will have to apply for a new way-leave before the service may be repaired.

- 40. Arrangements must be made with the provincial or local traffic department to be present while work is in progress on the road. This clause may be ignored if you make use of the method where the pipe is pushed underneath the road, but clause 3 will still apply.
- 41. The joints of the pipes beneath the road must be watertight and you will be responsible for any damage to the road and road reserve because of leakages. (Not applicable in the case of power line cables).
- 42. (a) You will be required to furnish the above-mentioned District Manager with a deposit of R ...N/A... to cover the cost of reinstating the road surface.
 - (b) You will be required to furnish the above-mentioned District Manager with a works order to cover the cost of reinstating the road surface.
 - (c) You must reinstate the road surface to the entire satisfaction of the above-mentioned District Manager and it must be to the specifications of Roads Branch.
- 43. The work shall only be carried out provided the above-mentioned GENERAL, SPECIFIC and SPECIAL conditions are accepted in writing.

- The method of construction (i.e. through a culvert, pipe jacking, opening of track by hand or an overhead crossing.)
- f) Give an indication of the duration for which protection will have to be provided by Transnet.
- g) The numbers of the electrification structures on each side of proposed crossing.

1.PURPOSE.

The activity is the proposed upgrading of the bulk water supply to the Greater Mamusa area Schweizer-Reneke, North West province. According to the Draft Basic Assessment Report the pipe line will connect to an existing pipe in the Bloemhof Dam wall and parallel with the dam until reaching a gravel road used by the Department of Water Affairs. The pipe line will be laid within the road reserves and within Schweizer-Reineke, the pipe line will pass through the out skits of the town and then follow Buiten street to the reservoir.

The report indicated that there are number of camel thorn trees(Acacia) trees protected in terms of the National Forest Act 84 of 1998 which were identified within or near the proposed pipe line route. Most of the camel thorn trees were accommodated as far as possible during the construction phase. The purpose of the visit was to verify what's in the report and to give inputs on what needs to happen regarding those protected trees that need to be removed.

DISCUSSION.

During site inspection visit with Mr PJ Dupreez we realized that indeed many camel thorn trees were accommodated as far as possible, from the camel thorn tree which is situated next to the reservoir, which will be avoided to those situated between the reservoir and Eskom substation. The report indicated seven Camel thorn trees along the R34 Road and tree no 3 which is situated next to JBJ machinery will need to be removed and tree number 4, we put a question mark as there may be a need to remove it completely. It was discovered that at the end towards Bloemhof there is one larger Camel thorn tree larger than 6m and the advise that I gave to Mr Dupreez was to find possible way to avoid cutting it and there is enough space where the pipe line can be laid without affecting the Camel thorn tree.

3.WAY FORWARD.

A license for removal of one or two identified camel thorn trees will need to be obtained from the Department Of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries before those trees are removed the reason being that Camel thon trees are protected in terms of section 15 of the National Forest Act 84 of 1998 of which the application form is attached to this report.
