Please be advised that SiVEST were appointed as the Independent Environmental Assessment Practitioner (EAP) to undertake the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) processes for these projects only. This means that we are only responsible for undertaking the environmental studies and for obtaining a license (referred to as an Environmental Authorisation - EA) from the National Department of Environment, Forestry and Fisheries (DEFF) to allow the developers to construct and operate these projects. SiVEST are not involved in the actual construction or operation of the projects and thus can unfortunately not assist with potential jobs.

Also, it might be another 2 or 3 years until they start constructing these projects, should they receive their authorisations from the DEFF and should they be successful in their "bidding" process (if projects are selected as preferred bidders in the next "bid Window"). 

Interested and/or Affected Parties (I&APs), stakeholders and Organs of State (OoS) / Authorities who contributed issues ranging across all sectors of society are recorded in this Comments and Response Report (C&RR). Full record of every issue raised is available from the public participation office and is also included in **Appendix 7D** of the Final Basic Assessment Report (FBAR).

As mentioned in the FBAR, although the solar PV energy facility (part of a separate on-going EIA process with **DEFF Ref No.:** 14/12/16/3/3/2/1135) and associated electrical infrastructure (132kV overhead power line, on-site substation and collector substation) was assessed separately, a single public participation process was undertaken to consider all of the proposed projects [i.e. three (3) solar PV energy facility Environmental Impact Assessments (EIAs) and three (3) grid connection Basic Assessments (BAs)]. As such, correspondence received before the BA process was initiated, which is applicable to the proposed associated electrical infrastructure development, has been included in this C&RR. All comments in the C&RR are verbatim as received. Similar issues raised have been grouped together. The name, affiliation and date of the commentator are also indicated. Technical comments made by the project team are not included in the C&RR.

All I&APs, stakeholders and OoS were notified about the availability of the DBAR and the 30-day review and comment period. All issues raised and comments received to date have been provided in **Appendix 7D** of the FBAR. Evidence that all identified and relevant authorities have been given an opportunity to comment on the proposed development is provided in Table 30 in Section 9.8 of the Final Basic Assessment Report (FBAR). Attempts were made to contact all key stakeholders / organs of state who did not comment on the DBAR. Proof of this follow-up is also included in Appendix 7I of this FBAR. All I&APs, stakeholders and OoS / authorities were provided with an opportunity to comment on the report. It should be noted that additional meetings were not undertaken during the DBAR's 30-day review and comment period. 14/12/16/3/3/2/1135), meetings were undertaken to present the proposed solar PV and grid connection infrastructure (substations and power lines) developments to the public and solicit comments and/or concerns. This was done as a single public participation process was undertaken to consider all of the proposed developments which form part of the greater Umsobomvu PV project [i.e. three (3) solar PV energy facility EIAs and three (3) grid connection BAs]. Two (2) meetings were undertaken during this time, namely one (1) Public Meeting and one (1) Focus Group Meeting (FGM). SiVEST therefore distributed the presentations and minutes of the meetings which were undertaken during the 30-day review and comment period of the DEIAr for the proposed solar PV energy facility and requested that the affected and adjacent landowners provide comments (where possible) if they felt this was necessary. SiVEST also used this as an opportunity to answer any questions the landowners had (if any). In addition, Ward Councillors were utilised in order to distribute / share information with members of the affected communities, as well as to distribute / share the presentations and minutes of the above-mentioned meetings (see **Section 8.9** of FBAR for details).

It should be noted that a hard copy of the FBAR (including appendices) cannot be delivered to the DEFF's head office (at the physical address contained in the form) as the DEFF are no longer accepting hard copies of reports. This is as a result of the national lockdown period which was enforced as a result of the national state of disaster declared for the COVID-19 pandemic. #### 4. Communication Related Comments / Issues

With regards to the section 38 development application process, only developments that are applied for in terms of section 38(1) of the NRHA require that the relevant Heritage Resources Authority is notified at the earliest phase via a NID document. HWC has a form, however, if an application to SAHRA is submitted via SAHRIS, the SAHRIS application acts as a NID document. Other documents such as project motivation and map etc. can be uploaded as additional documents.

If the application is being conducted in terms of section 38(8) of the NHRA, then no NID is required as 38(1) does not apply when a 38(8) process is undertaken. Here we require the BID or announcement letter, the draft BAR and appendices, or the draft scoping with appendices, and draft EIA with appendices to provide comments.

With regards to the Northern Cape Provincial Heritage Resources Authority (http://www.nbkb.org.za/), the NCPHRA does not have the authority to provide comments on section 38 application with the exception that if a structure as defined and protected by section 34 is impacted, then the NCPHRA must be consulted for comments. The Final Comments Letter from SHARA has been forwarded to the applicant for consideration.

- The SAHRA Archaeology, Palaeontology and Meteorites (APM) Unit's comment stating that they have no objections to the proposed development has been duly acknowledged.
- The recommendations of the respective specialists (which are supported by SAHRA) have been incorporated into the FBAR and Draft EMPr (Appendix 8 of FBAR) accordingly, and will be strictly be adhered to.
- Based on the comments received from SAHRA, the following recommendations / mitigation measures / impact management actions have been included in the Draft EMPr (Appendix 8 of FBAR):
  - 38(4)c(i) If any evidence of archaeological sites or remains (e.g. remnants of stone-made structures, indigenous ceramics, bones, stone artefacts, ostrich eggshell fragments, charcoal and ash concentrations), fossils or other categories of heritage resources are found during the proposed development, SAHRA APM Unit (Natasha Higgitt / Phillip Hine: 021 462 5402) must be alerted as per section 35(3) of the NHRA. Noncompliance with section of the NHRA is an offense in terms of section 51(1)e of the NHRA and item 5 of the Schedule; and
  - 38(4)c(ii) If unmarked human burials are uncovered, the SAHRA Burial Grounds and Graves (BGG) Unit (Thingahangwi Tshivhase / Mimi Seetelo: 012 320 8490), must be alerted immediately as per section 36(6) of the NHRA. Non-compliance with section of the NHRA is an offense in terms of section 51(1)e of the NHRA and item 5 of the Schedule.

\*Only the results for the Wonderheuvel Grid infrastructure will be discussed below.

The proposed development area is underlain by the Adelaide Subgroup with a small section located in the Tarkastad Subgroup and a smaller section located in the Karoo Dolerite Suite. These rocks are overlain by Quaternary aeolian and superficial deposits. No fossils are evident in the Karoo Dolerite Suite, while the Adelaide Subgroup is known to include vertebrate and invertebrate fossils, plant remains and trace fossils. Some vertebrate fossils are known to be present in the Tarkastad Subgroup rocks including fossil fish, millipedes and trace fossils. Quaternary group fossils are rare and include mammalian fossils, reptiles, shells, plant remains, stromatolites and trace fossils. One in-situ Lystrosaurus skull from the Tarkastad Subgroup was identified on Mooi Plaats 121, approximately 80 m from Power line Route Alternative 2 and 3.

Recommendations provided in the report include the following:

- It is recommended that a 50 m buffer will be placed around the Lystrosaurus skull. It has been identified as Highly Sensitive and No-go area.
- In the event that construction is necessary in this sensitive area, it is recommended that the fossil be collected by a professional palaeontologist. Preceding excavation of any fossil material, the specialist would need to apply for a collection permit from SAHRA. Fossil material must be curated
- in an accredited collection (museum or university collection), while all fieldwork and reports should meet the minimum standards for palaeontological impact studies suggested by SAHRA:
- A Chance Fossils Finds Procedure has been recommended and provided in the report.

It should be noted that a Final EMPr will be submitted to the DEFF for review and approval prior to construction commencing. The Final EMPr will subsequently also be submitted to SAHRA for record purposes.

- The EAP will ensure that the Applicant / Developer is referred to section 51(1) of the NHRA, which deals with offences and penalties, and that this is understood and taken into consideration accordingly. The Final Comments Letter from SHARA has been forwarded to the applicant for consideration.
- The EAP will ensure that the following conditions are adhered to should the Applicant / Developer need to appoint specialists:
  - i) If heritage resources are uncovered during the course of the development, a professional archaeologist or palaeontologist, depending on the nature of the finds, must be contracted as soon as possible to inspect the heritage resource. If the newly discovered heritage resources prove to be of archaeological or palaeontological significance, a Phase 2 rescue operation may be required subject to permits issued by SAHRA.
- It should be noted that the FBAR was not finalised without the Final Comment from SAHRA. The FBAR was only submitted to the DEFF on the 08th of August 2020 (due to the national lockdown period declared for the national state of disaster as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, with effect from 27 March 2020). The FBAR has thus addressed the Final Comment from SAHRA (where required) and has also taken the comments into consideration. The Final Comment from SAHRA has also been forwarded directly to the competent authority for their consideration in the decision-making process as requested.

\*Only the results for the Wonderheuvel Grid infrastructure will be discussed below.

A total of four heritage resources were identified within the proposed power line routes. These include two small, circular shaped stone walled enclosure of medium significance (UMS004 and UMS006A), and two low-density surface scatter of Later Stone Age (LSA) lithics (UMS005 and 005B). The Lystrosaurus skull noted in the HIA report (UMS10A and UMS10B) was discussed in the Palaeontological report above.

Recommendations provided in the report include the following:

- Implement a 30 m buffer around heritage sites;
- Development of chance finds procedure to be included in the EMPr.

#### **Final Comment**

\*It must be noted that the following comments are issued for the Northern Cape sections of the proposed development. Comments from the ECPHRA must be sought for the Eastern Cape sections of the proposed development.

The following comments are made as a requirement in terms of section 3(4) of the NEMA Regulations and section 38(8) of the NHRA in the format provided in section 38(4) of the NHRA and must be included in the Final BAR and EMPr:

- 38(4)a The SAHRA Archaeology, Palaeontology and Meteorites (APM) Unit no objections to the proposed development;
- 38(4)b The recommendations of the specialists are supported and must be adhered to. Additional further

Proof of the delivery and receipt thereof will be uploaded to the SAHRIS case for record purposes.

The FBAR and Draft EMPr (Appendix 8 of the FBAR) will be submitted to SAHRA for record purposes, as requested. These will be uploaded to SAHRIS, as required. As mentioned, a Final EMPr will be submitted to the DEFF for review and approval prior to construction commencing. The Final EMPr will subsequently also be submitted to SAHRA (via SAHRIS) for record purposes.

Once issued by the DEFF, the decision regarding the EA Application will be communicated to SAHRA and uploaded to the SAHRIS Case application, as requested. It should be noted that once the DEFF have acknowledged receipt of the FBAR, the DEFF will have 107 days to either grant or refuse the EA for the proposed development.

- additional specific conditions are provided for the development as follows:
- 38(4)c(i) If any evidence of archaeological sites or remains (e.g. remnants of stone-made structures, indigenous ceramics, bones, stone artefacts, ostrich eggshell fragments, charcoal and ash concentrations), fossils or other categories of heritage resources are found during the proposed development, SAHRA APM Unit (Natasha Higgitt / Phillip Hine 021 462 5402) must be alerted as per section 35(3) of the NHRA. Non-compliance with section of the NHRA is an offense in terms of section 51(1)e of the NHRA and item 5 of the Schedule;
- 38(4)c(ii) If unmarked human burials are uncovered, the SAHRA Burial Grounds and Graves (BGG) Unit (Thingahangwi Tshivhase / Mimi Seetelo 012 320 8490), must be alerted immediately as per section 36(6) of the NHRA. Noncompliance with section of the NHRA is an offense in terms of section 51(1)e of the NHRA and item 5 of the Schedule;
- 38(4)d See section 51(1) of the NHRA;
- 38(4)e The following conditions apply with regards to the appointment of specialists:
  - i) If heritage resources are uncovered during the course of the development, a professional archaeologist or palaeontologist, depending on the nature of the finds, must be contracted as soon as possible to inspect the heritage resource. If the newly discovered heritage resources prove to be of archaeological or palaeontological significance, a Phase 2 rescue operation may be required subject to permits issued by SAHRA;
