APPENDIX 2 – PUBLIC PARTICIPATION PROCESS

I&APs play an important role in the process, as many of their concerns and issues can be included in the project proposal, to ensure a development which is as environmentally and socially acceptable as possible. In order to inform the public of the proposed project and to invite members of the public to register as I&APs, the proposed project was advertised in the Rustenburg Herald, Background Information Documents (BIDs) were hand delivered, posted or emailed and site notices were placed in conspicuous areas on site. This is in accordance with the legal requirements as set out by the MPRDA, NEMA and the 2014 EIA Regulations (and amended 07 April 2017). A more detailed description of these activities is included below:

Based on a Windeed search conducted on the 1st of September 2018, it was established that the relevant properties are registered to the National Government of the Republic of South Africa. In order to determine which government department has jurisdiction in relation to these properties, EOH CES contacted Cllr Diphetogo Mmolawa, as there were no contact details available for Cllr Karel Sedile at the time of enquiry. EOH CES was referred to Mr Mmope at the Moses Kotane Local Municipality. Mr Mmope in turn referred us to Mr Daniel Masina at the Department of Rural Development and Land Reform, who confirmed that the properties are under the custodianship of the Department of Rural Development and Land Reform, EOH CES requested the contact details of the land occupiers in order to inform them of the proposed prospecting activities, however no information in regards to this has been received to date. As such EOH CES conducted a site visit on the 28th of September 2018, in order to notify land occupiers of the proposed development. Representatives of EOH CES met with the deputy head of the community trust in the area, Mr Mandisi. He stated that the land is managed by the community trust and as such a BID was hand delivered to him. A number of BIDs were also left at the community center for distribution to the local communities in the area. BIDs were also left for collection at the general store.

Local, provincial and national government departments, as well as adjacent landowners were sent notification letters and BIDs via e-mail. Where e-mail addresses were not available, these documents were sent via registered mail. In addition, a notification advertisement was placed in the Rustenburg Herald newspaper on the 12th of October 2018 and two (2) site notices were placed in conspicuous sites along the boundary of the proposed prospecting area (co-ordinates site notice 1: 24°54'33.50"S and 26°44'42.80"E; co-ordinates of site notice 2: 24°54'17.59"S and 26°46'14.62"E) from the 28th of September to present (21st of November 2018).

A comprehensive I&AP database was established using the baseline data and contact details obtained during the site visit. The Draft BAR and EMPr was made available for public review (a period of 30 calendar days, excluding public holidays) from the 19th of October 2018 until the 19th of November 2018. Three hard copies of the Draft Basic Assessment Report was made available at the Welverdiend Community Centre on 19 October 2018 and has yet to be removed. In addition, all registered I&APs were notified of the availability of the DBAR on the 19th of October via e-mail notifications. A second newspaper advert was placed to notify I&APs of the

availability of the Draft reports for review (in the Rustenburg Herald on the 28th of October). A meeting was held with the Amahlubi Traditional Council on the 5th of November 2018. In addition, a public meeting was held on the 14th of November 2018 at the Welverdiend Community Centre. All comments and concerns received (excluding the comments and responses during the public meeting which is included in the meeting minutes on page 221-223) have been included in the Issues and Response Trail (IRT) (Appendix 3). Eskom requirements for work in or near Eskom servitudes.


- Eskom's rights and services must be acknowledged and respected at all times.
- Eskom shall at all times retain unobstructed access to and egress from its servitudes.
- Eskom's consent does not relieve the developer from obtaining the necessary statutory, land owner or municipal approvals.
- Any cost incurred by Eskom as a result of non-compliance to any relevant environmental legislation will be charged to the developer.
- If Eskorn has to incur any expenditure in order to comply with statutory clearances or other regulations as a result of the developer's activities or because of the presence of his equipment or installation within the servitude restriction area, the developer shall pay such costs to Eskorn on demand.
- 6. The use of explosives of any type within 500 metres of Eskom's services shall only occur with Eskom's previous written permission. If such permission is granted the developer must give at least fourteen working days prior notice of the commencement of blasting. This allows time for arrangements to be made for supervision and/or precautionary instructions to be issued in terms of the blasting process. It is advisable to make application separately in this regard.
- Changes in ground level may not infringe statutory ground to conductor clearances or statutory visibility clearances. After any changes in ground level, the surface shall be rehabilitated and stabilised so as to prevent erosion. The measures taken shall be to Eskom's satisfaction.
- 8. Eskom shall not be liable for the death of or injury to any person or for the loss of or damage to any property whether as a result of the encroachment or of the use of the servitude area by the developer, his/her agent, contractors, employees, successors in title, and assignees. 



If you are aware of any change in the description of the above property after 19 June 1913 kindly supply us with such description so as to enable us to do further search.



COMMENTS ON A BASIC ASSESSMENT REPORT AND ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT PROGRAMME SUBMITTED IN TERMS OF REGULATION 19 (1) OF THE NATIONAL ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT ACT, 1998 (ACT NO.107 OF 1998): ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT REGULATIONS, 2014 AS AMENDED IN SUPPORT OF APPLICATION FOR AN ENVIRONMENTAL AUTHORISATIONS IN RESPECT OF THE FARMS DE PAARL 246 KP, GOEDGEDAACHT 255 KP, BEDFORD 254 KP AND SYFERBULT 257 KP, SITUATED IN THE MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT OF MANKWE, NORTH WEST REGION.

1. We confirm having received your basic assessment report and environmental management programme report (BAR) on the 19th October 2018.

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Ref No.: NW 30/5/1/1/3/2/1/ (12380) EM

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- 2. This letter serves to inform you that your BAR was reviewed by this office and found to be unacceptable since it does not contain and addressed the following:
 - **2.1** A locality map which shows the nearest town and environmental features at a scale not smaller than 1:250 000.
 - 2.2 Your BAR shows that the proposed prospecting operation will be conducted using drilling and trenching methods, however, the total number of trenches and their dimensions were not specified. It was noted that the surface area which will be disturbed per each borehole and the dimensions of the sumps associated with the drilling programme were also not provided.
 - 2.3 Your BAR has also shown that the South African Heritage Resource Agency (SAHRA) has been notified regarding the proposed prospecting operation however, there is no proof as to how SAHRA was consulted.
 - 2.4 Your BAR shows that the current land use within the proposed prospecting area is livestock farming, you are therefore required to provide specific mitigation measures related to such land use considering that part of proposed prospecting methods is trenching.
 - **2.5** Your public participation process was also reviewed and found to be unacceptable due to the following:
 - a) Your draft BAR made a commitment to hold a meeting within the 30 days mandatory public participation period however, no minutes and attendance register was submitted to this office.
 - b) Your newspaper advertisement and site notice did not run for the period of 30 days as prescribed by regulation 3(8) of the Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations, 2014 as amended. Kindly also note that Appendix 2 of your BAR shows that advertisement on Rustenburg Herald was done on the 10th October 2018 while the actual newspaper advertisement was published on the 12th October 2018.
 - c) Your BAR does not show as to how other organs of states such as National Department of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries, Department of Rural, Environmental and Agricultural Development, Department of Water and Sanitation and North West: Provincial

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- Heritage Resources Agency/ South African Heritage Resource Agency have been consulted regarding the draft BAR.
- d) Your BAR has also specified that the BID was hand delivered to Mr Mandisi (Deputy Head of Community Trust) however, no proof to confirm that indeed such document was delivered to Mr Mandisi.
- e) Appendix 2 (table of comments and responses) first and third column does not show the organization/ individual who raise comments and how the EAP has respond to such comments.
- 2.6 Your BAR has also specified that part of the proposed prospecting area falls within Critical Biodiversity Area, you are therefore required to consult with the Department of Environmental Affairs in particular Biodiversity Section in order to obtain necessary mitigation measures.
- 2.7 Your Paleontological study attached to your BAR as Annexure C was also reviwed and found to questionable considering that it was compiled based on the desktop information not fieldwork.
- 2.8 Item (d) (ii) of the BAR has specified that approximately 5000 litres of water will be required per day for the proposed prospecting activities. It was further stated that the required water may be abstracted form a borehole or other water sources on site. This statement is contradicting with the subsequent paragraph on (iii) which states that a water used Authorisation has not been applied for based on the limited amount of water required and the current uncertainty if water will be abstracted form a borehole and/or other water sources on site. Our view as the Department is that, if the applicant will or is intending to use water for proposed prospecting operation, the source of such water must be specified and a water used registration from the Department of Water and Sanitation and or water used agreement between the applicant and the water supplier must be submitted to this office.
- 2.9 This office has also noted that your BAR was not numbered.
- 2.10 Kindly also note that your quantum of financial provision for the rehabilitation and/or management of negative environmental impacts to the amount of R226, 040.26 as projected by yourselves was evaluated however, this

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Department is not in a position to confirm the adequacy of your proposed amount due to the following:

a) The master rate which were used to calculate the proposed financial provision appears to be below the Consumer Price Index (CPI) average as published by the Statistics South Africa.

b) The dimensions and total number of trenches associated with the proposed prospecting activities was not specified on the BAR.

c) The area which will be disturbed per each borehole and sizes of the sumps associated with the drilling programmes was also not specified.

3. In order for this Department to efficiently evaluate your BAR, you are hereby required to revise your BAR of which two (2) copies must be submitted manually to this office. The revised BAR must contain all the comments specified on paragraph 2 above. The revised BAR and EMPr requested above must be submitted to this office on or before the 05th December 2018.

4. It must be noted that if the EAP/applicant is unwilling or unable to comply with the prescribed timeframes and to adequately address the comments specified above, your application for Environmental Authorisation will be refused without any further communication to you.

5. Further note that Department reserves the right to revise initial comments and request further information to you, based on the revised information.
