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## Challenge

- The currently existing Muslim Cemetery is nearing capacity
- Therefore there is an urgent need for additional burial ground

- Newcastle Local Municipality appointed Udidi Environmental, Planning and Development Consultants to manage the environmental authorization process for this development
- Such a project requires environmental studies to be undertaken in accordance with EIA Regulations
- Public participation forms a crucial part of the proposed extension

## **STUDY AREA**



## **Description of Study Area:**

- It is located on Municipal owned land
- Adjacent to the existing Muslim Cemetery on Firlkirk Street property Re/1A,
- Approximately 1,136 hectares
- Currently being used as an illegal dumping site
- Surrounded by light industrial activities

# **ENVIRONMENTAL AUTHORIZATION PROCESS**

- The establishment of a cemetery is a listed activity in need of a Basic Environmental Impact Assessment as detailed in the Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations Government Notices R543 and R544 in terms of Section 24 (5) as promulgated under the National Environment Management Act , (Act no. 107 of 1998)
- Requires provincial authorization from the Department of Agricultural and Environmental Affairs

# **POTENTIAL ISSUES IDENTIFIED**

## **Biophysical**

Excavation may be a problem due to:

- The presence of certain rock types
- The illegal dumping of rubble which has occurred over the years
- Contamination of ground and surface water sources
- It has been noted that most of the natural vegetation has already been disturbed by illegal dumping of rubble

## Socio-economic

- High potential cost relating to the excavation
- The size of suitable land available

- To identify Interested and Affected Parties (I&AP's)
- To inform and provide information of the proposed project to the I&AP's
- Give the public the opportunity to raise concerns and also provide input into the project

#### **Public announcements**


