### **AIM OF THIS DOCUMENT**

The purpose of this document is to ensure that **people interested in** or **affected by the proposed project** are **provided with information about the proposal, the process being followed** and **provided with an opportunity to be involved** in the EIA process.

Registering as an **Interested and/or Affected Party** (I&AP) allows individuals or groups the opportunity to **contribute ideas, issues, and concerns regarding the project**. I&APs also have an opportunity to **review all reports and submit comments** on those reports. All comments received are included in the reports submitted to the Competent Authority.

### **BACKGROUND**

Chris Hani District Municipality is proposing the development of new waste water treatment works (WWTW) and a sewage pipeline in Ngcobo Eastern Cape. The existing municipal sewage works are under-capacitated to treat the increased sewage production due to the expansion of the town of Ngcobo.




Figure 1: Locality of the existing Ngcobo sewage treatment works and proposed new works.

### THE ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT PRACTITIONER

### THE ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT PROCESS

EOH-CES has been appointed by Goba (Pty) Ltd to undertake the necessary environmental investigations for the Ngcobo sanitation project and pipeline, and to apply for approval from National Department of Environmental Affairs for the construction and operation of the WWTW, as required by South Africa's environmental legislation. Details of the relevant laws, and an overview of the environmental impact assessment process, are provided below.

### **RELEVANT LEGISLATION**

According to the EIA regulations (2014) promulgated under the National Environmental Management Act (No.107 of 1998, NEMA) the potential impacts on the environment will have to be assessed in terms of the listed activities. The development of the Ngcobo WWTW and the pipeline triggers listed activities in terms of Government Gazette R983, and as such requires the completion of a Basic Impact Assessment which will be undertaken in accordance with Regulation 6 of the EIA Regulations (2014). The listed activities are provided in Table 1 below.

### PROJECT DESCRIPTION

**Decision on BAR by DEDEAT** 

The proposed activity involves:

- the decommissioning of the existing WWTW




Figure 2: Map showing the existing WWTW, the pipeline route to the proposed new WWTW and the five watercourse crossings that were identified along the pipeline route.

- the construction of a new WWTW with a capacity to treat approximately 3Me of waste water per day facility south of Ngcobo (Figure 2); and
- the required 250 to 315 mm diameter pipeline (approximately 3.5 km) for the town of Ngcobo.

Engcobo Local Municipality (ELM) is currently focused on extensive developmental growth and a number of housing developments will necessitate a WWTW that has the capacity to treat the proposed and future sewage production. The existing municipal WWTW is overloaded and is not capable of treating the incoming sewage to a satisfactory standard. The current situation together with the expansion of the town itself necessitates the installation of a more efficient and reliable WWTW.

### **POTENTIAL IMPACTS AND BENEFITS**

Site-specific assessments will be undertaken as part of the EIA process in order to confirm the feasibility of the proposal in terms of the environment; to delineate any areas of environmental sensitivity within the study area and also examine factors that may preclude the development of a new WWTW (i.e. the "No Go" option).

### **Potential Benefits of the Sanitation Facility**

According to the project proponent, the motivation for the proposed project arose from the following potential benefits:

- Proper treatment of sewage produced by Engcobo Local Municipality.
- Unlocking the expansion and economic potential of the town of Ngcobo.
