Reasons for Decision

- 5. The objectives and requirements of relevant legislation, policies and guidelines, including Section 2 and 23 of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act No. 107 of 1998) and the Northern Cape Conservation Act, 2009 (Act No. 9 of 2009).
- 6. The findings of the site visit that was undertaken by Mr. Williamson and Mrs D. Werth of DENC on the 25th February 2021.

Appeal

An appellant must submit the appeal to the appeal administrator (DENC), and a copy of the appeal to the applicant, any registered interested and affected part and any organ of state with interest in the matter within 20 days from the date that the notification of the decision was sent to the applicant by the competent authority.

In the instance where an appeal is lodged, you may not commence with the activity until such time that the appeals is finalised.

An appeal submission must be submitted in writing in the form obtainable from the appeal administrator and must be accompanied by:

- i. A statement setting out the grounds of appeal;
- ii. Supporting documentation which is referred to in the appeal submission; and
- iii. A statement, including supporting documentation, by the appellant to confirm that all interested and affected parties, including the applicant and organs of state, received the appeal.
