The grade one learners participated in a fine motor and sensory skills competition, the educator, Ma'am Merriam, did a paper tearing activity to improve learners' fine motor and sensory skills.

In this activity, learners tear and paste pieces of paper to make shapes. It helps to build hand strength, improve hand-eye coordination, and improve the ability of hands to work and write better.

Grade one learner, Tlaleletso Nkgudi, won this fun-filled competition.

Grade two and three learners participated in a reading competition.

Preliminary rounds were held. In the finals, the learners had to read a prepared and unprepared passage to win the competition, which was assessed by three judges.

The aspects evaluated were pronunciation, fluency, clarity and enunciation and intonation - how the voice rises and falls during speech.

Learner Amora Mulambo won the grade two reading competition and Tharollo Matlala won the grade three reading competition.
