Application for Environmental Authorisation and Section 102 Amendment - Wonderstone Ltd: Driekuil Mine Expansion

Wonderstone conducted a NEMA, Regulation 34 Environmental Audit during 2019. The audit was completed and submitted to the DMRE on 5 December 2019. Various areas for improvement were identified in the specific Environmental Audit.

The DMRE provided Wonderstone with a letter response, dated 13 February in which the department:

- Acknowledged the receipt of the Regulation 34 Environmental Audit Report.
- Acknowledged that there a non-compliances and partial compliances with certain provisions of the approved EMP and that there are aspects which are "unachievable conditions or measures for implementation", also the observations made in terms of the WRD having been constructed on a water resources.
- Requested that the mine indicate a plan on how and when the contraventions indicated in the Audit report will be
- Requested a review on the adequacy of the Financial Provision previously submitted in the form of a bank guarantee on 29 March 2011.


Based on the outcomes of the Regulation 34 Audit, and the request issued by the Department of Mineral Resources and Energy (DMRE) as the Competent Authority, the mine has appointed external consultants to conduct the update of the Wonderstone EMPr to address the shortcomings of the current EMPr. In addition to this, various specialist studies have been commissioned to consider the current site conditions and to provide site specific considerations in terms of Best Practical Environmental Management Options to be implemented on site, as the management measures provided in the EMPr are very broad, which results in uncertainty in the implementation of specific requirements. Due to changes in the mine plan, the project was place on hold and is now submitted as a new Application.
