	She explained that the proposed development is the construction of the bulk water supply scheme which will aid in the issue of water scarcity in the area of Creighton. Which will ensure sufficient long-term water supply for the town of Creighton.		
	She briefly explained that the development will consist of abstraction works. This will be the abstraction of water at the uMzimkhulu river at the Centowcow Abstraction point. The water will be treated at the Centow Cow water treatment plant which will be upgraded. A new storage facility will be constructed closer to Creighton town.		
	With the use of presentation slides, Miss Dladla explained the intended environmental process for the proposed development, which is the Basic Assessment Process. She discussed the legal requirements for the project which is the NEMA and how the environmental assessment will provide a rational approach to sustainable development. She explained that the Basic Assessment process will help to obtain the necessary permits and licenses before construction will commence.	N/A	N/A
	She stated that Basic Assessment Process will include the specialist assessment and the Public participation process. She explained meeting with the affected landowners is part of the Public Participation Process. This process ensures that all Interested and Affected Parties are part of the decision-making process.

	Raised a question regarding the option to abstract the water from the Centocow abstraction point instead of the uMzimkhulu abstraction point. He stated that the abstraction point at uMzimkhulu is much closer as opposed to the Centocow abstraction point.

	ND Responded that the uMzimkhulu abstraction was one of the options that were analyzed for the project.	N/A	N/A
	However, the uMzimkhulu abstraction point required a new water treatment plant with a new storage facility (reservoir), hence more area was going to be required for the facilities. The pressure was also not going to be sufficient to supply for the entire Creighton area.		
	ID Assured to send the preliminary engineering design report to the landowners for their perusal. This will help to understand all ptions that were analyzed for the project and the reason why each ption was not selected.
