ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT FOR PROPOSED SOIL EROSION REHABILITATION MEASURES: RICHMOND, NORTHERN CAPE

She Management JV Enviroworks is currently undertaking an environmental impact assessment process on behalf of the Department of Agriculture, for the installation of reclamation measures on land degraded by soil erosion.

The proposed development sites fall on commonage land to be used for grazing. The following coordinates comprise the locations for these rehabilitation structures: 31 23'13.99"S; 23 58' 24.22"E and 31 23'18.04"S; 23 58'21.27"E, west of the N1 (towards Hanover) and northwest of Richmond Town, Northern Cape.

Two structures are proposed to be installed at the erosion system, one at the head and a second on the mid-point, each flanked by a bund wall. These structures are under 300m in length and within than the 1ha demarcation. It is therefore of our impression that this activity is exempt from the Section 38 conditions of the National Heritage Resources Act of 1999.

We are however mindful that, should any archaeological (including human skeletal remains) or paleontological sites or members be encountered during the cause of rehabilitation the find will be reported to SAHRA and an archaeologist / palaeontologist contacted to inspect the site.

In light of the above, could you please advise on what the process is to obtain exemption for the activity.
