Thank you for submitting the Phase 1 Archaeological Impact Assessment for the above proposed development.

It is noted on page 17 of the Impact Assessment report that the power line alternatives were spot checked, but that it was mostly subjected to desktop assessment. However, on page 18 it is also indicated that the power line corridors were only assessed via desktop research. It is therefore not clear if spot checks were performed. The specialist also do not specify which of the two options would be preferred from a heritage perspective, but indicates that stone age scatters and rock

Because no substantial evidence is provided to provide SAHRA with meaningful confidence to recommend one corridor over the other, the following is recommended:

Recommendations:

1. A Palaeontological Impact Assessment will be required for the Power Line Corridors. At this stage this could be done at a Desktop level to scope the prefer alternative. The prefered alternative must be subject to a final walk-down.

2. A more detailed archaeological desktop assessment must be provided for the corridors. The preferred alternative must be subject to a final walk-down.

3. If significant archaeological/archaeological resources are found, SAHRA (Phillip Hine/Colette Scheermeyer, tel. 021 462 4502) and an archaeologist/palaeontologist must be contacted immediately to inspect the findings. If the newly discovered heritage resource is considered significant mitigation may be required. A permit will be required from the responsible heritage resources authority.
