5.1.1 Visual impact & Safety and Health

Daily monitoring will be conducted for visual, safety and health inspection to monitor if this complies with the conditions of the EMP. Reporting of environmental incidents through incident reporting structure. Environmental incidents that occur on site will be reported to Caditrix (Pty) Ltd's representatives. 6.1 Rehabilitation plan

A magnetic survey will be conducted upon approval to give an overview of the physical properties of the property, while drilling will commence as soon as equipment can be secured and moved to site. The drilling process determined by local conditions but can generally be based on about 25m per rig per day for a week. A number of diamond drill holes will be drilled in the strategic locations to fill the gaps and confirm existing holes and information derived from the magnetic field survey.

The rehabilitation plan shall entail removal of all generated waste, infrastructures and materials, re-vegetation of disturbed and cleared areas, rehabilitation of access roads, ensuring the growth of the existing grasses and plants species and cleaning of spillages etc.

Amongst the more pronounced post-closure drilling impacts on record are landscape scarring in the form of un rehabilitated rock dump, as well as continuing environmental damage from polluted land, wind-blown dusts, papers, waste and the solid waste. During the site establishment and the drilling process/ prospecting 25 litres waste bins will be taken along to the site by the contractor. Waste will be removed and taken to the nearest permitted landfill site once a week. 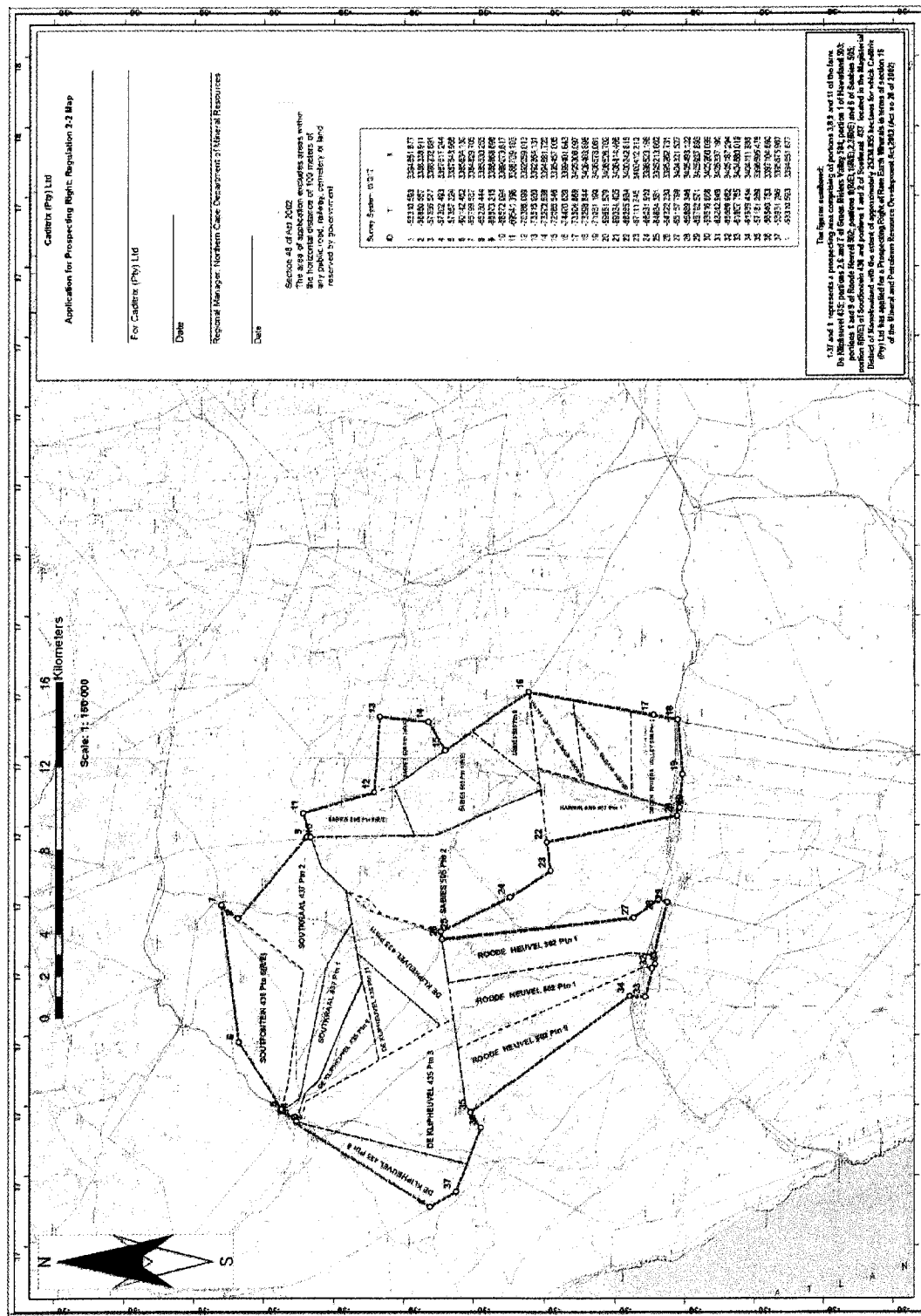

4.2 Description why the Geological formation substantiates the minerals to be prospected for:

The area applied for is located in the Namaqualand Metamorphic Province

This province includes a group of schistose and gneissic metasedimentary, metavolcanic and intrusive rock types in an area along the Orange River from Prieska in the east to the Atlantic coast in the west. To the north and to the south the province is overlain by younger sequences like the Nama Group and the Karoo Supergroup.

Statutory mapping programmes in recent years have concentrated the attention of the Northern Cape Unit on the Namaqualand Metamorphic Complex. Due to the complex history of intense deformation and metamorphism, many aspects concerning the province are still controversial and revision of stratigraphic correlations and genetic models is an ongoing process.

The province comprises supracrustal rocks that have been intensely deformed and metamorphosed, and a wide variety of intrusive rock types which are predominantly granitic. Metamorphism that has reached granulite facies, as well as deformation by folding and fluxion in a plastic state during metamorphism, characterise especially the western and central parts of this province.

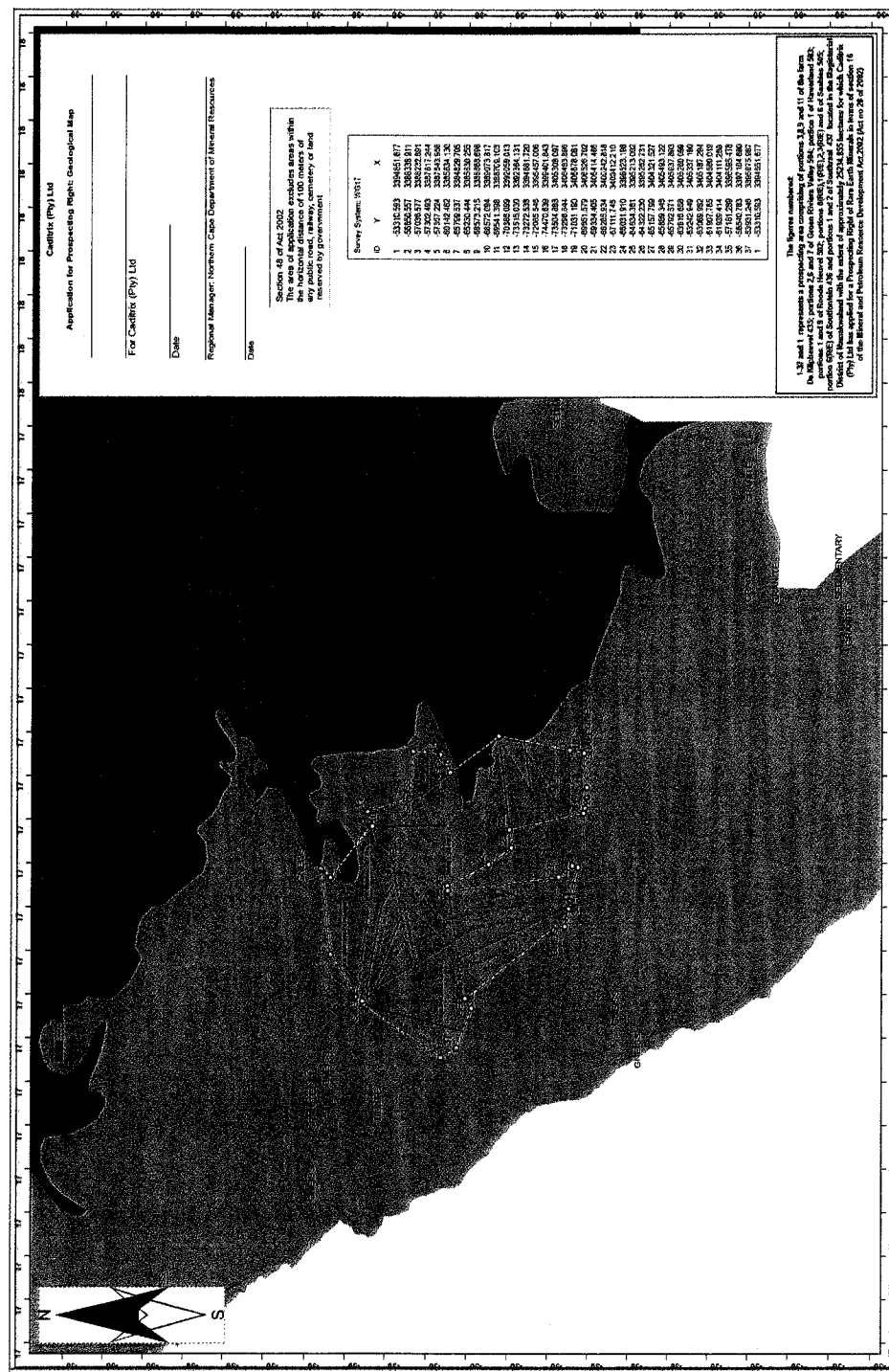
Rocks of the Brulpan Group structurally overlie the Olifantshoek Supergroup. They comprise a succession of highly folded schists, with minor greenstone and quartzite. The western margin of the Kaapvaal Craton is marked by three volcano-sedimentary successions; the 1300 Ma old Wilgenhoutsdrif and Arachap Groups and the undeformed 1100 Ma old Koras Group.

The northern part of the eastern boundary zone is intensely deformed by east-directed folding and thrusting, and is metamorphosed to lower greenschist facies. The boundary between the Namaqualand Metamorphic Province and the Kaapvaal Craton is characterized by a number of normal, reverse and wrench faults as well as a sharp transition in the grade of metamorphism and the tectonic pattern.

The floor to the Namaqualand Metamorphic Province has not been recognised (although some investigators in the past have claimed the recognition of such a floor). The volcanic Orange River Group in the Vioolsdrif area with its related intrusives of the Vioolsdrif batholith, are dated between 2 000 to 1 800 million years.

Many rock types in the province are dated at around 1 200 million years, which most likely do not display their true age but rather the age of metamorphic resetting of the radiometric clock by extreme metamorphic conditions. The end of the Namaqua orogenesis is marked by intrusion of the mafic Koperberg Suite (1 100 Ma), as well as the formation of the pegmatite belt, which is dated at around 1 000 million years.

A survey will be conducted upon approval to give an overview of the physical properties of the property, while drilling will commence as soon as equipment can be secured and moved to site. In terms of the National Heritage Resources Act, no 25 of 1999, heritage resources, including archaeological or palaeontological sites over 100 years old, graves older than 60 years and structures older than 60 years are protected. They may not be disturbed without a permit from the relevant heritage resources authority.

In terms of Section 38(8) of the NHRA, before any development proposed in terms of the MPRDA (2002) is approved, it is incumbent on the developer (or mine) to ensure that a **Heritage Impact Assessment** is done that satisfies Section 38(3) of the NHRA. Appropriate mitigation, which involves recording, sampling and dating sites that are to be destroyed, may be required depending on the nature and significance of the resources identified.

In your application received by SAHRA, no assessment of the impact of the proposed mining on heritage resources is provided.

SAHRA therefore requires that a Heritage Impact Assessment report be completed and submitted to SAHRA for assessment. This report should be inclusive of an assessment of impacts to archaeological resources and an assessment of impacts to palaeontological resources by suitably qualified practitioners. This assessment of heritage resources must satisfy Section 38(3) of the NHRA.

The requested Archaeological Report must identify all archaeological resources and assess their significance and make recommendations (as indicated in section 38(3) of the NHRA) about what mitigation may be required.

A Palaeontological study must be undertaken to assess whether or not the development will impact upon significant palaeontological resources. Alternatively, a letter of exemption from a Palaeontologist is required to indicate that this is unnecessary. If the area is deemed sensitive or if significant heritage is identified, a full Palaeontological Report may be required.


