






Site Notice #5: Placed at the farm entrance and boundary fence along the R350 between Bedford, Riebeek East and Makado



Nuclear watchdogs rip into regulator

Environmental and civil rights watchdogs have raised concerns about the absence of civil society representation on the board of the National Nuclear Regulator, an element required by law.

Koeberg Alert Alliance representative Peter Becker said according to the National Nuclear Regulator (NNR) Act, one member of the board had to be a civil society representative.

"However, when the cabinet announced a new board for the regulator on August 5, no such representative was included.

"This lack of representation is contributing to the ongoing weak governance at the regulator, the role of which is to monitor regulations compliance to ensure safety and the prevention of nuclear

Wildlife and Environment Society Algoa Bay chair Gary Koekemoer said the legal requirement for civil society representation on the board of the nuclear regulator was an example of how to ensure SA's democracy balanced environmental and citizen interests with those of the state and industry.

"Sustainable development and collective stewardship requires citizen participation and this becomes key in the nuclear industry where the mismanagement of toxic

waste, for instance, has severe consequences for future generations.'

Koekemoer said he had been actively involved, as part of NoPEnuke, in protesting against Eskom's bid to build a nuclear reactor at Thyspunt, between Cape St Francis and Oyster Bay, and supporting groups like the Thyspunt Alliance in their opposition on environmental and heritage

That decade-long battle resulted in the national environment department's record of decision in 2017 that the project should rather proceed at Duynefontein in the Western Cape, adjacent to the existing Koeberg reactor.

He said when democracy came into effect in 1994 it had included excellent environmental legislation with checks and balances.

"But lately some of the regulations coming out of the department have been used as a rubber-stamp exercise where government and industry attempt to short-cut the process.

"We would hope that we have learnt from the state capture debacle that short cuts serve vested interests only and not the interests of citizens."

Thyspunt Alliance spokesperson Trudi Malan said the organisation had, in fact, raised the lack of civil society representation on the board of the regulator while they were op-

posing the Thyspunt bid. "That was about three years

ago and all these years later we have still not heard back from them.'

> Southern African Faith Communities' Environment Institute (Safcei) executive director Francesca de Gasparis said the situation was unacceptable.

"Affected communities such as people living near Vaalputs, a radioactive waste dump in the Northern Cape, have the right to have a representative on the board who will represent their community and their interests for a safe and healthy environment.


"It is not right that mineral resources and energy minister Gwede Mantashe has not appointed a representative as stipulated in the Act."

Organisation Undoing Tax Abuse representative Liz McDaid said the organisation had also been trying without success to get answers from the authorities. Makoma Lekalakala from

Earthlife Africa Johannesburg said the organisation was concerned that the lack of a civil society representative on the regulator's board would mean no progress on cleaning up uranium-heavy toxic mine tailings around Johannesburg.

Becker noted that after Japan's 2011 Fukushima disaster, the International Atomic Energy Agency had recommended that nuclear regulators should be strengthened.

"Yet, according to the regulator's annual financial statements for 2018/2019, the gov-



ernment grant was R16.5m, nearly 20% less than the R20m grant in 2010/2011, just before

the Fukushima disaster." The regulator's annual report also showed that more than one in 10 posts at the agency were vacant, he said.

"If it is both underfunded and understaffed, is the regulator still able to adequately monitor safety at Koeberg?

"We would stand a better chance of knowing if we had a representative on the board, as required by law.

"The minister should immediately start the process of selecting a true representative of

civil society to serve on the National Nuclear Regulator board," he said.

Becker said that in addition to the non-compliance with the NNR Act, the prescribed process was also questionable.

"It is deeply problematic that we, as civil society, cannot elect our own representative, and that the Act allows this socalled representative to be appointed by the same minister who openly promotes nuclear

power." Mineral resources and energy department spokesperson Johannes Mokobane said the process to bring civil society

representation on the board of the regulator was under way.

"The minister has initiated a comprehensive consultative process with the National Economic Development and Labour Council and the South African National Civic Organisation aimed at identifying suitable candidates to be considered for appointment," Mokobane said.

"Upon conclusion of this process, the identified individuals will be considered by cabinet prior to their appointment being made effective and their identities being made public."

Still no word on lifting traditional circumcision ban

Contralesa, the provincial health department and NGOs have stepped up efforts to ensure a safe summer initiation season by making traditional surgeons and nurses aware of the regulations governing SA's Covid-19 response.

Co-operative governance and traditional affairs minister Nkosazana Dlamini-Zuma has not yet lifted the ban on traditional circumcisions, though the pressure to do so is mounting.

There have already been a series of illegal circumcisions in Buffalo City, OR Tambo and Amathole.

Contralesa provincial secretary Nkosi Mkhanyiseli Dudumayo said the surgeons and nurses were being taught how to apply Covid-19 regulations to the traditional practice.

Both Contralesa and the SA National Civic Organisation (Sanco), which met this week, are angry that an announcement lifting the circumcision ban has not been made.

Sanco provincial secretary Tony Duba said communities had been patient since June, but "that patience is fading". "We do not want anarchy

caused by illegal initiations,' Duba said. "We do not want an uncon-

trollable situation. "We want things to be done in accordance with the law, all Covid-19 regulations being observed."

Dudumayo said that at the meeting Contralesa deputy provincial chair Nkosi Langa

Mavuso had presented a proposal submitted to premier Oscar Mabuyane to open the summer season.

Dudumayo said Contralesa and Sanco were disappointed that traditional leadership had not yet received a response.

"While we are treated with contemptuous attitudes, there has been no supervision of the traditional initiation rite.

"There has been one fatality and initiates hospitalised. "To avert such a situation,

we call for the summer season to be opened. "Sanco leadership and

NGOs in the health sector will take responsibility, and a programme will see to it that a refresher course is undertaken by traditional surgeons to minimise any blunders that may occur," Dudumayo said.

Contralesa and Sanco agreed that both structures would engage Mabuyane and Cogta MEC Xolile Nqatha.

"The traditional initiation rite is not a recreational activity but a tradition of passage from boyhood to manhood.

"It is important that this institution which is protected in the main by the traditional leadership must be given the green light to continue.

"When the opening of [academic] schools was touted, it was said that schools were a controlled environment.

"We advance the same argument because there are responsible adults who are involved in the administration of the traditional rite of initiation," Dudumayo said. - Daily Dispatch





East Cape doctor passionate about family planning for rural women

With an inherent determination to help those less fortunate, an Eastern Cape doctor has opted to apply his set of skills to empower women in the far-flung regions of the province.

Dr Dylan Gibson, who is in his final year of the family medicine postgraduate programme at Walter Sisulu University in Mthatha, decided to focus his research on giving women in the rural Eastern Cape better education and access to effective family planning.

The decision led to the 34year-old receiving a Rural Individual Award from the Discovery Foundation to complete his study on contraception.

Gibson, who grew up in East London, said providing primary health care to the needy was among his motivations as it was the home of family medicine, but his parents were his greatest source of inspiration.

four children, Gibson lives at Madwaleni Provincial Hospital — about 80km from Mthatha — where he has worked as a community service doctor since 2013.

For his qualitative study on contraception, Gibson will be looking at women's percep-

tions and experiences of an intrauterine device, also known as the loop, inserted immediately after they have given birth.

He said SA had a high number of unplanned pregnancies and in some cases it was simply because of a lack of information.

"These pregnancies can be the result of contraceptive failure or a lack of knowledge of, or access to, different types of contraceptive methods. "Many women are only re-

ally familiar with the injectables, which are administered every three months," Gibson

"In the rural areas, women cannot always make it to follow-up appointments for a variety of reasons."

He said women were often not told about the full range of contraceptive options during their pregnancies and therefore relied on things they heard from their family,

friends and other community members.

"By the time women arrive at the hospital to deliver their babies, there isn't enough time to introduce them to a new contraceptive option such as the loop, and many women often end up choosing the method with which they are most comfortable."

Gibson said antenatal classes provided an opportunity to counsel women about the contraceptive options available to them.

"The right visual aids can be very effective in getting the information about the various options out there."

The research thus had the potential to provide healthcare workers in similar contexts with valuable information to support women in accessing effective family planning.

"This, in turn, could benefit the community as a whole," he

Solving a doctor's dilemma: Hidden germs on cellphones

The thought that she, as a mother and a doctor, could be carrying harmful bacteria into the paediatric ICU where she worked with vulnerable children, made Dr Libinu Thomas wonder about the most effective ways of disinfecting doctors' cellphones

Doctors seldom go anywhere without their cellphones, especially when there are no working pager systems. It can be a lifesaving tool of communication in many difficult situations or in rural settings, but Dr Libinu Thomas, a paediatric registrar, wondered if it could also be a source of infection.

Her curiosity made her decide to research the use of ultraviolet light to disinfect cellphones, instead of the usual alcohol swabs. In an ICU setting, hospital-associated infections can easily spread via doctors' cellphones when they move from one patient to another.

A family of scientists

Dr Thomas's journey to being a paediatric registrar at Frere Hospital in East London stretched over three continents.

Her family had lived in India and Kenya, before settling in Port Edward in South Africa in 1995. Her mother was a science teacher and her father taught biology. She matriculated at Port Shepstone High School. Her love of science, a desire to help people, and a fascination with the complexity of the human body, contributed to her deciding to study medicine. She graduated as a doctor from the University of the Free State in 2006.

"It was during my community service year that I realised that I loved paediatrics. Being part of a team helping each unique child and their family is a humbling blessing, for which I am grateful every day," the 36-year-old says.

Dr Thomas married an orthopaedic specialist, Dr Koshy Daniel. They live in East London, where she is working in paediatrics as a medical officer.

"My husband came across a device that uses ultraviolet light to disinfect cell phones, rather than using the 70% alcohol swabs. Many doctors are worried about damaging their phones with the swabs," Dr Thomas explains. "I became interested in doing research on this."

UV light versus microbes in the paediatric ICU

If the UV light can kill microbes, it would be a better option to use in the paediatric ICU, where harmful organisms can be present. "The cost of doing the research was, however, a problem, as the phones needed to be swabbed constantly, and these swabs had to be sent off to the pathology laboratory for analysis," she says.

"I attended the Discovery Foundation's roadshow in East London, and it encouraged me to apply for funding to do this research project as part of my MMed," Dr Thomas says.

"I was elated when I received the award, as it will go a long way in covering the costs of the laboratory tests," she concludes. "This new research will show us the best way to disinfect cellphones in a paediatric ICU setting, and could save many lives."



Mdantsane specialist reinstated to contest for vacant crown

Featherweight title saga finally gets resolved

The two-year saga over the SA featherweight title has been resolved after top-rated Thembani Mbangatha and Asanda Gingqi were again reinstated to contest for the vacant crown.

While no date or venue have been decided, with the promotional rights of the fight yet to be confirmed, the decision puts an end to the soap opera that has rendered the title without a holder for more than two years while Boxing SA was caught up in bureaucratic red tape amid threats of legal action.

The title has been vacant since July 2018 after Khanyile Bulana won and relinquished it without ever defending it.

BSA ordered four contenders to engage in an elimination bout because Gingqi was the only boxer qualified to fight for it owing to the recently scrapped three-fight

Mbangatha knocked out Aphiwe Masengwana in one of the eliminators but there was controversy with the second elimination bout between Mfusi Maxhayi and Abdul-Aziz Kunert when BSA refused to sanction it even though the ring announcer had declared it as such before the bout.

This led to Kunert's knockout victory being overlooked until he threatened to take BSA to court to enforce his title

In a bid to appease all parties involved, BSA agreed to sanction a Mbangatha-Kunert bout for an interim title on the understanding that the winner would face Gingqi for the full title.

But a misunderstanding in the Kunert camp saw the official who entered the deal with BSA walking away from the

Mbangatha and Gingqi were reinstated to contest the title with Xaba Promotions scheduling the fight for its tournament in East London last December.

However, Mbangatha suffered a shoulder injury and withdrew, with then sixth-rated Toto Helebe being brought in as a late replacement.

The neverending twists and turns flared up again days before the fight when the entire tournament was cancelled due to a spike of Covid-19 infections in the Buffalo City metro.

With the new BSA board coming into office with its subcommittees days later, the new sanctioning committee inherited the saga and had to deal with it.

"When we came to office we had to first deal with the saga of the featherweight division," sanctioning committee chair Mike Sodo said. "After looking at the permu-

tations and transcripts we felt Mbangatha and Gingqi were the two suitable contenders to contest the vacant title. "We wanted to do away

with the notion of an interim title because it was another avenue that was adding to the confusion." Sodo's decision came just in time after BSA did away with

the three-fight rule which had plunged the division into the The ratings committee also reshuffled the ratings of the division, elevating Gingqi from eighth to fourth spot to add

to the credibility of the two contenders for the title. Kunert, who is rated second,

will likely face the winner. Sodo said all the parties had been informed of the outcome and they were all happy with the resolution taken to finally end the two-year saga. — Daily Dispatch

BSA vetoes call to allow top amateurs to turn professional

Boxing SA has turned down a request to allow amateur boxers who have won medals to turn professional this year.

The decision was taken after BSA suspended the graduation of all amateur boxers to the professional ranks this year owing to inactivity caused by Covid-19.

BSA argued that flooding the professional ranks with more boxers when there was blanket inactivity due to the coronavirus would worsen the situation.

Hundreds of boxers who left the amateur ranks to fight for pay have been subjected to long spells of inactivity, with some failing to secure a single fight in the paid ranks. Some fighters have resorted

to criminal activities as a result. The situation is worse in regions with limited boxing activity such as Eastern Province and the Transkei, where tournaments are scarce.

However, there have been calls for BSA to allow proven amateur boxers with international credentials, such as those who won medals at championships, to be allowed to turn professional without subjecting them to the graduation process (by undergoing spar-

ring sessions). Boxers with international experience such as Masibulele "Hawk" Makepula, Ludumo Galada, Jackson Chauke, Bongani Mwelase, Unathi Jacobs and others were not subjected to sparring sessions before they were allowed to turn professional because they had already proven their ability in the amateur ranks.

But due to BSA's undertaking to establish a close working relationship with the SA National Amateur Boxing Organisation (Sanabo) whose full ex-

ecutive, including president

Andile Mofu, resigned last year, the regulatory body has been unable to officially enter into the deal. "Boxing SA could not locate

an agreement to allow outstanding amateur boxers to turn professional without undergoing sparring sessions; nor have we been furnished with such by Sanabo," BSA acting CEO Cindy Nkomo said.

"However, following the BSA board's strategic workshop held on March 25-27, at which the Sanabo's interim president made a presentation, both entities resolved to expedite the development of a memorandum of understanding and aim to have this signed by the end of quarter two of this financial year."

Sanabo's interim structure, which came into being after Mofu's departure, is scheduled to hold elections in June to comply with the regulations of the International Amateur Boxing Association, which called for the full executive to be elected within six months. — Daily Dispatch





Joyi: Why I lost my title

Deposed champ says repeated postponements and theft of equipment put him on back foot

Deposed world mini-flyweight champion Nkosinathi Joyi blamed the postponements of his title defence to Ayanda Ndulani as the reason for failing to make the weight for their clash last month.

Joyi was dropped three times by Ndulani before being knocked out in four rounds in the clash at the East London International Convention Centre.

Breaking his silence after he set an ignominious record of being one of few boxers to lose a world title on the scales, Joyi claimed the fight had been postponed four times which had messed up his training schedule.

As if that were not enough, there was a breakin at his Eyethu boxing club in Mdantsane where all the training equipment was stolen.

"They took everything and left us with nothing to train with." he said.

As result, he could not work on the punch bag, speed balls to sharpen his technique.

"I could not even engage in sparring sessions until I was called to help spar with Tyirha [Ntlantla] at his own gymnasium."

Tyirha also fought in the same tournament and beat

Filipino Joe Canoy in a junior-flyweight contest. While the stolen equip-

ment disrupted Joyi's preparations, it was the consistent postponement of the fight that he claims threw him a curve ball. Joyi said the fight had

initially been scheduled for March, having been informed about it in Februarv before it was moved to April 30. Fight promoter Ayanda

Matiti of Xaba Promotions

then moved it to May 21 after the date clashed with family commitments. "All those postponements messed me up. By the time it happened my body could no longer take it any more."

Despite being 38, Jovi insisted he would not retire but would keep campaigning in the mini-flyweight division. Joyi has been dabbling

between mini-flyweight and junior-flyweight divisions until he got an opportunity to contest for the world title in the lighter division where he beat Canoy for the vacant IBO

crown in December 2019. However, like all boxers, he was laid low by Covid-19 which brought about boxing inactivity around the world.

While he weighed 48kg — which is a junior-flyweight limit — at the weigh-in for the title defence against Ndulani, he insisted he would still be able to make the mini-flyweight limit.

"If I am given enough time to prepare for a fight I could easily make the mini-flyweight.'

And despite the one-sided drubbing by Ndulani, Joyi still wants a rematch. "I still say when I am fit

with no distractions Ndulani will never beat me. In fact, if I were to get just one warm-up fight I would challenge him to a rematch and beat him."

This even though Jovi

appeared to have no legs to support himself during the fight as he wobbled around the ring before even being nailed by a punch. He admitted that his legs had failed him during

the fight even before stepping into the ring. "My legs felt unsteady even as I walked to the ring. It was a strange feeling

that I had never felt in my entire career. "I do not want to make excuses besides saying I would love Ndulani to beat me fair and square with no

distractions." He admitted he had not started training as he is yet to decide where to train after his gym was broken into. — DispatchLIVE

Fury, Wilder trade barbs ahead of trilogy fight

WBC heavyweight champion Tyson Fury vowed to run Deontay Wilder down while the challenger said blood would be shed as the fighters came face-to-face in an odd press conference ahead of their July 24 trilogy fight in Las Vegas, US.

Fury (30-0-1) first fought former long-time heavyweight champion Wilder (42-1-1) to a draw in 2018 and took the WBC title from him in a rematch in February last year with a seventh-round stoppage.

A shirtless and upbeat Fury said that he had added one-punch knockout power to his arsenal and would flatten the American when the bell rang at T-Mobile Arena.

"What I'm going to do to Deontay Wilder this time is I'm going to run him over as if I'm an 18wheeler and he's a human being," the Briton, who predicted that he would knock Wilder out in fewer than seven rounds, said.

"I'm building my weight up, I'm trying to get up to 300 pounds for this fight because I'm looking for a big knockout straight away," he said.

"I don't think he's mentally, physically or emotionally involved in this fight.

"I think he's doing it for the wrong reasons and when people do things for the wrong reasons, they always wind up getting hurt." Wilder kept his headphones on and his mouth shut for the majority of Tuesday's media conference but he spoke briefly to thank his team, which includes new trainer and former professional boxer Malik Scott, and to take a shot at Fury.

"Enough said ... because come July 24, there will be bloodshed," Wilder said.

The media conference in Los Angeles ended with a more than five-minute long face-off where neither fighter spoke to the other, though members of their camps exchanged a few words.

"Thank you everybody for turning out for this onesided press conference," Fury said. — *Reuters*

Blasting on the R63 between Fort Beaufort and Alice

The South African National Roads Agency SOC Ltd (SANRAL) would like to notify travellers that blasting is scheduled to take place between Fort Beaufort and Alice on Thursday, 17 June 2021.

It is estimated the blast will take place between 14:00 and 17:00, approximately 2 km from Fort Beaufort when travelling towards Alice.

Motorists travelling southwards towards Alice and King Williams Town may consider using the following alternative routes:

From Queenstown follow the N6 to Cathcart, turn right on the R345 to Alice or continue on the N6 to Stutterheim and on exiting the town, turn right onto R346 to King William's Town.

From N10 junction with the R63 towards Fort Beaufort on R63, follow the R67 from Fort Beaufort to Grahamstown to join the N2 to King William's Town.

From Whittlesea, follow the R67 towards Seymour, then turn left onto the R351 towards Cathcart on the N6, then turn right and continue on the N6 to Stutterheim, then turn right onto the R346 to King William's Town.

Motorists travelling northwards towards Queenstown and westwards towards N10 and/or Whittlesea may consider using of the following alternative routes:

From King William's Town to Queenstown, follow the R346 to Stutterheim, turn left on the N6 to

From Alice to Queenstown follow the R345 to Cathcart and turn left onto N6 to Queenstown. From King William's Town towards N10, follow the N2 towards Grahamstown, turn right on the R67 to Fort Beaufort, then turn left onto R63 towards the N10.

From King William's Town towards Whittlesea, follow the R346 to Stutterheim, turn left onto the N6 to Cathcart. Before entering Cathcart turn left onto R351 to Whittlesea. On reaching the R67 then turn right to Whittlesea.
