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The Scoping Phase of the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Process for the Dicoma PV Facility was initiated on **Thursday**, **14 October 2021**. The Background Information Document (BID) was distributed with a notification letter which served to invite Interested and Affected Parties (I&APs) to register their interest in the project and to submit any comments / queries that they may have on the proposed development.

A summary and motivation for undertaking of the specialist studies identified as part of the DFFE Screening is included in Table 5.4 of the Scoping Report Based on reviews of scientific literatures, there is no experimental observation or theoretical scientific literature on the effect solar panels may have on bats. Furthermore, the (South African Bat Assessment Association (SABAA), 2020), also state that currently there is no evidence of photovoltaic (PV) facilities posing a direct threat of fatality impact on bats. The impacts do not need to be further assessed during the EIA phase. The Scoping Report has been subjected to a 30-day review period and the final Scoping Report is submitted within the prescribed timeframe of the Regulations.
