1 Background and History of Sun City Resort

The Sun City Resort complex was developed by the hotel magnate Sol Kerzner as part of his Sun International group of properties. Sun City was officially opened on 7 December 1979.

The Resort comprises four hotels (the Soho Hotel, Cascades Hotel, Cabanas and The Palace of the Lost City Hotel), including entertainment area named Sun Central and Casino, and a timeshare scheme (Vacation Club) as well as two international standard 18-hole Golf Courses, various swimming pools and recreational areas including the "Valley of Waves".

The Sun City Resort is located on property that is leased from the National Department of Rural Development and Land Reform. The total lease area comprises 3,400 hectares (Ha). The areas actively being managed and used by Sun City Resort comprises three Zones, as follows:

- Area A: 492 ha between the Resort and the town of Ledig;
- Area B: 597 ha the developed area comprising Sun City Resort complex; and
- Area C: 469 ha area used by Mankwe Gametrackers.

The following Specialist Studies will be undertaken as part of the EIA Process:

- Air Quality Impact Assessment;
- Aquatic Ecology Assessment;
- Wetlands and Terrestrial Biodiversity Assessment;
- Surface and Groundwater Assessment;
- Environmental Noise Assessment;
- Soils, Land Capability and Land Use Assessment;
- Socio-Economic Assessment; and
- Visual Impact Assessment.


- Resort Expansion Projects are proposed as these facilities are income generating and remain viable business for the resort. Planned expansions are:
 - REP1- Bush Lodge/Eco-Lodge at the GPGC Workshop;
 - REP2- Construct road to connect driving range at LCGC to GPGC;
 - REP3- Construct 20 additional Rustic Chalets at Kwena Gardens;
 - REP4.1- VC Phase 3 expansion (150 simplex units);
 - REP4.2- VC Phase 4 expansion (150 simplex units);
 - REP5- Expansion of the artificial Recreational Lake Beach;
 - REP6- relocation and expansion of helipad closer to the Palace;
 - REP7- Construct parking garage, Convention Centre and Hotel with a bridge like to Sun Central; and
 - REP8- Develop 2 soccer fields at warehouse area

Utilises and Services Projects

- The need for expansion of existing utilities and services projects stems from the age of the existing infrastructure and restricted capacity to accommodate the current and future planned activities. The projects to be undertaken are:
 - USP1- Install stormwater pipes/culverts at Golf Course Roads
 - USP2- Construct 2x 10MI reservoirs on Telkom Hill
 - USP3- Replace effluent transfer line between Sunset Drive to the irrigation lake at Hole 2
 - USP4- Construct a main water line from the Welcome Centre to Skytrain
 - USP5- Construct WWTW to manage sewage from VC and the Palace (including new sewer line to the return treated water for irrigation)
 - USP6- Construct an additional pipeline for water supply to South Village
 - USP7- Consolidate generators throughout the resort into one area (generator park)

Maintenance Projects


- Maintenance Projects are required on a continuous basis at the resort to ensure that infrastructure works optimally and to reduce the risk of failures. Maintenance Projects to be undertaken:
 - MP1- Vegetation clearance at perimeter fences to serve as maintenance roads and fire breaks
 - MP2- Clearing of both sets of culverts along the road at Sun Park of debris and siltation as well as construct a maintenance road to facilitate future maintenance



Baseline Environment of the Site

- The resort is located in low-lying areas with gentle slopes as well as some high-lying areas with steeper slopes on hilltop.
- Surrounding land uses include: urban development, mining, residential areas, nature reserves and agriculture (mainly subsistence farming).
- Zeerust Thornveld vegetation type which is considered to be least threatened at national scale.
- Located adjacent to the Pilanesberg Nature Reserve and falls within a Critical Biodiversity Area 2, however is not considered a threatened ecosystem.
- Total of seven wetlands delineated within the boundary of the resort which range from Largely Natural to Largely Modified
- Total of 17 heritage resources within the resort, comprising of farming community sites, historical built environment, burial grounds, graves and recent heritage
