MOTIVATION

Much work was done on this site by Allen and van Niekerk in the 1970's. However this was confined to the area where the cannon were located, whereas the wreck is quite scattered, covering a swathe more than a kilometre long extending from the reef where the ship struck almost to the beach. Very few artefacts other than cannon were recovered. All of the work was concentrated on the hold and well of the ship, where the guns were carried. The other parts of the wreck were not identified or investigated. We wish to apply for a permit to conduct a pre-disturbance survey of the wrecksite in order to gather more information about the disposition of the remains over the entire extent of the site. This would supply important new information about the wreck and provide us with the information needed to make a detailed and informed excavation plan when applying for an excavation permit at a later date.

We have done a survey of the topography of the seabed at the site. There is a series of reefs running parallel to the shore. We believe that these would have trapped sections of the wreck as it was driven by weather towards the shore and that there will be concentrations of artefacts around them. Of particular interest to us is a parcel of alluvial diamonds from India which formed part of the cargo. If a pre-disturbance survey were to yield evidence of these, we would then be able to get financial backing for a well-funded and comprehensive excavation. The entire artefact collection would then go to the receiving museum (ideally the Port Elizabeth Museum, which already has the bronze cannons). Funds would also be made available to the receiving museum and any other collaborating institutions for ongoing conservation and display of the collection, as well as research, development and training to build capacity.

It is regrettable that a partial excavation has been carried out on the site without proper archaeological methodology, and that there are significant gaps in the data and information record. No blame attaches for this, as things were done in accordance with the law and the technology of the time. We believe that this proposal offers an opportunity to remedy the situation by gathering all of the artefacts in a single collection and filling in the gaps in the information record.
