This notice board serves to inform you, as a potential Interested and Affected Party (I&AP), of the proposed application for Environmental Authorisation for the following project: Lomond Safari 88kV Powerline. The Environmental Authorisation application will be lodged with the National Department of Forestry, Fisheries and the Environment (the Competent Authority) in terms of the National Environmental Management Act (NEMA), 1998 (Act No. 107 of 1998), as amended, and the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations, 2014 (Regulations in terms of sections 24(5) and 44 of the NEMA, 1998), as amended on 7 April 2017 and 11 June 2021. For this Environmental Authorisation application, a Basic Environmental Impact process will be conducted.

The applicant, Eskom Holdings SOC Limited, has appointed Trans-Africa Projects, who have appointed MuTingati Environmental and Projects in terms of Regulation 12 of the Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations (GNR. 982 of 4 December 2014, as amended on 7 April 2017 and 11 June 2021), as the independent Environmental Assessment Practitioner (EAP) for the above-mentioned application process. The EAP complies with the requirements of Regulation 13 of GNR. 982 of 4 December 2014, as amended.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Safari Rural substation is an 88/11kV substation supplying the South African Nuclear Energy Corporation SOC Limited (NECSA). The substation is currently supplied through 2 x 88kV underground oil filled cables from the Lomond Main Transmission Substation (MTS). The cables sometimes lose pressure resulting in a loss of supply to the Safari Rural substation.

To address the above situation, Eskom identified the following proposed project:

- Construction of a 1 x 88kV chickadee powerline of ±2.3km from Lomond MTS to Safari Rural substation. Steel structures will be utilised to build the HV powerline.
- Part of the 2 x 88kV underground oil filled cables will be dismantled and sealed off.
- The Safari Rural substation will be refurbished by replacing old and redundant equipment.

PROJECT LOCATION

Project property: Portion 0 of the Farm Weldaba 567 JQ. The project site is located in the Madibeng Local Municipality, Bojanala Platinum District Municipality, North West Province. The project location is entirely within the confines of the NECSA Pelindaba property, situated south of the town Hartbeespoort, North West Province.
