Purpose of this document

This Background Information Document is to provide information to persons who may be interested in or affected by the proposed establishment of storage units and a private mechanical workshop on Mount Albert, Ptn 204 of Erf 184 of the Farm Mt Albert No. 2074 ET, R102, Pennington, Umdoni Local Municipality, Ugu District Municipality.

"The Independent Environmental Advisor" has been appointed as the independent environmental assessment practitioner by the applicant, Deals-4U cc, owner of the property, to seek environmental authorisation for the proposed establishment of the storage units and private mechanical workshop on the property.

Location

Mount Albert is adjacent to the R102 provincial road between Pennington and Sezela, approximately 400m from the main intersection into Pennington on the south side of the R102.

The site is characterised by very gently undulating terrain traversed by power lines and the Uqu water main.

Project Description

The development proposal is as follows:

- 5 blocks x 10 storage units
- Private workshop attached to the 5th block of storage at the south western extremity of the property
- Internal access road (grassblock or pavers)
- Parking areas for each storage unit (grassblock or pavers)

 New exit onto the R102 adjacent to the entrance to the neighbouring Ugu water reservoirs.




Figure 1: Conceptual Site Development Plan

There is an existing large building in the eastern part of the property that is used as dwellings and offices.

There is a power line and Ugu water main that traverse part of the property.

Specialist Studies

The property is within the Northern Coastal Forest of the Indian Ocean Coastal Belt but is mapped as critically endangered South Coast Grasslands vegetation type. A number of assessment have been conducted on the property as there is a previous environmental authorisation for residential development on the property. An ecological review and a heritage assessment have been commissioned to supplement previous studies.

Environmental Process

This application for environmental authorisation has been lodged under the 2014 EIA Regulations as amended as the following activities are triggered or may be triggered by the proposed establishment of the new crop lands (taken from the application form):

The 2014 EIA Regulations as amended stipulate that the Basic Assessment Report, including an Environmental Management Programme, must be submitted within 90 days (approximately 13 weeks) of lodging the founding application form for environmental authorisation, inclusive of a 30-day public participation/comment period for I&APs and state authorities.
