We also heard at the inauguration speech by President Ramaphosa how, in true Madiba style, he referred to the Hugh Masakela song, Thuma Mina that says:

I wanna be there when people start to turn it around; When they triumph over poverty

I wanna be there when people win the battle against AIDS;

I wanna lend a hand;

I wanna be there for the alcoholic;

I wanna be there for the drug addict;

I wanna be there for the victim of violence and abuse;

I wanna lend a hand

The essence of this song is to be of service where there is need.

The ability of people to be considerate, generous, helpful, empathetic and supportive most often without expecting anything in return is referred to as kindness. To be kind to others does not come naturally to all people. Many may prefer to "look out for themselves" and their reasoning is often that "nobody has been kind to me, why should I be kind to them".

Special Breed

To recognise kindness in others and to be kind to others without expecting anything in return therefore requires a special breed of people. This character strength has nothing to do with age, gender, race, culture or creed. It is a personal characteristic, a value and a personal choice that people make, and it has a significant impact on others.

What President Mandela knew about kindness (and it has been supported in research) is that kind people tend to be happier people because they know they mean something to others. Their kindness plays an incredibly valuable role in building good relationships in society. Good relationships are essential to make any society flourish. To understand that, we should all understand that you do unto others what you want to have them do unto you – this helps to build the moral fibre of our society.

When South Africa changed politically in 1994, President Mandela deeply understood the risks associated with a new democracy. The way he led the country was done without media and ego-centric fanfare. He deeply cared about "at risk" people and the quality of their lives. He focused on systematic planning and worked hard to have everyone work together to achieve daunting socio-economic goals.

The essence is that he cared more about others, than himself. He was humble rather than ego-centric; he brought hope and understanding rather than bitterness, anger and blame. He was a very wise man who will be loved and respected for many generations to come.

Kindness, helpfulness, understanding, respect, willingness to share, are all actions with a positive emotional undertone. Those who care about others understand that there is a link between kindness, gratitude, care, happiness and general well-being and good social relationships. Personal gratitude and interpersonal kindness can "undo" damaging negative emotions like anger and despair.

Be Grateful

Try this by logging, for one month, everything you should be grateful for as well as your acts of kindness. You may find a heightened sense of well-being and even lower stress levels. How interesting it is that when you feel happier, you will also more easily show acts of kindness.

President Mandela knew that there are many benefits to genuine acts of kindness. It is inextricably linked to personal happiness and feeling connected to others. Kindness is critically important to

building a sense of community and belonging.

When asked how best people should live their lives, Henry James (the well-known novelist) said: "only three things are important - the first is to be kind ... the second ... to be kind and the third ... to be kind. The same wisdom is seen in the following statement by President Mandela: "I believe that in the end it is kindness and generous accommodation that

are catalysts for real change".

In a country where fear and anger, selfishness and greed are reported on every day, we should celebrate the wisdom of President Mandela with all our heart. Let's all do our best to make a difference.

“Geloof het my gedra met borskanker” - Tammy Kotze

LEPHALALE — Mogol Pos het met die oog op Borskankermaand met Tammy Kotze van Lephale gesels oor haar reis met borskanker.

Tammy het in middel November 2017 'n knoppie in haar bors gevoel. Sy is 7 Desember na die onkoloog en sy is op 16 Desember 2017 geopereer. “Die knop het in die tyd tussen my eerste besoek aan die onkoloog totdat ek geopereer is met 13 cm gegroei,” sê Tammy. Daar kon ook op die mammogram gesien word die gewas in haar linkerbors is baie groot.

“Na die operasie het hulle 16 kliere onder my arm en in my nek verwyder en tien van die 16 het positief vir kanker getoets,” sê sy. Daar is tydens die mastektomie ook voorbereiding gedoen indien sy later 'n borsinplanting sou wou doen. Die dokter sit 'n “ballon” onder die borsvel wat die vel kans gee om te rek volgens die grootte wat die pasiënt dit sou verkies.

“Dit is glad nie vir my belangrik om borste te hê nie, as dit van my afgehang het, het ek 'n dubbele mastektomie laat doen, maar die dokters het vir my gesê ek is 'n te hoë risiko omdat ek maklik bloedklonte en sellulitis

(weefselontsteking) ontwikkel. Ek het wel sellulitis van die bestraling gekry. Na hierdie borsoperasie en die bestraling dink ek nie ek sal dit weer doen nie,” verduidelik Tammy.

Daar is geen familiegeskiedenis van borskanker in haar familie nie en sy het nooit enige hormoonaanvulling gebruik nie, sy het nooit gerook nie en gebruik alkohol per geleentheid en sy het ook nooit enige groot trauma ervaar nie. Dinge wat as snellers vir kanker beskou word.

Tammy sê wel dat spanning met haar werksituasie vir haar erg was. Sy het in Januarie 2017 bloedklonte in haar bene gekry waarmee sy in die hospitaal beland het. Daarna het sellulitis in haar bene ontwikkel en sy kon nie gaan werk nie. Sy was baie bekommerd omdat sy as gevolg daarvan nie 'n salaris verdien het nie. Sy was by die huis sonder 'n salaris en haar verlof was ook uitgeput. Velkanker is boonop by haar man gediagnoseer waarna hy gehospitaliseer is. Die kanker is verwyder en hy moes veloorplantings kry. “Dit was 'n rowwe jaar,” sê sy.

Nadat sy die mastektomie gehad het moes sy chemoterapie kry en in daardie

tyd het sy in Huis Tipuana, KANSA se sorgtuiste in Pretoria, gebly. Tydens haar chemoterapiesessies vanaf Februarie vanjaar het sy gesien dat kanker nie jou ouderdom, geslag of omstandighede in ag neem nie. “Enigiemand kan kanker kry.”

Die chemo was vir haar baie erg en sy het soms, soos baie ander, gewonder of dit alles die moeite werd is. “Ek sal nie weer vir chemo gaan nie, tog weet ek 'n mens se drang om oorlewing is baie sterk,” sê sy.

Tammy het op 27 Augustus 2018 ook bestraling begin kry. “Die bestraling krimp alle tekens van kanker wat moontlik kon oorbly. Dit was vir my baie erg want ek het verskriklik gebrand. (Mogol Pos het foto's gesien van die brandwonde, maar dit kan nie in 'n gemeenskapskoerant gepubliseer word nie). “Ek het vir ses weke bestraling gekry, in totaal 54 bestralingsessies wat soms tot 45 minute per sessie geduur het (tussen 10 en 45 minute).

Bloedtoetse dui aan dat sy skoon is van kanker, maar sy sal eers in November weet of sy wel in remissie is. Sy moet steeds vir vyf jaar die chemopil drink.

“Ek is nie bang om weer kanker te kry nie,

ek weet net nie of ek weer 'n keer dieselfde krag of moed sal hê om dit te doen nie. Ek is baie moeg,” sê sy.

Haar man het dit so kalm en rustig as moontlik probeer hanteer, maar sy sê dit was vir haar susters 'n groot skok.

“Ons was een keer by KANSA Lephale en hulle was een keer by my. Ek dink hulle kon meer vir my gedoen het. Hulle het my wel ongelooflik ondersteun gedurende die tyd wat ek in Tipuana gebly het. Hulle het baie met ons gepraat en ons baie ondersteun,” sê sy.

Tammy se boodskap aan ander vroue wat ook die stryd teen borskanker stry is:

“Wees sterk, jou geloof dra jou en jou hele siening oor die lewe verander. Mens besef kanker is eintlik 'n doodsvonnis. Lewe die lewe voluit, aardse dinge gaan nie saam met jou nie. Ek voel regtig so. Al wat jy het om regtig aan vas te klou is jou geloof. Psalm 23 het my baie gehelp. Raak stil en vra jouself af – is hierdie regtig die moeite werd? 'n Gejaag na geld beteken niks. Staar op, sit jou grimering aan en begin elke nuwe dag met nuwe genade.

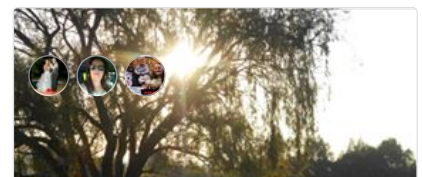
