The caption matter refers. We hereby confirm that there is adequate water supply capacity for the requested 50,000l/day drawdown. However during our meeting with Mr Komane from Economic Development and the Mr Bansal last week, the prospective investor indicated that they would prefer groundwater abstraction for their industrial use and connect to our network for general factory use. It was pointed out to him that a groundwater registration and use license is required and is issued by DWA in conjunction with EMM as the WSA. We then resolved on the following :

1. That I would outline to him in writing the procedure for compiling and submitting a groundwater abstraction license application.
2. That the investor will approach the CCC in Nigel and lodge an application for a 25mm diameter water connection and pay the necessary fees.

Attached hereto are the necessary forms and procedure manual for easy of reference required by DWA for a groundwater abstraction license application which the investor should complete. All the forms should be completed and submitted to DWA at the following address:
