





4	Matters arising from previous minutes	There were no previous meetings on this matter.	
5	Matter of concern	<p>The Chairperson gave the background on the project and highlighted the following aspects:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Environmental Unit is in the process of replacing rugby/soccer goal posts in the Maximum Security Prison and Village Precinct Sport Fields. The rehabilitation of these sites will assist in enhancing 'look and feel' and improving narrative of the site. At least 75% of the soccer field in MSP is already covered with kweek grass which is native on the island; this has assisted in improving the narrative of the MSP. On different pictures of the MSP rugby/soccer field gathered by the Unit, it is not clear which goal posts were used during the imprisonment period, especially for soccer sporting events. Therefore, the Unit requires an in-depth knowledge from the Ex-Political Prisoners who 	<p>Sabelo</p> <p>Sabelo</p>

		<p>utilized the sport fields from the mid .60's until the later years of Correctional Services on the Island. The information gathered from the meeting will inform the specification of the goal posts. This process will ensure that the replacement is authentic.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ex- political prisoner indicated the rugby and soccer goal posts were always separated. The rugby goal posts were fixed on ground while the soccer goal posts were moveable. Soccer goal posts were striped in black and white, with elbows for nets and also give balance to the structure. The rugby posts were standard and all white. • Ex- political prisoner also confirmed that was a maintenance span which was responsible for the maintenance of the field <i>i.e.</i> re-vegetation of the pitch, grass was harvested locally on the island, leveling of the pitch, ensure that field marking are clearly drawn and lime was quarried from the Island <i>etc.</i> These activities were rotated amongst the members. Black nets were used in both rugby and soccer posts. The benches that are currently at MSP Sport Field are original and they were white in color. • Mr. Jama Mbatyoti confirmed that goal posts on the pictures were actual goal post they used during the prison times and same goal post should be secured for replacement to ensure authenticity. • FIFA books were used as a guideline to measure yards and in managing games. • None of the ex-political prisoners can still recall what happened to the goal posts, they are were all in agreement that goal posts might have corroded and fell down. 	<p>Vusumzi</p> <p>Vusumzi</p> <p>Jama</p> <p>Sipho Nkosi</p> <p>Ex-political Prisoners</p>


