No study has investigated the bone microanatomy pattern of a large sample of Anomodontia. The present study seeks to elucidate the different bone microanatomies of various anomodont taxa spanning the entire clade. The aim of the study is to assess the lifestyle, phylogeny, and biomechanics of anomodont therapsids using bone microanatomy. The objectives of the study are to (1) quantitatively describe the patterns in the bone microanatomy of South African anomodonts and (2) investigate possible reasons for the differences and/or similarities in the microanatomy. This is an important study as recent research has suggested that the infilling of medullary cavities indicates an aquatic lifestyle and as most anomodonts have infilled medullary cavities, this would suggest that the anomodont clade was aquatic. As the historical literature indicates that anomodonts were terrestrial, it is important that we resolve this issue regarding anomodont palaeobiology.
