The application for comment/decision in terms of heritage legislation was considered by the Provincial Heritage Authority, the KwaZulu-Natal Amafa and Research Institute in the meeting held on 27 October 2021.

The committee noted that the BAR indicated that there are no graves on the prospecting sites. However, a Heritage Impact Assessment confirming that there were no heritage resources had not been submitted.

The applicant was required to submit phase I Heritage Impact Assessment together with a plan that clearly indicates where the drilling sites would be set up. The report must include site inspection reports for each of the proposed drilling sites.

- The Heritage impact assessment should cover:
- 1. Identification of all heritage resources in the development area and its surroundings -50m.
- 2. Assessment of the impact of the development on such heritage.
- 3.Evaluation of the impact of the development on heritage resources relative to the sustainable social and economic benefits to be derived from the development.
- 4.Results of consultation with communities affected by the proposed development and other interested and affected parties regarding the impact of the development on heritage resources.

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5. Consideration of alternatives if heritage resources are affected by the development Mitigation plans for any adverse effects during and after completion of the project.

6. Table of all heritage resources identified. This should show Heritage resource type, description, location, significance, and reasons for this rating.

With regards to public participation:

- -method used to identify descendants must be recorded
- -attach list of stake holders and descendants identified

Failure to comply with the requirements of the National Heritage Resources Act and the KwaZulu-Natal Amafa and Research Institute Act could lead to legal action being instituted against the applicant.
