

Destruction application for sites DUB001 and DUB002 at Agrizone 2, Dube Trade Port, KwaZulu Natal Province

Final Decision

Application for the destruction of two low significance archaeological sites (DUB001 and DUB002) as part of the development of the Dube Trade Port (DTP) AgriZone 2 development close to King Shaka International Airport in the Province of KwaZulu Natal. related to Case ID: 6051

The KwaZulu-Natal Provincial Heritage Resources Authority, Amafa and Research Institute Heritage Officers Committee (HOC) reviewed and considered the application on the 9th of December 2021.

The committee resolved to approve the destruction of the two sites (DUB001 and DUB002), however, any chance finds must be reported to Amafa and Research Institute immediately upon discovery.

The approval of this Permit application is exclusive to the two sites, DUB001 and DUB002. The applicants are advised to not disturb site DUB003 and DUB004 without a permit from Amafa and Research Institute.

Failure to comply with the requirements of the National Heritage Resources Act and the KwaZulu-Natal Amafa and Research Institute Act could lead to legal action being instituted against the applicant.
