## **Interim Comment**

In terms of Section 38(3), 38(8) of the National Heritage Resources Act (Act 25 of 1999)

Attention: Witfontein Solar PV 1 (Pty) Ltd

The activity entails the development of an up to 130MW photovoltaic solar facility and associated infrastructure on the Remaining Extent of the Farm Witfontein No. 444, situated within the Moqhaka Local Municipality area of jurisdiction. The town of Viljoenskroon is located approximately ~15km southeast of of the proposed development (refer to the attached locality map). The project entails the generation of up to 130MW electrical power through photovoltaic (PV) panels. The total footprint of the project will approximately be 437 hectares (including supporting infrastructure on site). The property on which the facility is to be constructed will be leased by Witfontein Solar PV 1 (Pty) Ltd from the property owner, for the lifespan of the project (minimum of 20 years).

Thank you for notifying SAHRA of the Environmental Authorisation (EA) Application for the proposed Witfontein Solar PV 1near Viljoenskroon, Free State Province.

As the proposed development is undergoing an EA Application process in terms of the National Environmental Management Act, 107 of 1998 (NEMA), NEMA Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations as amended, it is incumbent on the developer to ensure that an application specific Heritage Impact Assessment (HIA) is done as per section 38(3) and 38(8) of the National Heritage Resources Act, Act 25 of 1999 (NHRA) as required by section 24(4)b(iii) of NEMA. This must include an archaeological component, palaeontological component and any other applicable heritage components. The HIA must be conducted as part of the EA Application in terms of NEMA and the NEMA EIA Regulations.

SAHRA requests that an assessment of the impacts to heritage resources that complies with section 38(3) of the NHRA as required by section 38(8) of the NHRA and section 24(4)b(iii) of NEMA be conducted as part of the EA process.

The assessment must include an assessment of the impact to archaeological and palaeontological resources. The field-based assessment of archaeological resources must be conducted by a qualified archaeologist and the report comply with the SAHRA 2007 Minimum Standards: Archaeological and Palaeontological Components of Impact Assessment Reports (see <a href="https://www.asapa.co.za">www.asapa.co.za</a> or <a href="https://www.aphp.org.za">www.aphp.org.za</a> for a list of qualified archaeologists).
