Proposed Installation of Security Gate at Main Entrance on Erf 2622 being at 231 Jabu Ndlovu Street, Pietermaritzburg (SAPS), KwaZulu-Natal,

The permit application in respect of the above, received on the 19 July 2023 reviewed by the KwaZulu-Natal Amafa and Research Institute (The Institute) on the 10 August 2023 refers.

Please be advised as follows:

DISCUSSION

Amongst other things, the following was discussed:

- The application was a follow up on the site inspection carried out last year when the applicant was told that the track at the bottom of the gate was not permissible. However, the shop drawing submitted showed a rail at the bottom of the gate.
- No photographs of the area where the gate was to be installed were loaded to the case.

FURTHER REQUIREMENT

- Photographs of the area where the gate would be installed were required.
- The applicant was required to clearly mark the areas of intervention on a floor plan and on the photographs.

- Amafa must meet the installer on site before any work is undertaken to ensure that all heritage elements are protected.

Public Participation: the applicant will be notified of the level of public participation required and will have to bear the costs thereof. Neighbours, Ward Councillors, and Heritage Societies should be consulted in the case of demolition & development applications. Owners & residents of properties within 100m must be consulted for demolition applications. All documentation submitted is retained for record purposes and interested and affected parties may apply to view the documentation.

Written responses/requests for reconsideration of the application or consideration of new information must be loaded to the case on Sahr's (email khanyi.zondi@amafainstitute.org.za) within 30 days of the date of this letter or any requirements/decisions contained herein will be considered final. Extensions of this time frame can be requested upon receipt of motivation.

Required additional information or revised drawings must be submitted within six months from the date of this letter or the application will lapse and a new application will be required.

THIS LETTER DOES NOT CONSTITUTE FORMAL APPROVAL OF THE PROPOSAL SUBMITTED TO THE INSTITUTE. UNAUTHORISED WORK CARRIED OUT ON THE ABOVE SITE WILL BE IN CONTRAVENTION OF THE KWAZULU-NATAL AMAFA AND RESEARCH INSTITUTE ACT (5 of 2018).
